TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8 Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

February, 1935, the Minister of Transport confirmed the Walsall (Green Lane) Road (Restriction) Order, 1934, made by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Walsall under Section 46 (1) of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, and Section 29 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933. - (2) Nothing in the Order shall be taken to permit any vehicle to travel at a speed which, apart from the Order, would be unlawful.
- (3) Nothing in the Order shall apply to any vehicle on any occasion when the vehicle is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, if the observance of that limit of speed would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion.
