PRESENT,

· The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in Egypt:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Egypt (Amendment) Order in Council, 1934.
- (2) This Order shall be construed as one with the Egypt Order in Council, 1930, and the said Egypt Order in Council, 1930, and this Order may be cited as "The Egypt Orders in Council, 1930-1934."
- (3) A copy of the Egypt Order in Council, 1930, with the amendments whether by way of substitution, addition or omission required by this Order, and entitled the "Egypt Orders in Council, 1930-1934, Consolidated" shall be prepared and certified by the Secretary of State and copies of the "Egypt Orders in Council, 1930-1934, Consolidated" shall be printed in accordance with the copy so certified, containing the certificate of the Secretary of State as aforesaid printed at the heading thereof, which certificate shall recite the provisions of this and the preceding paragraphs

- of this Article, and such copies may hereafter, except in regard to matters covered by Article 2 (2) of this Order, be exclusively referred to for all purposes connected with the exercise of jurisdiction by His Majesty in Egypt.
- (4) No further copies of the Egypt Order in Council, 1930, shall be printed and the copies of the Egypt Orders in Council, 1930-1934, Consolidated referred to in the preceding paragraph shall be printed as soon as the existing stock of printed copies of the Egypt Order in Council are exhausted.
- 2.—(1) This Order shall come into force on the 1st February, 1935.
- (2) No provision of this Order amending or repealing any provision of any previous Order shall affect the past operation of such previous Order or anything done thereunder.
- (3) A printed and certified copy of this Order shall forthwith be delivered by the High Commissioner to the Judge of the Supreme Court and shall thereupon be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in the public office of the Supreme Court at Alexandria, and shall remain so affixed and exhibited during one month from the date of first exhibition. Printed copies of this Order shall also be exhibited forthwith at each of the Consulates in Egypt in such manner as the Supreme Court shall direct.
- (4) Proof shall not in any proceeding or matter be required that the provisions of paragraph 3 of this Article have been complied with nor shall any act or proceeding be invalidated by any failure to comply therewith.

- 3. Article 16 (2) of the Egypt Order in Council, 1930, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order) shall be amended by the addition after the words "The Chief Justice of Cyprus" of the words "or (in the event of his being unable to sit) a puisne judge of the Supreme Court of Cyprus".
- 4. Article 70 (1) of the Principal Order shall be amended by substituting for clause (c) the following:—
 - "(c) without a proper licence sells or attempts to sell or offers for sale or manufactures in Egypt any goods whereof the Egyptian Government has by law a monopoly or whereof the sale or manufacture in Egypt is forbidden either altogether or without a proper licence."
- 5. Article 80 (12) of the Principal Order shall be repealed and the following paragraph substituted:—
 - "(12) Any person subject to this Order guilty of an offence against the provisions of this Article shall in respect of each offence be liable:
 - (a) On conviction on a charge, to a fine not exceeding one thousand pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding ten years or to both fine and imprisonment.
 - (b) On summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding two hundred and fifty pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding twelve months or to both such fine and imprisonment:

and may in addition on any conviction be ordered to be deported and shall in every case on conviction forfeit to His Majesty all articles in respect of which the offence was committed and the Court, before which the offender was convicted, may order any forfeited articles to be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Court, subject to any general or special directions of the Secretary of State thinks fit."

- 6. Article 81 (2) of the Principal Order shall be amended by the addition after the words "convicted of an offence" of the words "before the Court or the Egyptian Mixed Tribunals".
- 7. Article 93 of the Principal Order shall be repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
- for:—
 "93.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this
 Supreme Court, Order, every action in the Supreme Court, in which the amount or value of the claim exceeds two hundred and fifty pounds and which would in England be assigned to the King's Bench Division and in which fraud is alleged against the party applying for a jury or the claim is in respect of libel, slander, malicious prosecution, false imprisonment, seduction or breach of promise of marriage, shall, on the demand of a party filed in the Court in writing ten days before the day appointed for the hearing, be heard with a jury, unless the Court is of opinion that the trial of such action involves a prolonged examination of documents or accounts or any scientific or local investigation which cannot conveniently be made with a jury.
 - "(2) In the case of every action in the Supreme Court, which would in England be assigned to the Probate, Divorce and Admiralty division, the parties shall enjoy the

- same rights with regard to a hearing by a jury as they would have in England in the like circumstances.
- "(3) Any action or issue in an action, in which the parties are not entitled to demand a jury, may on the suggestion of any party at any stage be heard with a jury if the Court thinks fit.
- "(4) Any action, or any issue in an action, may be heard with a jury if the Court at any stage thinks fit so to order of its own motion."
- 8. Article 99 of the Principal Order shall be amended by striking out the words "Each Court shall so far as circumstances admit have for and within its own district" and substituting therefor the words "The Supreme Court, and each Provincial Court within its own district, shall, so far as circumstances admit, respectively have" and by substituting for the words "British subjects" wherever they occur the words "persons subject to this Order".
- 9. Article 122 of the Principal Order shall be repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "122.—(1) Except in the cases specified in paragraph 5 of this Article, any party may appeal as of right against any decision of the Supreme Court or any verdict of a jury in the Supreme Court.
 - "(2) Any such appeal shall be heard by the Full Court unless, in the case of an appeal from a Provincial Court, the Judge of the Supreme Court otherwise orders, or unless, in the case of an action originating in the Supreme Court, the parties otherwise agree.
 - "(3) Any such appeal shall be by way of re-hearing and shall be brought by notice of motion given within the prescribed time.
 - "(4) On such motion, any order may be made that might be made by the Court of Appeal in England in the exercise of its ordinary appellate jurisdiction.
 - "(5) No appeal shall lie from a decision of the Supreme Court in any of the following cases:—
 - "(a) Against a decision given in proceedings which originated in a local court;
 - "(b) against an order allowing an extension of time for a motion of appeal;
 - "(c) against an order giving unconditional leave to defend an action;
 - "(d) from a decision which, if given in England by the High Court would be made final by Statute;
 - "(e) against a decree absolute for the dissolution or nullity of a marriage given against any party, who having had time and opportunity to appeal against the decree nisi on which the decree absolute is founded, did not so appeal;
 - "(f) against an order given in a special case stated under the Arbitration Act. 1889 or in any other case where the jurisdiction exercised is consultative only not judicial;
 - "(g) against a decision in a matter where by the agreement of the parties the Judge has in effect acted as arbitrator or on the understanding that his decision would be accepted as final;
 - "(h) against an order which embodies an undertaking not to appeal;

"(i) against an order made with the consent of the parties unless by leave of the Court or Judge making the order;

"(j) against an order as to costs only which are in the discretion of the Court, unless by leave of the Court or Judge making the order;

"(k) on behalf of a person, who has been admitted to sue or defend as a poor person, unless by leave of the Court or Judge, before whom the matter was heard, or of

the Full Court;

"(l) Against any interlocutory order or interlocutory judgment, unless by leave of the Judge or the Full Court, except in the following cases:—

(i) where the liberty of the subject or the custody of infants is concerned; (ii) where an injunction or the

(ii) where an injunction or the appointment of a receiver is granted or refused;

(iii) against a decree *nisi* in a matrimonial cause or a judgment or order in an admiralty action determining liability;

(iv) against an order refusing unconditional leave to defend an action;

(v) where rules of court prescribe that the order or decision shall be regarded as being of the nature of a final decision."

10. Article 123 of the Principal Order shall be amended by substituting for the words "Subject to the provisions of this order, an appeal shall lie to His Majesty in Council" the words "An appeal from decisions of the Full Court shall lie to His Majesty in Council by leave of the Full Court. Leave shall be granted as follows:—"

of powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Corporation's Acts and Orders relating to tramways, light railways, and trolley vehicles, the Council of the City of Leeds at a Meeting held in the Council Chamber at the Civic Hall in the said City on the second day of January, 1935, made the following Bye-laws and Regulations relating to the Transport Undertaking of the Corporation. A true copy of the said Bye-laws and Regulations was lodged with the Minister of Transport at Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1, on the fourth day of January, 1935, and unless disallowed by him the said Bye-laws and Regulations will come into full force

and effect after the expiration of two calendar months from the date of such lodgment as aforesaid.

Bye-Laws and Regulations. Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-Laws and Regulations the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them that is to say:—"Corporation" means The Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Leeds; "Transport Undertaking" means the Tramways, Light Railways, and Trolley Vehicle systems of the Corporation whether situate within the City of Leeds or in any other district; the words "Transport Committee" mean the Committee appointed by the Corporation for the time being to undertake the control and management of the tramways and light railways; "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways, light railways, or trolley vehicle systems of the Corporation for conveyance of passengers; "Passenger" means every person being carried or conveyed upon or by a car; "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Transport Committee having charge of or helping in the charge of a car; "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Transport Committee driving or helping to drive a car; "Interior of a Car shall not include the upper deck of a covered car; "All-day ticket" means a ticket enabling the person to whom the same is issued to make on any specified day or days or part of a day any number of journeys by a car.

The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every car and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws and

Regulations.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

2. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform and not otherwise unless so directed by the Conductor.

When a car stops no person shall board the car until all passengers desiring to alight

therefrom shall have done so.

Entering or Leaving Cars in Motion.

3. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any car in motion.

Smoking.

4. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or eigarette in the interior of any car.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

5. No person shall spit or swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself in any offensive or disorderly manner, or sing or play upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit or waste paper or other refuse in or upon any car, tramway station, waiting room, premises or buildings used in connection with the Transport Undertaking, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or premises as aforesaid, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Objectionable Persons.

6. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, and no person who from any other cause or for any other reason in the opinion of the Conductor might be offensive or objectionable to any passenger, shall mount or enter any car, and any such person, found in or upon any car, shall leave the car on being requested by the Conductor to do so, and on his refusal he may be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Damage to Car.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Offensive Clothing.

8. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor, soil, injure, or tlamage the seats, linings, curtains, or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, shall enter, or remain in or upon any car, and the Conductor may prevent any such person entering the car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any car, he shall, on the request of the Conductor, leave such car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned or tendered to him, and, on his refusal to do so, he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Provided that no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon a car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Provided further that on top covered doubledecked cars any such person as last mentioned shall, if so directed by the Conductor, travel on the upper deck when there is seating accom-

modation available thereon.

Payment of Fares.

9. Each passenger shall upon demand and whether the fare shall have been demanded or not before leaving the car pay to the Conductor or other duly authorised officer or servant of the Transport Committee the fare legally payable for his journey and accept a ticket therefor.

Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey except as provided by Bye-law 21.

Any passenger paying for a stage less than the whole journey run by the car shall be deemed to have completed his journey at the end of the stage paid for; if the passenger remains on the car he shall pay the fare legally payable for the remainder of his journey as a new passenger.

Tickets.

10. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to the conductor or

other duly authorised officer or servant of the Transport Committee, and shall also when required to do so either deliver up his ticket or in default thereof pay the fare legally demandable. No passenger shall alter, cut, tear, or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible. Tickets shall not be transferable from one passenger to another and shall only be available for the car on which they are issued, except transfer, return or all-day tickets or as provided by Bye-law 21.

Luggage.

11. No passenger shall unless permitted by the Conductor bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such luggage or personal luggage shall be carried at the responsibility of the passenger, and shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the car as shall be directed by the Conductor.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

12. No person not being a duly authorised officer or servant of the Transport Committee shall travel or ride on the steps, platform, outside rails, buffers or guards of any car, or stand on the platform or on the upper deck of any car, or sit on the outside rail on the upper deck or on any part of any car not intended for passengers, and any person so travelling, riding, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor or other duly authorised servant of the Transport Committee.

No Person to hold or hang on to a Car.

13. No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any car and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any car or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers except in the interior of the car with the consent of the Conductor.

Entering Full Cars.

14. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the Conductor first obtained.

Dogs.

15. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car, except by permission of the Conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by, or under the direction of, the Conductor.

Firearms, &c.

· 16. No person shall place upon any car or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms,

or any article, instrument or implement, or any utensil or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers or likely to cause a nuisance or to soil or damage any car or the clothing of any passengers.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

17. No person other than the Conductor or Driver, or other servant of the Transport Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or screens, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car, or its equipment, and no person other than the Conductor, or other servant of the Transport Committee acting in the performance of his duty shall signal a car to start.

Passengers to Form a Queue.

18. On occasions when six or more persons being intending passengers are awaiting at any stopping place or terminus on the Transport Undertaking to board or enter a car, they shall form in a line or queue of not more than two abreast and board or enter the car in the order in which they stand, and no person shall take or endeavour to take a place in such line or queue when formed out of proper order, or shall enter or endeavour to enter a car out of the order in which he stood in such line or queue or before any person who stood in front of him in such line or queue and who is desirous of entering the same car.

Children Standing on Seats.

19. No child shall be allowed by the person in charge of such child to stand on the seats or cushions of any car, and if any child shall stand on the seats or cushions of a car and damage be caused thereto, or to the clothing of any passenger in consequence thereof, the person in charge of such child shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage so caused or sustained.

Obstruction.

20. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any car, or wilfully obstruct or impede any Conductor, Driver, or other servant of the Transport Committee acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car, or tramway station, waiting room premises, or buildings used in connection with the Transport Undertaking.

Disabled Cars.

21. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the Conductor, leave the same; and if such passengers have paid their fares they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be entitled to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with leave of the Conductor, enter a disabled or damaged car.

Power to remove Passengers Committing Offences.

22. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any car, any breach of these Bye-laws

and Regulations, shall if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-laws and Regulations.

23. Every Conductor and Driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations, and prevent the breach thereof.

Penalty.

24. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Copy of Bye-laws and Regulations to be hung on Cars.

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use and in or about each tramway station, waiting room, or premises used in connection with the Transport Undertaking, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

Operation.

26. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the fifth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

Repeal of Existing Bye-laws and Regulations.

27. From and after the fifth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five the Bye-laws and Regulations relating to tramways which were made on the Third day of September One thousand nine hundred and two and the Fourteenth day of November One thousand nine hundred and four respectively by the Corporation being the promoters of the Leeds Corporation Tramways Undertaking under and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, which Bye-laws and Regulations were respectively certified by the Board of Trade on the Eighth day of November One thousand nine hundred and two and the Seventeenth day of January One thousand nine hundred and five, shall be severally repealed, but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof.
