WHEREAS by subsection (1) of Section 36 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932 (hereinafter

referred to as "the Act") it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the provisions of Part I of the Act and (so far as may appear to His Majesty to be expedient for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of Part I of the Act) the provisions of any other Act relating to Merchant Shipping, including any enactments for the time being in force amending or substituted for the provisions of Part I of the Act or of any other such Act, shall extend, with such exceptions, adaptations or modifications (if any) as may be specified in the Order to the Isle of Man, any of the Channel Islands and any colony:

And whereas by subsection (3) of the said Section 36 it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct

(a) that any provision of Part I of the Act which is expressed to apply only to British ships or passenger steamers registered in the United Kingdom shall apply to British ships or passenger steamers, as the case may be, registered in any country or part of His Majesty's dominions to which the provisions of that part of the Act can be extended by virtue of the provisions of the said Section 36; and

(b) that any reference in that part of the Act to a port in the United Kingdom shall be construed as including a reference to a port in any such country or part of His Majesty's dominions as aforesaid:

And whereas by virtue of an Order in Council dated the tenth day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-two, made in pursuance of Section 39 of the Act, Part I of the Act came into operation in the United Kingdom on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-three:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section 36 is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to direct, and it is hereby directed as follows:—

1. The provisions of Part I of the Act (with the exception of the provisions set out in the first part of the Schedule hereto) and the provisions of the Preamble to and Sections 71, 72 and 73 of the Act in so far as they relate to the provisions of Part I hereinbefore mentioned shall extend to the Isle of Man with the adaptations and modifications specified in the second part of the Schedule.

2.—(a) The provisions of Part I of the Act set out in the third part of the Schedule hereto, which are expressed to apply only to British ships or passenger steamers registered in the United Kingdom, shall apply to British ships or passenger steamers, as the case may be, registered in the Isle of Man;

(b) References in the provisions of Part I of the Act set out in the third part of the Schedule hereto to a port in the United Kingdom shall be construed as including references to a port in the Isle of Man.

3. The provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Wireless Telegraphy) Act, 1919, as amended by the Act shall extend to the Isle of Man and any such provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Wireless Telegraphy) Act, 1919, which are expressed to apply only to British ships or passenger steamers registered in the United Kingdom shall apply to British ships or passenger steamers, as the case may be, registered in the Isle of Man.

4. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping Safety Convention (Isle of Man) Order, 1934, and shall come into force on the first day of January, 1935.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, and the Companies Act, 1929, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Sections 103, 104 and 105 of the Companies Act, 1929, or any enactments for the time being in force amending or substituted for the said Sections shall from the date of this Order extend to Palestine.

And the Right Honourable Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Martin, Lord Bishop of Rochester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I Martin by Divine Permission Bishop of Rochester do in pursuance of the Twenty sixth Section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria cap. 106 and of the First Section of the Act of Parliament of the fiftieth and fifty-first years of the same reign cap. 68 hereby represent to Your Grace:

"1. There is in the County of Kent and my Diocese of Rochester the Vicarage of St. John Welling the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Michael East Wickham in the same County and Diocese of Southwark and contains according to the census of 1931 a population of six thousand seven hundred and eighty six and the net annual value thereof is Three hundred and thirty two pounds.

"2. In the same County and Diocese of Southwark is the Vicarage of St. Michael East Wickham the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. John Welling and contains according to the census of 1931 a population of Eight thousand five hundred and the net annual value thereof is Five hundred and twenty four pounds.

"3. The North Western portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. John Welling lies at a distance from the Parish Church of St. John Welling and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Michael East Wickham.

"4. It appears to me that the following alteration in the boundary of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. John Welling may be

made with advantage to the interests of religion viz:—

"The North Western portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. John Welling be united to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Michael East Wickham.

"5. The Reverend Frank Moore is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of St. John Welling and I the said Bishop of Rochester in right of my said Bishopric am the Patron thereof.

"6. The Reverend Walter John Smith is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of St. Michael East Wickham and Robert Charles Joynt formerly Archdeacon of Kingston-upon-Thames Chancellor and Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark John Bernard Haldane of the Rectory Sumner Street Southwark in the County of Surrey Precentor and Canon of the said Cathedral Church and Harry Lloyd of the Woodlands Caterham in the County of Surrey Treasurer of the said Cathedral Church are the Patrons thereof and The Right Reverend Richard Godfrey by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Southwark is the Bishop of the Diocese in which the said Benefice of St. Michael East Wickham is situate.

"7. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty sixth Section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria cap. 106 and the first section of the Act of Parliament of the fiftieth and fifty-first years of the same Reign cap. 68 I the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the said District of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. John Welling so proposed to be annexed to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Michael East Wickham and the mode in which it appears to me the alteration may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction Glebe Lands Tithes Dues Rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to Pews may be made with justice to all parties interested.

"And I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said respective Patrons and Incumbents of the said Parishes and of the said Lord Bishop of Southwark and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme I request that Your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents of the said respective Patrons Incumbents and Bishop thereto to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME

"1. It is proposed to separate the following District from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. John Welling in the County of Kent and Diocese of Rochester and unite the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Michael East Wickham.

"Such District shall consist of that portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. John

Welling which lies to the North West of an imaginary line running along the centre of the Bexleyheath line of the Southern Railway.

"Such District is coloured pink on the plan annexed hereto and marked 'A' thereon.

"The said District so annexed to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Michael East Wickham shall no longer form part of the Diocese of Rochester but shall be annexed to and form part of the Diocese of Southwark and the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Southwark shall have vested in him the Ecclesiastical jurisdiction of such District.

"The Inhabitants of the said District shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the Parish of St. John Welling aforesaid (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said Church) but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the Parish of St. Michael East Wickham and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act 1868 to the repair of such last mentioned Church.

"The Incumbent of the Parish of St. Michael East Wickham shall have sole and exclusive cure of Souls within such District so united to his Parish.

"The Inhabitants of the said District shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms and churchings solemnised and performed in the Church of the Parish of St. Michael East Wickham.

"All fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said District shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish of St. Michael East Wickham.

"No alteration shall be made in the Patronage or Endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF SECOND CLASS CLERKS FOR SERVICE UNDER THE SUPREME COURT OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 20 and must not have attained the age of 30 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. The upper age limit may, however, be extended to 50 in the case of candidates who were employed prior to 1st January, 1929, in a temporary capacity as a clerk in any of the offices of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and are still so employed at the date of the vacancy.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible

provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. A candidate must have had a secondary education, and have obtained the Senior Certificate of the Ministry of Education of Northern Ireland, or have passed any other examination which in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners is of equivalent or higher standard, and must have had two years' experience in a lawyer's office or be a barrister or a graduate in law; provided that the Commissioners may waive these requirements, if the Lord Chief Justice so recommend, in the case of any candidate who has been employed prior to 1st January, 1929, in a temporary capacity as a clerk in any of the offices of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and is still so employed at the date of the vacancy.

Credit in the competition will be given for a university degree.

5. The Lord Chief Justice will take such steps as he thinks most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which he desires to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

6. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary of the Supreme Court of Northern Ireland, and shall be made on a form to be obtained from that office, which must be stamped by the applicant with a "Civil Service" stamp or stamps to the value of two shillings and sixpence; this fee is payable in respect of the application and will not be returned in any circumstances. The Lord Chief Justice will examine the candidates' credentials and will submit to the Civil Service Commissioners the names of such candidates as appear to be qualified and to be best fitted for appointment. The Civil Service Commissioners, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates. The Civil Service Commissioners may, if they think fit, assist in the scrutiny of the application forms of the candidates.

7. Candidates who are recommended by the Lord Chief Justice and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners will be summoned

to an interview before a Selection Board sitting in Northern Ireland, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications; the decision of the Selection Board will be final. The Selection Board will be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the Lord Chief Justice, who will be represented on the Selection Board in the proportion of one in three or two in five; they will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

Until further notice, preference will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces in the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

8. In addition to the fee of two shillings and sixpence payable on application (Clause 6), a candidate selected for appointment will be required to pay a fee of £4 2s. 6d., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £4 5s., before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.

9. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, in industry or business, or otherwise.
