PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of December, 1934 (C.W. 10145/34), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 5th day of July, 1929, to sanction the promotion of Mr. Albert W. Smith, Warrant Officer, R.N., to Commissioned Officer from Warrant rank on the 29th October, 1929, with pay on the scale laid down for Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank of the non-mechanical class:

"And whereas Mr. Smith is due to retire shortly under the age limit, and we desire to retain his services for charge of the Photographic Stores of Your Majesty's Navy for a further period of two years: "We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the retention of Mr. Albert W. Smith, Commissioned Officer from Warrant rank, R.N., on the Active List for two years beyond the normal age for retirement, under the following conditions:—

(a) Full Pay to be continued on the authorised scale laid down for Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank of the non-mechanical class.

(b) Time to count for increase of retired pay under the present scale and subject to the existing maximum.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the

Admiralty, dated the 11th day of December, 1934 (C.W. 5681/34), in the words following,

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas from time to time regulations have been laid down by Order in Council governing the conditions of service for Officers on the Reserved, Retired or Pension lists of the Royal Navy who are called out in time of

war or emergency:
"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of May, 1901, authority was given for Officers who had been allowed to resign from the Royal Navy, but who volunteered for service in War or Emergency to be borne on an 'Emergency' List:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 3rd day of November, 1927, to provide that Officers on the Retired and Emergency Lists of Your Majesty's Royal Marines should be liable to recall in time of War or Emergency under the same conditions as provided for Officers on the Retired and Emergency Lists of Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the gulations governing the emoluments of regulations Officers on the Retired and Emergency Lists of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines require

consolidation and amendment:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to establish the Regulations contained in the Schedule hereto annexed.

" The Lords Commissioners \mathbf{of} Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

- "REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE EMOLUMENTS OF OFFICERS ON THE RETIRED AND EMERGENCY LISTS OF THE ROYAL NAVY AND ROYAL MARINES WHEN CALLED OUT OR RETAINED FOR SERVICE IN TIME OF WAR OR EMERGENCY.
- "I.-Officers who have retired with retired pay (other than disability retired pay or disability addition to service retired pay).
- "(a) Full Pay to be issued on the scale appropriate to the Officer's rank on the retired list, time served on full pay in that rank being reckoned for the purpose of increases of full pay. The scale to be that in force at the time for corresponding Officers on the Active List. Retired pay to be suspended.
- "(b) A bonus of 25 per cent. to be payable on the full pay issued under clause (a), exclusive of any allowances.
- "(c) Where any portion of retired pay has been commuted, a sum equivalent to the amount of retired pay commuted to be deducted from the full pay and bonus issued under clauses (a) and (b). No deduction,

however, to be made from full pay and bonus thereon in respect of any gratuity awarded

on retirement or discharge.

"(d) An Officer eligible for full pay and bonus under clauses (a) and (b) may elect to remain in receipt of his current service retired pay increased by 25 per cent. of such retired pay, if more to his advantage. Where any part of the retired pay has been commuted the rate of retired pay to be that in issue at the date of re-employment, but the 25 per cent. addition to be based on the rate of retired pay which would have been in issue had there been no commutation.

- "(e) Neither time nor promotion on or after retirement to qualify for increase or grant of retired pay.
- "II.—Officers who have retired without retired pay and Officers on the Emergency List.
- (a) Full pay only to be issued as provided in Section I, clause (a), no bonus on full pay being payable.
- "(b) No deduction to be made from full pay in respect of any gratuity awarded on retirement or discharge.
- "(c) The time served to count for increase of full pay, but neither time nor promotion after retirement to qualify for retireed pay or retiring gratuity.
- "III.—Officers in receipt of Disability Retired Pay or Pension or Disability Additions to service retired pay.
- "(a) Except as otherwise provided hereunder, the conditions in Section I to apply.
- "(b) Disability retired pay or pension authorised by the Ministry of Pensions not to be suspended but only so much if any of the 25 per cent. bonus referred to in Section I, clause (b), to be issued as exceeds that portion disability retired pay which the Admiralty may decide to have been awarded in respect of service. For this purpose an Officer who has commuted any part of his retired pay or pension shall be deemed to be still in receipt of the part commuted.
- "(c) Disability additions to service retired payable under the provisions Schedule I, Sections 1 and 2 of Order in Council dated the 11th day of October, 1923, or under corresponding provisions of any subsequent Order in Council, to remain in issue, the service retired pay being suspended.
- "(d) An Officer awarded disability retired pay under the provisions of Schedule Section 3, of the above-mentioned Order in Council, or under corresponding provisions of any subsequent Order in Council, to continue in receipt of such portion of his disability retired pay as the Admiralty may decide to be equivalent to the disability addition which would have remained in issue to him under clause (c) had he been eligible for service retired pay, the remaining portion of his disability retired pay (deemed to be the service element) being suspended.
- "(e) An Officer awarded disability retired pay under the provisions of Schedule II of the above-mentioned Order in Council, or under corresponding provisions of any subsequent Order in Council to continue in receipt of such disability retired pay, no bonus on No deduction, | full pay being payable.

- "(f) Except as regards disability retired pay issued under clauses (b) and (e), a deduction to be made from full pay and bonus thereon equal to that portion of the service element of retired pay, as determined by the Admiralty, which has been commuted.
- "(g) An Officer to be eligible to receive service retired pay (or the service element of disability retired pay or pension) increased by 25 per cent., as provided in Section 1, clause (d), if more to his advantage than the emoluments otherwise payable under these Regula-
- "(h) Disability retired pay and disability additions to service retired pay which have been awarded on a temporary basis only, to be liable to cessation or reduction at Admiralty discretion during re-employment.
- "(i) Re-employment in war or emergency shall not affect the continued payment of an Officer's wound or injury pension awarded under Naval Regulations in force prior to the 1st October, 1921.
- "IV.—Officers retained in employment beyond the normal age for compulsory retirement.
- "Such Officers to be treated as Retired Officers re-employed and to be subject to the conditions laid down in this Schedule."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of November, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Rickling and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Quendon, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Rickling and Quendon duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford and therein recommended union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Rickling and Quendon are now full, being held together in plurality by the Reverend Alfred John Tempest Lewis under the autho-

rity of a Dispensation:
"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Alfred John Tempest Lewis (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Rickling and the said Benefice of Quendon shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Quendon with Rickling' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Alfred John Tempest Lewis if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Rickling and Quendon shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents, Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto his tenure of the said Benefices of Rickling and Quendon shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Quendon shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Rickling having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Quendon having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Chelmsford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

STATUTES TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES IN RELATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE MADE UNDER "THE UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923" (13 & 14 GEORGE V., CHAPTER 33), WHICH AMENDING STATUTES ARE NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING IN COUNCIL.

We, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE D.

CHAPTER II.

THE UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS.

By substituting in Section 1 the words "Censor of Fitzwilliam House" for the words "Censor of Non-Collegiate Students."

STATUTE G.

CHAPTER II.

CONTRIBUTIONS OF COLLEGES FOR UNIVERSITY PURPOSES.

By substituting in Clause (ii) of Section 8 the words "an office placed in Schedule B" for the words "a Professorship, a Readership placed in Schedule B, or any of the offices of Registrary, Librarian, Secretary to the Financial Board, or Treasurer."

STATUTE H.

CHAPTER II.

Non-Collegiate Students.

By substituting in Section 1 the words "Censor of Fitzwilliam House hereinafter mentioned" for the words "Censor of Non-Collegiate Students."

By deleting Section 3 and substituting therefor the following to form Sections 3 and 4:—

- 3. The community of Non-Collegiate Students resident and non-resident shall be designated Fitzwilliam House, and Non-Collegiate Students may be described on such occasions and in such documents as the University may from time to time determine as members of Fitzwilliam House.
- 4. The University shall maintain premises affording opportunities for corporate life to Non-Collegiate Students. Those who desire to avail themselves of the said premises shall be chargeable with a separate fee which shall not be merged in any other fees payable by Non-Collegiate Students for facilities and privileges available to them.

By substituting in Section 5 the words "the aforesaid premises" for the words "Fitz-william House."

By substituting in Section 6 the words "Censor of Fitzwilliam House" for the words "Censor of Non-Collegiate Students."

By deleting from Section 8 the words "and by members of Fitzwilliam House."

By renumbering the present Section 4 as 5, and Sections 5—10 as 6—11.

APPEAL PROCEDURE.

THE GAS (APPEAL PROCEDURE RULES), 1934, DATED 31ST DECEMBER, 1934, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 16 OF THE GAS REGU-LATION ACT, 1920, AND SECTION 28 OF THE GAS Undertakings Act, 1934.

The Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 16 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, and Section 28 of the Gas Undertakings Act, 1934, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby make the following Rules:-

- 1.—(1) These Rules may be cited as the Gas (Appeal Procedure Rules), 1934, and shall come into force on the first day of January, 1935.
- (2) The Gas Regulation Act (Appeal Procedure Rules), 1922, are hereby revoked.
- (3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply to the interpretation of these Rules as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of
- 2. These Rules shall apply to all Appeals in pursuance of the provisions of Section 6 of

the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, against a report of a gas examiner.

In these Rules:-

"Respondents" shall mean the local authority or the Clerk of the Peace for Quarter Sessions for each area to which the report relates, according to whether the gas was appointed by \mathbf{the}

authority or Quarter Sessions; and
"Person appointed" shall mean the
person appointed by the Board of Trade to

determine the Appeal.

- 3. Notice of Appeal, together with the report of the gas examiner or a true copy thereof, shall within twenty-one days from the date of the report be delivered or sent by registered post to the Board of Trade, Great George Street, S.W.1, and a copy of such notice shall at the same time be sent to the Respondents.
- 4. Notice of Appeal shall state whether the whole or part of the report is complained of, and in the latter case specify such part, and shall be signed by the Appellants or their duly authorised agent, and shall give an address for service of documents.
- 5. The Appellants shall send to the Board of Trade and to the Respondents, either with their Notice of Appeal or within fourteen days thereafter, a concise statement in writing of the facts upon which they intend to rely and of any representations which they desire to
- 6. The Respondents shall within twenty-eight days of the receipt of such statement send to the Board of Trade and to the Appellants any representations which they desire to make in writing. If the Respondents desire to be heard on the Appeal, they shall within such period send to the Board of Trade and to the Appellants a concise statement in writing, setting out the facts upon which they intend to rely and to what extent the facts alleged in the Appellants' statement are admitted.
- 7. The Board of Trade will notify the parties of the name and address of the person appointed and if either party desire to be heard a request in writing therefor must be sent to the person appointed within seven days of such notification.
- 8. If a request under Rule 7 has been made by either party the person appointed shall fix a time and place for the hearing of the Appeal and shall give the parties at least ten days' notice thereof.
- 9. At the hearing of the Appeal the parties may, subject to the direction of the person appointed, call such evidence as they may think fit.
- 10. The person appointed may at any time require any party to submit in writing such further particulars as he may think necessary, and may, at any stage of the proceedings allow the amendment of any notice, statement, or particulars upon such terms as he may think
- 11. The costs of any Appeal, including the costs of any hearing, shall be in the discretion of the person appointed who may direct to and by whom, and in what manner, those costs or any part thereof shall be paid, and may tax or settle the amount of costs to be so paid or any part thereof.

12. The person appointed may, if he thinks fit, and subject to such conditions as he may impose, proceed with the consideration of any Appeal, notwithstanding any failure or omission by any party to comply with any of the requirements of these Rules, or the nonattendance of any party at any hearing.

Whereas by Section 3, sub-section (1) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 53), it is provided that if, where an Order in Council has been made under that Act with respect to any goods, it is shown to the satisfaction of the Appropriate Department by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter that the application of the provisions of the Order or of some of those provisions to any particular class or description of those goods has caused or is likely to cause injury or hardship to the said persons or any of them, the Department may direct that the Order or any particular provisions of the Order shall cease to apply to goods of that class or description or shall apply to such goods subject only to such modifications and conditions as the Department think fit, and the Order shall, while the Direction is in force, have effect subject thereto:

And whereas it is provided by Article 1 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 7 Order, 1934, (a) that it shall not be lawful to import (among other things) any chilled beef unless such meat bears an indication of origin; and by Article 2 of the said Order that the indication of origin shall be branded, or stamped, stencilled or printed in ink or stain, durably and conspicuously, in letters which shall except as therein provided be not less than one-half of an inch in height; and by Paragraph I of Article 3 of the said Order that the indication of origin required on importation shall be applied as follows, that is to say:—

- 1. In the case of chilled beef, each side of chilled beef shall bear the indication of origin on the outer side in a continuous series of words in three columns extending longitudinally:—
 - (i) from the hock joint to the neck, in a line passing over the round, aitchbone and rump and then continuing at a distance of two inches from the chine bone to the neck; and
- (ii) from the hind leg or shin to the foreshin in a line drawn down the middle of the side; and

(iii) from the fore-rib or crop to the sticking in a line drawn midway between the lines specified in (i) and (ii),

as shown in the diagram, Figure I, in the Schedule to the Order.

And whereas representations have been made on behalf of the High Commissioner of the Union of South Africa that Regulations have been made by the Government of the Union of South Africa requiring chilled beef exported from that Dominion to bear the name of the country of origin applied to it in the following manner—

Union South Africa

and that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 3 of the said Order without modification is likely to cause hardship.

And whereas the said Order will come into

force on the 7th January, 1935.

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, being the Appropriate Department in this case are satisfied that hardship is likely to be caused by the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 3 to such chilled beef before the said representations have been further considered.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AND DOUBLE DIPPING AREAS
