WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of December, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and

now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of West Drayton, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of West Drayton is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Eva Elizabeth De Burgh of Number 15, Onslow Crescent, London, S.W., Spinster:

"And whereas the said Eva Elizabeth De Burgh is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of West Drayton now vested in her as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of London for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley now Bishop of London, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Arthur

Foley, Bishop of London, has executed this

Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of West Drayton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say,

in the Parish of West Drayton:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Eva Elizabeth De Burgh (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of West Drayton now vested in her, the said Eva Elizabeth De Burgh as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of London.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly

prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of December, 1934, in the words and figures

following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Whitehaven, Christ Church, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Whitehaven, Holy Trinity, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Cumberland and in the Diocese of Carlisle:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Whitehaven, Christ Church, and Whitehaven, Holy Trinity, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Carlisle and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Carlisle signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Carlisle embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, is now full the Reverend George Wilfrid Arnold being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Holy Trinity, is at present vacant:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the total revenue of the Benefices hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice which would remain after making such provision as is hereinafter recommended and proposed for the payment of a Curate to assist the Incumbent of such United Benefice, would be more than is required to form a competent provision for the United Benefice and it is desirable that the surplus revenue should be applied as hereinafter recommended and proposed for the benefit of a proposed Benefice in the said Diocese of Carlisle for which no provision or no competent provision at present exists:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said George Wilfrid Arnold (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, and the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Holy Trinity, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Whitehaven, Holy Trinity with Christ Church' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said George Wilfrid Arnold if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Whitehaven, Holy Trinity, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the union taking effect a Curate shall be employed to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice in the performance of the duties thereof and that a part of the endowment of the United Benefice, that is to say, an annual sum of £140, being part of an annual payment of £287 at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall be appropriated and paid by us to the Incumbent of the United Benefice conditionally upon the employment of such Curate.

"6. That upon the said union taking effect and pending the provision of a Parsonage House more suitably situated the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"7. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presenta-tion shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Holy Trinity, having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Beneficé to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"8. That with the consents of the Patrons of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, namely the said Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle (whose consent is testified as aforesaid), the Right Honourable Hugh Cecil Lowther, Earl of Lonsdale, K.G., G.C.V.O., Lewis Thomas Helder of Lyndhurst, Whitehaven, Esquire, Edward McCray of Meadow View, Whitehaven, Esquire, and the Venerable John Henry Hopkinson, Archdeacon of Westmorland (whose consents are testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect a part of the endowment and property of the United Benefice, that is to say (a) a sum of £100 per annum being part of the annual payment of £287 at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners (as hereinbefore mentioned), to the

Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, and (b) a capital sum of £1,500 held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, on behalf of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church, shall be excepted out of the union and shall be held and accumulated by us for and towards the endowment of a new District proposed to be formed wholly or partly out of the Parish of the said Benefice of Whitehaven, Christ Church.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Carlisle has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Carlisle.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Thornhill, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Thornhill has been improved by means of certain leases and sales of glebe lands and of minerals within and under the glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice, which leases and sales were granted and carried out under the authority of the said Acts, with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by former Incumbents and by the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Thornhill:

"And whereas the proceeds of the said leases and sales have been invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts, and the investments so made include (inter alia), first, a sum of £2,837 14s. 11d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock, and secondly a sum of £10,647 11s. 6d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, which sums of Stock are now held by us in trust to pay to the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts with respect to taking a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said leases and sales payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the Acts men-

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said leases and sales exceeds the annual sum of £600, and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Thornhill is now full, the Reverend Henry Telford Hayman being the Rector or Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of Thernhill shall from whatsoever cause be next voided, or from the date of the cessation of any pension which may become charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice in favour of the said Henry Telford Hayman upon his resignation therefrom, the interest or dividends arising in respect of the said sum of £2,837 14s. 11d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock and also of a sum of £10,495 11s. 9d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock (being a portion of the said

sum of £10,647 11s. 6d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock) or in respect of any securities or investments from time to time representing the said sums of £2,837 14s. 11d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock and £10,495 11s. 9d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock shall cease to be held or received by us for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Thornhill and shall be held and received by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 13th day of December, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a

District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Peter, Whitstable, situate in the Parish of Whitstable, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Peter, Whitstable, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Whitstable which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Peter, Whitstable, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Whitstable'.

"And with the like consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, bapchurchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Peter, Whitstable, situate as afore-said, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being. Provided always that so long as the Reverend Geoffrey Hillyard, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Whitstable, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church of Saint Peter, Whitstable, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Geoffrey Hillyard.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Whitstable, being:—
