In the Matter of JOSEPH RANK Limited, and
in the Matter of the Companies Act, 1929.

NOTICE is hereby given that a petition was, on the 28th day of November, 1934, presented to His Majesty's High Court of Justice by the above named Company to confirm an alteration of the Company's objects proposed to be effected by a Special Resolution passed at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company held on the 21st day of August, 1934, whereby it was resolved as follows:—

"(U) To establish maintain and support or assist in the establishment maintenance and support of associations, institutions and conveniences calculated or considered likely, directly or indirectly, to benefit the Company or to benefit any of the employees or ex-employees (which expression herein shall include any salaried director or former salaried director) of the Company, or of any Company in which the Company or any of its subsidiary, associated or allied Companies (including Ranks Limited) is or may be interested, or the dependants or connections of such persons, and to grant pensions, allowances, gratuities and bonuses to any of such employees, ex-employees, dependants or connections, and to make payments towards insurance and to subscribe or guarantee money for charitable objects or for any public, general or useful object and to establish maintain or support or assist in the establishment, maintenance and support of funds or schemes calculated or considered likely to advance the interests of the Company or of any Company in which it or any subsidiary associated or allied Company (including Ranks Limited) is or may be interested and of any such employees, ex-employees, dependants or connections."

And notice is further given that the said petition is directed to be heard before the Honourable Mr. Justice Bennett, at the Royal Courts of Justice, Strand, London, on Monday, the 4th day of February, 1935, when any person interested in the assets of the Company (whether as creditor, shareholder or otherwise) desirous of opposing the making of an Order confirming such alteration, may appear, in person or by Counsel, for that purpose.

(1) by substituting the following clause for Clause 3 (b) thereof:—

"To carry on the wholesale or retail businesses or any of them of provision merchants, butchers, bacon curers, dealers in meat, pork, poultry, game, milk, butter, cheese and general farm produce, rabbits and offal, grocers, green-grocers, farmers, poultry farmers, dairy farmers and dairymen, market gardeners, beekeepers, breeders of pigs, cattle, horses and livestock, storekeepers, drysalters, dealers in drugs, chemicals and other articles of personal and household consumption, and any branch or subsidiary businesses commonly or conveniently carried on in connection with any of the aforesaid businesses."

(2) By adding at the end of sub-clause 9 of Clause 3 (d) thereof the words:—

"and to guarantee the performance of the contracts or obligations of any company, firm or person, and the payment and repayment of the capital and principal of, and dividends, interest or premiums payable on, any stock, shares and securities of any company, whether having objects similar to those of this Company or not, and to give all kinds of indemnities."
