“ Whereas under the provisions of an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, bearing date the thirteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, and duly published in the London Gazette on the twenty-eighth day of the following month of September, certain lands, tenements and hereditaments formerly belonging to the said Bishop of Worcester, and particularly described in such Order, became vested in us, and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be

authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said lands, tenements and hereditaments which are so vested in us under the provisions of the said Order as aforesaid, for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th

and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 8th day of November, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Peter, South End, Croydon, and partly out of the Parish of Addington, both in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury :

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Peter, South End, Croydon, and the said Parish of Addington are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, South End, Croydon, and of the said Parish of Addington which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth :

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship :

“ And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £260 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors :

“ And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £260 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111 :

“ And whereas a plot of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the site for a permanent Church for such District and there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £1,450 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church :

“ And whereas the said plot of land has been conveyed and the said sum of £1,450 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the

Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth :

“ And whereas the contributors of the purchase money for the said plot of land and of the said sum of £1,450 have nominated to us the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being, as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish shall be assigned :

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, South End, Croydon, and of the said Parish of Addington, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of Saint John, Selsdon.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such new Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and be exercised by the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of Saint John, Selsdon, comprising:—

“ I. All that detached portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Peter, South End, Croydon, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the north east by the Parish of Addington, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south east by the Parish of Farleigh, upon the south by the Parish of Warlingham, and upon the west by the Parish of Sanderstead, all in the said County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark.

“ II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Addington which is bounded upon the south by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter,

South End, Croydon, upon the south west by the said Parish of Sanderstead, upon the north west by the New Parish of Emmanuel, South Croydon, in the said County of Surrey and in the said Diocese of Canterbury, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parishes of Emmanuel, South Croydon, from the said Parish of Addington crosses the middle of Ballard's Farm Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Ballard's Farm Road for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the bridle road leading to Selsdon, and extending thence south westward to and along the middle of such bridle road for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Addington from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, South End, Croydon."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the

secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 8th day of November, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Andrew, Orpington, situate in the Parish of Orpington, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Andrew, Orpington, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Martin, Bishop of Rochester (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Orpington which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Andrew, Orpington, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Orpington'.

"And with the like consent of the said Martin, Bishop of Rochester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be

expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Andrew, Orpington, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Orpington, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Orpington, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, which is bounded upon the north by the Parish of Saint Mary Cray, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, upon the south, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Mary Cray from the said Parish of Orpington crosses the middle of Walden Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Walden Road for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cockmanning's Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Cockmanning's Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cockmanning's Lane, and extending thence first southward and then westward along the middle of Cockmanning's Lane for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chelsfield Road and Ramsden Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Ramsden Road for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the footpath leading to Green Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 39 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Green Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Green Lane for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the embankment on the eastern side of Orpington By Pass Road, and extending thence first westward to and then northward along the middle of Orpington By Pass Road for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with High Street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of High Street for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the premises attached to the Palace Cinema, and extending thence north-westward to and along such wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Perry Hall Road for a distance in all of 14 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the eastern side of the footpath leading to Bridge Road, and extending thence first westward to and then northward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading past the southern side of the Orpington Recreation Ground through Covet Wood to Chislehurst Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

The following Statute made by the University of Oxford on the 4th day of December, 1934, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, 4 DECEMBER, 1934.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the provisions governing the procedure in Congregation and to provide that the Statute regulating such procedure shall be subject to amendment by Congregation:

Now the University of Oxford, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

1. In *Statt. Tit. X. Sect. 1. § 3 (Statuta, ed. 1934, p. 234, l. 20)*, delete clauses 2 and 3.
2. *Ibid.* (pp. 234-40), delete §§ 4 to 8 and substitute the following new Sub-sections:

" § 4. ON PROCEDURE IN CONGREGATION.

1. The Chairman of Congregation shall be the Chancellor, or, in his absence, the Vice-Chancellor or a Pro-Vice-Chancellor.

2. When any question is before Congregation a motion that the question be adjourned may be proposed at any time not less than two full hours from the commencement of the meeting by any two members, or at any time when there are fewer than twenty members present either by any two members or by the Chairman. Such motion, unless moved under the provisions of § 5, cl. 3, or § 7, cl. 3 of this Section, shall forthwith be put to the House, and, if it is carried, the question shall be adjourned to the following day, unless the Chairman shall fix another day for its consideration.

3. At any meeting of Congregation the Chairman may propose at any time the adjournment of the House. The motion shall be put forthwith, and, if it is carried, the House shall be adjourned. After any meeting has lasted two full hours he shall have the power of adjourning the House without question put. Any adjournment of the House shall be to the following day, unless the Chairman shall fix another day.

4. Subject to the provisions of clauses 2 and 3 of this Sub-section, every vote in Congregation shall be taken immediately after the close of the debate (if any) on the question.

5. When any question has been put to Congregation by the Chairman he may direct that a division be taken, or he may announce that in his opinion the proposal is accepted or rejected, as the case may be. If his opinion so declared is challenged by at least six members of Congregation rising in their places, he shall direct that a division be taken.

6. Every Statute or Decree shall be introduced by a member of the Hebdomadal Council or of the General Board of the Faculties as the Council may direct.

7. Before any Statute, Amendment to a Statute, Decree, or Resolution is submitted to the House the Chairman shall direct the Registrar to read aloud the preamble in the case of a Statute or Decree with a preamble or otherwise, the Amendment, Decree, or Resolution as the case may be.

8. At any meeting of Congregation the Chairman or both Proctors shall have the right to place their veto upon a Statute or Decree at any time before it has been submitted to the vote of the House. Any Statute or Decree upon which such veto has been placed shall be withdrawn without further discussion.

9. No member of Congregation shall without the leave of the Chairman speak more than once on any motion, provided that the mover of a motion shall have the right to reply at the close of the debate thereon.

10. Any member of Congregation may at a meeting of Congregation in Full Term ask a question relating to any matter which is within the jurisdiction of the Hebdomadal Council or of any Delegacy, Board, Committee or Body of Curators or Visitors of which the election of one or more members has been made or approved by Congregation. Written notice of any such question signed by the member of Congregation proposing to put it and by two supporters shall be sent to the Registrar not less than ten days, and shall, unless the question appears to the Vice-Chancellor to be inadmissible in substance or in form, be published by the Registrar in the *University Gazette* not less than five days, before it is to be asked. The answer to any question so published shall be approved by the Hebdomadal Council, shall be read in Congregation either by a member of the Hebdomadal Council or by a member of the Body to whose functions it refers, and shall be published in the *University Gazette*. No debate shall be permitted upon the answer, but at the Chairman's discretion supplementary questions may be asked to elucidate the answer given.

§ 5. ON THE SUBMISSION OF STATUTES TO THE CONGREGATION OF THE UNIVERSITY.

1. Every Statute to be submitted to Congregation shall contain a preamble stating shortly the principle of the measure, and an enacting part carrying out in detail the principle of the Statute as stated in the preamble.

2. Notice of the promulgation of a Statute shall be published in the *University Gazette* not later than the nineteenth day before the date of promulgation.

3. Any two members of Congregation may, not later than noon on the eighth day before the date of promulgation, give notice in writing to the Registrar that they propose to move as an amendment to the motion for the adoption of the preamble, that 'the discussion be adjourned *sine die*'. Such notice shall be

published by the Registrar in the *University Gazette* not later than the fifth day before the date of promulgation; and if the amendment is carried the Statute shall, subject to the provisions of clause 16 hereof, be deemed to have been rejected. If such notice has not been given, or notice having been given the amendment has not been carried, the preamble shall, at the conclusion of the debate, be declared by the Chairman to be carried without question put; and further proceedings on the proposed Statute shall be adjourned to a date to be fixed by the Chairman not less than fourteen days later, of which notice shall be published by the Registrar in the *University Gazette* not later than the fourth day before the date so fixed.

4. If the preamble is not rejected, amendments to the Statute may be proposed by two or more members of Congregation, provided that such amendments signed by the mover and seconder are delivered in writing to the Registrar not later than noon on the third day after that on which the preamble was approved.

5. The Vice-Chancellor shall report to the Council all amendments which in his judgment are not inconsistent with or irrelevant to the principle of the Statute as stated in the preamble, and the Council shall forward them to Congregation, together with any amendments which the Council itself may propose.

6. If any such amendment shall have been adopted, the Statute, as amended, shall be published in the *University Gazette* and printed so as to show the amendments made.

7. Further amendments to the Statute as published under the provisions of the last preceding clause may be proposed by twelve or more members of Congregation, provided that such amendments signed by the proposer and not less than eleven supporters reach the Registrar not later than noon on the third day after that on which the Statute as amended was published. Such further amendments, together with any further amendments which the Council itself may propose, shall be submitted to Congregation in accordance with the provisions of clause 5 hereof.

8. At any time before the Statute is finally submitted to Congregation the Council may propose further amendments or submit to Congregation the choice between contradictory or inconsistent provisions which may have been introduced into the Statute.

9. Any amendment which is not moved and seconded in Congregation shall lapse.

10. All amendments forwarded to Congregation under the provisions of clauses 5, 7 and 8 hereof shall be published by the Registrar in the *University Gazette* not later than the fourth day before the Congregation in which they are to be moved, shall be printed consecutively, and shall be moved in that order unless otherwise determined by the Chairman, who shall give notice of any such change of order at the opening of the Congregation.

11. If the Statute has been amended the question that the Statute do pass shall be submitted to Congregation not less than fourteen days after Congregation has voted on amendments proposed under the provisions of clause 7 hereof or seven days after it has voted on amendments proposed under clause 8 hereof, whichever is the later. The date shall be fixed by the Chairman and not less than four days'

notice shall be published in the *University Gazette* by the Registrar.

12. If amendments have been proposed but have been either rejected or have lapsed under the provisions of clause 9 hereof the question that the Statute do pass shall be submitted to Congregation not less than seven days after the meeting at which the amendments have been rejected or have lapsed.

13. If no proposals to make amendments are forwarded to Congregation under the provisions of clauses 4 and 5 hereof, the question that the Statute do pass shall be submitted to Congregation on the date fixed by the Chairman under the provisions of clause 3 hereof.

14. The operation of any of the clauses 1 to 13 of this Sub-section may be suspended by Decree if notice of the Decree is given at the same time as notice of the proposed promulgation of the Statute, provided always that a suspensory Decree shall not be moved under this clause if twelve or more members of Congregation signify their objection by rising in their places after the Decree has been read by the Registrar.

15. If a Statute is accepted by Congregation, either without a division or by the votes of two-thirds or more of the members of Congregation present and voting, the decision of Congregation shall be final; and the Statute shall thereupon come into effect unless its operation shall be postponed by Decree of Congregation.

16. If a Statute is accepted by Congregation by the votes of less than two-thirds of the members of Congregation present and voting, the Statute shall be submitted to Convocation in accordance with the provisions of Sect. II of this Title, and if it be accepted by Convocation it shall thereupon come into effect unless its operation shall be postponed by Decree of Congregation.

17. If a Statute submitted to Convocation under the provisions of the preceding clause shall have been rejected by that House, the Hebdomadal Council shall be entitled to introduce the same or substantially the same Statute again in Congregation at any time not being earlier than the third or later than the sixth Term after that in which the Statute was rejected by Convocation. If the Statute be then accepted with or without amendment by Congregation, it shall thereupon come into effect unless its operation shall be postponed by Decree, provided that it is certified by the Chancellor (but not by his Deputy) to be the same or substantially the same as the Statute which was previously rejected by Convocation.

18. The Hebdomadal Council shall not be entitled to reintroduce a Statute which has been rejected by Congregation earlier than the beginning of the fourth Term after the Term in which it was rejected.

§ 6. ON THE SUBMISSION OF RESOLUTIONS TO THE CONGREGATION OF THE UNIVERSITY.

1. Resolutions asserting principles but containing no operative provisions may be submitted to Congregation by the Hebdomadal Council.

2. Any twelve members of Congregation may propose a Resolution either calling upon the Hebdomadal Council or any Delegacy, Board, Committee or body of Curators or Visitors established by any Statute of the University, to exercise the powers conferred upon them

by Statute or proposing that amendments should be introduced in the Statutes. Notice of the proposal, signed by the twelve members concerned, shall be delivered to the Registrar not later than noon on the twenty-first day before any meeting of Congregation in Full Term at which it is proposed to move it.

3. If not less than forty members of Congregation vote for a Resolution proposed under the provisions of clause 2 hereof and the Resolution is carried, the Hebdomadal Council shall submit to Congregation not later than the fourth meeting in the Full Term after the Term in which the Resolution was carried either a Decree or a Statute giving effect to the Resolution as the case may be. Provided that if the passing of any such Decree or Statute would involve additional expenditure from University Funds the Hebdomadal Council, after consultation with the Curators of the University Chest, shall, together with the notice of promulgation of the Decree or Statute, publish in the *University Gazette* a certificate stating whether that financial provision can be made without curtailment of existing services or of services for which money has already been voted.

§ 7. ON THE SUBMISSION OF DECREES TO THE CONGREGATION OF THE UNIVERSITY.

1. Every Decree shall contain an enacting part consisting of one or more clauses and, if in the opinion of the Hebdomadal Council the Decree makes a proposal of sufficient importance to the University in general, a preamble stating shortly the principle of the measure.

2. Notice of a Decree which contains a preamble shall be published in the *University Gazette* not later than the nineteenth day before the date of promulgation.

3. Any two members of Congregation may, not later than noon on the eighth day before the date of promulgation of a Decree containing a preamble, give notice in writing to the Registrar that they propose to move as an amendment to the motion for the adoption of the preamble that 'the discussion be adjourned *sine die*'. Such notice shall be published by the Registrar in the *University Gazette* not later than the fifth day before the date of promulgation: and if the amendment is carried the Decree shall, subject to the provisions of clause 4 hereof, be deemed to have been rejected. If such notice has not been given, or notice having been given the amendment has not been carried, the preamble shall at the conclusion of the debate, be declared by the Chairman to be carried without question put; and further proceedings on the proposed Decree shall be adjourned to a date to be fixed by the Chairman not less than seven days later, of which notice shall be published by the Registrar in the *University Gazette* not later than the fourth day before the date so fixed, when the question that the Decree do pass shall be submitted to Congregation.

4. If a Decree which contains a preamble is accepted by Congregation by the votes of less than two-thirds of the members of Congregation present and voting the Decree shall be submitted to Convocation in accordance with the provisions of Sect. II of this Title, and if it be accepted by Convocation it shall thereupon come into effect.

5. If a Decree submitted to Convocation under the provisions of the preceding clause shall have been rejected by that House, the Hebdomadal Council shall be entitled to introduce the same or substantially the same Decree again to Convocation at any time not being earlier than the third or later than the sixth Term after that in which the Decree was rejected by Convocation. If the Decree be then accepted by Convocation it shall thereupon come into effect, provided that it is certified by the Chancellor (but not by his Deputy) to be the same or substantially the same measure as that which was previously rejected by Convocation.

6. Notice of the proposal of a Decree which does not contain a preamble shall be published by the Registrar in the *University Gazette* not later than the fourth day before that on which the Decree is to be submitted to Convocation.

7. If a Decree which does not contain a preamble is approved by Convocation it shall thereupon come into effect; if rejected by Convocation the same proposal shall not be re-introduced before the second Term after that in which it was rejected.

8. No amendment in a Decree shall be made by Convocation."

MERCHANDISE MARKS.

THE MERCHANDISE MARKS (IMPORTED GOODS) EXEMPTION DIRECTION (No. 7), 1934, DATED THE EIGHTEENTH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1934, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE HOME DEPARTMENT AND THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR SCOTLAND ACTING JOINTLY UNDER SECTION 3 (1) OF THE MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 GEO. 5. c. 53).

Whereas by Section 3 sub-section (1) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 53), it is provided that if, where an Order in Council has been made under that Act with respect to any goods, it is shown to the satisfaction of the Appropriate Department by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter that the application of the provisions of the Order or of some of those provisions to any particular class or description of those goods has caused or is likely to cause injury or hardship to the said persons or any of them, the Department may direct that the Order or any particular provisions of the Order shall cease to apply to goods of that class or description or shall apply to such goods subject only to such modifications and conditions as the Department think fit, and the Order shall, while the Direction is in force, have effect subject thereto:

And whereas it is provided by Article 1 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods)

No. 7 Order, 1934, (a) that it shall not be lawful to import (among other things) any frozen pork or to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom (among other things) any imported frozen pork unless such meat bears an indication of origin; and by Article 2 of the said Order that the indication of origin shall be branded, or stamped stencilled or printed in ink or stain, durably and conspicuously, in letters which shall except as therein provided be not less than one-half of an inch in height; and by Paragraphs III and IV of Article 3 of the said Order that the indication of origin required on importation shall be applied as follows, that is to say—

III. In the case of frozen pork, each carcase shall bear the indication of origin on each side of the carcase on the outer side of the leg, loin, fore-end (spare-rib and blade-bone) and hand-and-spring, composing four marks on each side in the positions shown in the diagram, Figure III, in the Schedule to the Order.

IV. Except where any portion of a carcase of frozen pork is one of the forms of meat specified in the next following paragraph of the Order, each portion of any such carcase shall bear such markings indicative of origin as it would have borne if it had formed part of a complete carcase of such meat which had been marked in the manner hereinbefore in the Article prescribed.

and by Paragraph I of Article 4 of the said Order, that the indication of origin required on sale and exposure for sale, whether wholesale or by retail, shall be applied as follows, that is to say—

I. In the case of frozen pork, in like manner as on importation.

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, being the Appropriate Department in this case, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter, are satisfied that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Articles 3 and 4 of the said Order to certain portions of carcasses of frozen pork, namely, frozen shoulder cuts of pork from which the skin has been removed prior to importation, is likely to cause hardship to the said persons:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3, hereby direct as follows:—

1. The aforesaid provisions of Paragraph IV of Article 3 and Paragraph I of Article 4 of the Order shall not apply to shoulder cuts of frozen pork from which the skin has been removed prior to importation; and
2. The provisions of Paragraph V of Article 3 and Paragraph II of Article 4 shall

apply to such meat as though the description "shoulder cuts of frozen pork from which the skin has been removed prior to importation" had been added to the forms of meat specified in these paragraphs.

3. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 7), 1934.

Now, therefore, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3, hereby direct as follows:—

1. Without affecting the operation of the provisions of the said Article 1 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 7 Order, 1934, requiring an indication of origin on importation, the provisions of the said Article 1 requiring an indication of origin on sale or exposure for sale shall not apply to whole carcasses of frozen pork before the 28th February, 1935.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 6), 1934.

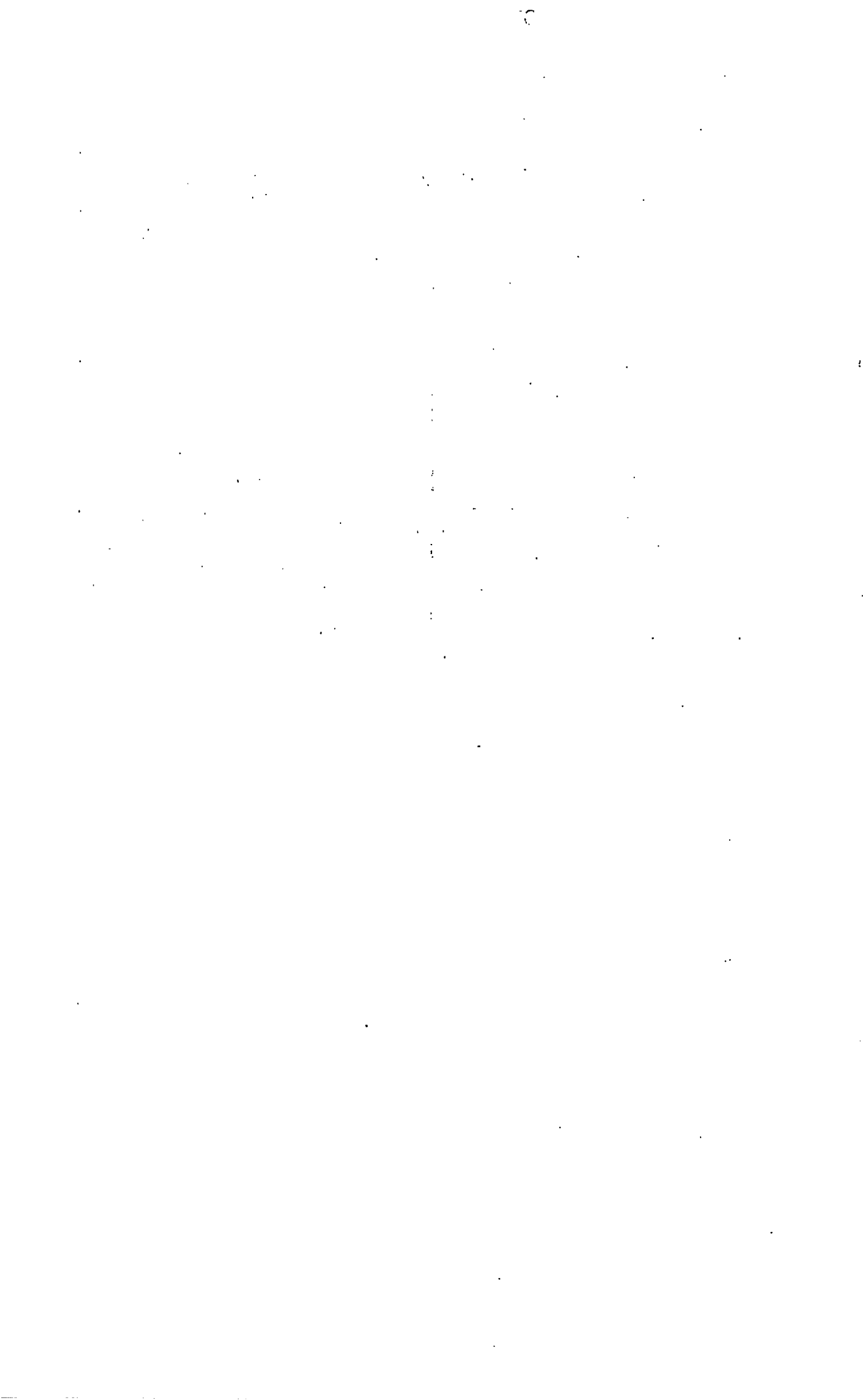
