IT is this day ordered by Their Lordships that His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury do prepare a Special Form of Prayer and of Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the protection afforded to the King's Majesty during the twenty-five years of His auspicious reign, and that such Form of Prayer and of Thanksgiving be used in the Cathedral Church of St. Paul in London, on Monday the sixth day of May next, and in all Churches and Chapels in England as defined in the Interpretation Measure, 1925, either upon the said Monday, the sixth day of May next, or upon the ensuing Sunday, the twelfth day of May next.

And it is hereby further ordered that His Majesty's Printer do forthwith print a competent number of copies of the said Form of Prayer and of Thanksgiving that the same may be forthwith sent round and read in the several Churches and Chapels of England.

ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931.

A draft Regulation made on the 17th December, 1934, by the Architects Registration Council of the United Kingdom under Section 13 of the above-mentioned Act has been submitted for the approval of the Privy Council and is published herewith.

Representations by persons to whom the Regulation is applicable may be made in writing to the Privy Council on or before the 13th day of March, 1935.

The Architects' Registration Council at their meeting held on the 17th December, 1934, resolved that the existing Regulation No. 36 be added to in manner following:—

"An applicant for registration whose application has been rejected by the Council on two or more occasions shall on every subsequent occasion when re-submitting the application for further consideration pay to the Council a special fee of 10s. towards the expenses involved in such further consideration."

THE FOREIGN PARCELS (SMALL PACKETS) (CUSTOMS) AMENDMENT (No. 1) WARRANT, 1935. DATED 1ST JANUARY, 1935.

We the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in exercise of the powers conferred on us by Section 14 of the Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf do by this Warrant made on the recommendation of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise and of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by their respectively signing the same) order direct and declare as follows:—

- 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign Parcels (Small Packets) (Customs) Warrant, 1930, hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant."
- 2. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (b) of Article 3 of the Principal Warrant:—
 - "(b) does not exceed two pounds in weight, or two feet in length, breadth or depth, or three feet in length, breadth and depth combined. If made up in the form of a roll, the length and twice the diameter shall not exceed three feet three inches and the greatest dimension shall not exceed two feet eight inches."
- 3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1935.

4. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign Parcels (Small Packets) (Customs) Amendment (No. 1) Warrant, 1935."

- 5. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service. Subject to this condition, the wishes of the candidates will, where possible, be respected. Candidates will be assigned, save in exceptional circumstances, only to offices within daily travelling distance of their places of residence.
- 6. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
