The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Corpus Christi College, Cambridge, on the 21st day of November, 1934, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES OF CORPUS CHRISTI COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE, WHICH AMENDING STATUTE, HAVING BEEN DULY MADE AT A MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE SAID COLLEGE, SPECIALLY SUMMONED FOR THE PURPOSE AND HELD ON THE 21ST NOVEMBER, 1934, AND PASSED AT SUCH MEETING BY THE VOTES OF NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS OF THE NUMBER OF PERSONS PRESENT AND VOTING, AND NOTICE OF THE PROPOSED AMENDING STATUTE HAVING BEEN GIVEN TO THE UNIVERSITY, IS NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING IN COUNCIL.

We, the Master and Fellows of Corpus Christi College in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College by inserting before the final paragraph of Statute 25 in respect of Bye-Foundations the following paragraph:

Notwithstanding any provision in these Statutes, the Governing Body shall have power to elect a candidate after entry into any such Exhibition or into an Exhibition provided from the Canterbury, the Norwich or the St. Paul's Fund or from the Reserve Fund in respect of the Hewitt Exhibition, provided that the candidate is qualified in all other respects; provided that the Governing Body shall have obtained the consent of any Body or persons who are entitled under these Statutes to nominate candidates for the Exhibition in question; and provided that the Governing Body are satisfied that the performance of the candidate in the annual examinations is such as to justify his election.

In witness whereof we, the said Master and Fellows of Corpus Christi College, have hereunto caused our Common Seal to be affixed this thirty-first day of January one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 15th February, 1935, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £25,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 18th February, 1935, to Saturday, the 23rd February, 1935, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the

amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
