PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of December, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and

now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘the said Benefice’) of West Drayton, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of West Drayton is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Eva Elizabeth De Burgh of Number 15, Onslow Crescent, London, S.W., Spinster:

“ And whereas the said Eva Elizabeth De Burgh is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of West Drayton now vested in her as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of London for the time being:

“ And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley now Bishop of London, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Arthur
