A PROCLAMATION

FOR APPOINTING MONDAY, MAY 6TH, A BANK HOLIDAY AND A PUBLIC HOLIDAY THROUGHOUT THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas We consider it desirable that Monday the Sixth day of May next, being the occasion of the Twenty-fifth Anniversary of Our Accession to the Throne, should be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday throughout the United Kingdom:

And whereas the said Sixth day of May is a Bank Holiday in Scotland under the provisions of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871:

We do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, appoint Monday the Sixth day of May next to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout England, Wales and Northern Ireland.

And We do further appoint the said Sixth day of May next to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the United Kingdom and by this Our Royal Proclamation command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this twenty-first day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and in the twenty-fifth year of Our Reign.

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 17th day of March, 1932, to sanction the appointment of a Chief Constable, Royal Marine Police with, *inter alia*, salary at the standard rate of £1,000 a year:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 5th day of October, 1934, to sanction an improved scale of salary for this appointment of £900 a year rising by annual increments of £45 a year to £1,080 a year in substitution for

the current rate of £900 a year authorised by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of June, 1934:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 9th day of November, 1934, to sanction, *inter alia*, as from the 1st day of September, 1934, a consolidated salary for the Chief Constable, Royal Marine Police, of £905 a year, being approximately 9½ per cent. below the standard rate of £1,000 a year:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction, in substitution for the aforementioned consolidated rate of £905 a year, a consolidated scale of salary as from the 1st day of September, 1934, for the Chief Constable, Royal Marine Police, of £905 a year, rising annually, as follows, to £950, to £996, to £1,040 and to £1,085 (maximum):

"Provided that until in the opinion of Your Majesty's Government the state of the national finances permits of the issue of the aforesaid consolidated scale of salary in full, it shall be subject to an abatement, and the Chief Constable, Royal Marine Police, shall accordingly continue to receive a scale of salary corresponding to the scale prescribed by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 5th day of October, 1934.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment of Training Allowance to these Instructors at the rates, and subject to the conditions laid down for Boys' Instructors, with effect from the 31st December, 1934.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the foregoing proposals."

"And whereas by Your Order in Council dated the 28th November, 1923, provision is made, *inter alia*, for Schoolmasters, Royal Navy, to be promoted to the rank of commissioned officer from warrant rank after fifteen years from date of entry provided that they are recommended and qualified by examination:

"And whereas we are of opinion that these provisions of the aforesaid Order in Council should now be revised:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us, at our discretion, to promote Schoolmasters, Royal Navy, to the rank of commissioned officer from warrant rank after completing ten years from date of entry, provided that such earlier advancement shall not have the effect of increasing the pay or retired pay of such schoolmasters beyond the rate for which they would have been eligible had the period of qualifying service not been thus reduced, and provided also that Schoolmasters who have already completed ten years from date of entry shall be advanced at our discretion to the rank of

commissioned officer from warrant rank from the date of this Order in Council.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary, with a view to

the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken by His Majesty's vessels, and other vessels, navigating the waters of the Port and of the approaches thereto:

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain Regulations and Rules were made by Orders in Council dated the 14th day of February, 1921, and the 5th day of March, 1931, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Rosyth:

And whereas it appears expedient to amend such Rules as hereinafter provided:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.

2. The following Rule shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Port of Rosyth, and shall be read and construed as though inserted in the Second Schedule of the said Order in Council of the 14th day of February, 1921, as amended by the said Order in Council of the 5th day of March, 1931, in the position indicated by the number prefixed thereto:—

Lights and Signals for Ferry Vessels.

5. Ferry vessels plying between North and South Queensferry shall by day, exhibit 3 Black Balls or shapes not less than 2 feet in diameter which shall be placed vertically in a conspicuous part of the vessel not less than 3 feet apart, and shall, by night, in addition to the side lights and stern light, exhibit 2 lights in a vertical line one above the other, not less than 4 feet or more than 6 feet apart, the upper light RED and the lower one WHITE and each of these lights shall be of the same construction and character and shall be exhibited in the same position as, and in place of the bright white light which steam vessels are required to exhibit by "Article 2A of the International Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea."

Ferries and other Vessels crossing the River.

6. Ferry vessels plying between North and South Queensferry shall keep out of the way of Inward and Outward bound traffic.

Every vessel crossing from one side of the River towards the other side shall do so at a proper time having regard to vessels navigating up and down the River, and shall be navigated so as not to cause obstruction, injury or damage to any other vessel.

And whereas in pursuance of the provisions of Article 10 of the said Convention the said Convention has been applied to the Colony of Malta with effect from the eleventh day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-five:

And whereas by subsection (1) of Section 1 of the Arbitration (Foreign Awards) Act, 1930, it is provided that Part I of that Act applies to any award made after the twenty-eighth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-four

(a) in pursuance of an agreement for arbitration to which the protocol set out in the Schedule to the Arbitration Clauses (Protocol) Act, 1924, applies; and

(b) between persons of whom one is subject to the jurisdiction of some one of such Powers as His Majesty being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made may by Order in Council declare to be parties to the said Convention and of whom the other is subject to the jurisdiction of some other of the Powers aforesaid; and

(c) in one of such territories as His Majesty being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made may by Order in Council declare to be territories to which the said Convention applies:

And whereas His Majesty is one of the Powers declared by Order in Council to be a party to the said Convention:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared as follows:—

1. The territory of Malta (Malta, and its dependencies) is a territory to which the said Convention applies.

2. This Order may be cited as the Arbitration (Foreign Awards) No. 1 Order, 1935, and shall come into force on the 21st day of February, 1935.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932 (7 E. 7. c. 29, 4-5 G. 5. c. 18, 9-10 G. 5. c. 80, 18-19

G. 5. c. 3 and 22-23 G. 5. c. 32), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty Series No. 16 (1928)) comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Japan has acceded to the said Convention, and has also acceded to the said Convention on behalf of Korea, Formosa and Japanese Saghalien:

And whereas by reason of such accessions to the said Convention the laws of the said foreign countries confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the said foreign countries or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 7th October, 1899 (S.R. & O. Rev. 1904, IX., Patents, &c., p. 5.), Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (46-7 V. c. 57), as amended by Section 6 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (Amendment) Act, 1885 (48-9 V. c. 63), should apply to Japan, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order dated the 7th October, 1899, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Japan, Korea, Formosa and Japanese Saghalien confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the said foreign countries or the territorial waters thereof, correspond-

ing to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, shall be applicable to Japan, Korea, Formosa and Japanese Saghalien.

3. The Order in Council dated the 7th October, 1899, is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Japan) Order, 1935.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 13th day of December, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Paul, Camberley, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Frimley, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford:

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Frimley and of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint Michael, York Town, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Frimley and of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, York Town, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Paul, Camberley, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Victor, Bishop of Guildford, as such Bishop and also as the Patron,

in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, York Town, and with the consent of the Reverend Bernard John Scott, the Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the Parish of Ash, in the said County and Diocese, and as such Rector or Incumbent the Patron of the Rectory of the said New Parish of Frimley (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Frimley and of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, York Town, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Paul, Camberley, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Camberley.’

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Bolton le Sands and of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint Luke, Skerton, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and New Parish respectively:

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, Slyne with Hest, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Bolton le Sands, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn, which is bounded upon the north-west by the sea, upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Christopher, Bare, upon the south by the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint Luke, Skerton,

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of 'The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868,' Section 3, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of Saint Peter at York:

"Whereas the said Dean and Chapter have agreed with us that a scheme should be laid before Your Majesty in Council for carrying into effect a transfer to us of part of the property belonging to them, for the considerations and upon the terms hereinafter set forth, which terms are, in our opinion, fair and reasonable, and the said Dean and Chapter have further agreed that such scheme should also comprise the incidental provisions hereinafter set forth, such provisions being necessary for carrying into effect the said transfer:

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments which are particularly described in the Schedule hereunto annexed and marked 'A' are part of the property of the said Dean and Chapter and the said Dean and Chapter are also beneficially interested in or otherwise entitled to certain sums of stock invested or held by us in trust for the said Dean and Chapter and particularly described in the Schedule hereto annexed marked 'B':

"And whereas under and by virtue of an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council bearing date the 8th day of February in the year 1855, and duly published in the London Gazette of the sixteenth day of the same month the Dean and Chapter are endowed with an annual payment of £25 made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council, bearing date the 22nd day of August, in the year 1917, and published in the London Gazette of the 24th day of the same month and made under the authority of an Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, Section 66, and of an Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, Section 20, provision is made for securing to the Canons Residentiary of the said Cathedral and Metropolitan Church the annual income of £500 for each Canon Residentiary it being by the said Order

provided that any deficiency in the amount of such incomes calculated in the manner therein specified shall be made up by means of payments out of our funds and that any surplus of the same incomes shall be paid over to us:

"And whereas there are at the present time as part of the constitution of the Chapter of the said Cathedral and Metropolitan Church a Dean and four Canons Residentiary:

"And whereas the annual payment herein-after proposed to be made by us to the said Dean and Chapter, as hereinafter mentioned, will after the payment and discharge by the said Dean and Chapter of the liability now attaching to the said Dean and Chapter in respect of the annual outgoings and charges enumerated and set forth in the Schedule marked 'C' annexed to an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 18th day of August in the year 1852, and duly published in the London Gazette of the 10th day of September following, and of the shares or portions of the said annual payment which in accordance with the statutes and usages of the said Cathedral and Metropolitan Church may be due or payable to the present and any future Dean or may be due and payable as an addition to the income of the property belonging to the said Dean and Chapter known as the Saint Peter's Estate provide for the present and future Canons Residentiary of the said Cathedral and Metropolitan Church the incomes to which they are or will be respectively entitled under the provision of the hereinbefore recited Order of Your Majesty in Council and of the Acts hereinbefore mentioned and we are of opinion that the arrangements hereinafter set forth will be the most convenient method of effecting for the future the purposes of the said Order and Acts:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of York (testified by the Corporate Seal of the Dean and Chapter affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Lord Archbishop of York, as Visitor of the said Dean and Chapter, testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme, we humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any further conveyance or act in the law the lands, tenements and hereditaments described in the Schedule marked 'A' with their appurtenances and all the right, title, estate and interest therein, together with the benefit of the perpetual land tax, if any, charged thereon which has been redeemed, but subject always to the liabilities and charges to which the said lands, tenements and hereditaments are or may be now specifically liable other than and except any liability or charge in respect of the annual outgoings and charges enumerated and set forth in the Schedule marked 'C' annexed to the hereinbefore mentioned Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 18th day of August in the year 1852, and also all the sum or sums of stock, and the interest of the said Dean and Chapter therein, particularly described in the Schedule marked 'B' shall be transferred to us in the manner contemplated by the same Act and that we shall

be entitled to the rents, profits and proceeds thereof or interest or dividends due in respect thereof as the case may be as from the 25th day of March in the year 1932, and that in consideration of and for such transfer to us as aforesaid, there shall be paid by us to the said Dean and Chapter by equal half yearly payments on the 25th day of March and the 29th day of September in every year the fixed annual sum of £3,260 and that the first half yearly payment of the said fixed annual sum shall be deemed to have become due and payable on the 29th day of September in the year 1932, and that the receipt or receipts of the Chapter Clerk for the time being shall be a good and valid discharge to us for all or any and every such sum or sums of money as shall therein be expressed to have been paid to him by us under the authority of such Order as aforesaid.

“ And we further recommend and propose that the annual payment hereto payable by us under the provisions of the hereinbefore recited Order of Her said late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council of the 8th day of February in the year 1855 shall as from the said 25th day of March in the year 1932 cease and determine.

“ And we further recommend and propose that the provisions of the Order of Your Majesty in Council, bearing date the 22nd day of August in the year 1917, relating to the incomes of the Canons Residentiary of the said Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of Saint Peter shall as from the said 25th day of March in the year 1932 cease and be of no effect.

“ And we further recommend and propose that all such liability as now attaches to the said Dean and Chapter in respect of the annual outgoings and charges enumerated and set forth in the Schedule marked ‘ C ’ annexed to the hereinbefore mentioned Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 18th day of August in the year 1852, shall remain with such Dean and Chapter, to be paid and discharged by them out of the said annual sum of £3,260 so to be received from us.

“ And we further recommend and propose that out of the said annual sum of £3,260 to be paid by us in accordance with the recommendations hereinbefore contained to the said Dean and Chapter the annual sum of £2,500, part thereof, shall be appropriated by the said Dean and Chapter to the payment of the income of the Dean and Canons Residentiary, that is to say, £500 for the income of the Dean and £500 for the income of each of the four Canons Residentiary, provided always that if at any time or times any Residentiary Canonry or Canonries in the said Cathedral and Metropolitan Church shall be lawfully suspended or suppressed then the said annual sum of £2,500 shall be divided into such a number of equal parts as is equal to the number of such Residentiary Canonries remaining after such suspension or suppression as aforesaid, together with the Deanery, and that such parts shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say, one of such parts for the income of the Dean and one of such parts for the income of each of the Canons Residentiary and that the annual sum remaining after the payment and discharge of all such liability as now attaches to the said Dean and Chapter in respect of the annual outgoings and charges enumerated and set forth in the Schedule marked ‘ C ’ annexed to the hereinbefore mentioned Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 18th day of August in the year 1852, and after the appropriation of the said annual sum of £2,500 as hereinbefore provided out of the said annual sum of £3,260 shall be applied by the said Dean and Chapter in such manner as they the said Dean and Chapter shall in accordance with and subject to the regulations, orders and statutes which now or in the future shall govern their constitution decide.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.”

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Richard Godfrey, Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, the name of the Rural Deanery of Kennington in the said Archdeaconry of Southwark shall be altered so that such Rural Deanery shall henceforth be called ‘ The Rural Deanery of Brixton and Kennington ’ ; secondly, the following Parishes shall be transferred to the said Rural Deanery of Brixton and Kennington, namely, the Parishes of Saint John, Angell Town ; Saint Matthew, Brixton ; Saint Paul, Brixton ; Saint Saviour, Brixton Hill ; Saint Jude, East Brixton ; Holy Trinity, Tulse Hill ; and Saint Matthias, Upper Tulse Hill, at present in the Rural Deanery of Clapham, in the said Archdeaconry of Southwark, and the Parish of Saint James, Camberwell, at present in the Rural Deanery of Camberwell, in the said Archdeaconry of Lewisham ; thirdly, the following Parishes shall be transferred to the said Rural Deanery of Clapham, namely, the Parishes of Saint Barnabas, South Kennington, and All Saints, South Lambeth, hitherto in the said Rural Deanery of Kennington, the Parish of Saint Luke, Battersea, and Saint Barnabas, Clapham Common, at present in the Rural Deanery of Battersea, in the said Archdeaconry of Southwark, and the Parish of the Ascension, Balham Hill, at present in the Rural Deanery of Streatham, in the same

Archdeaconry; fourthly, the Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Camberwell, hitherto in the said Rural Deanery of Kennington, shall be transferred to the said Rural Deanery of Camberwell; fifthly, the Parish of Saint Olave, Mitcham, at present in the Rural Deanery of Beddington, in the said Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon-Thames, shall be transferred to the said Rural Deanery of Streatham; and sixthly, the following Parishes shall be transferred from one Rural Deanery to another within the said Archdeaconry of Kingston-upon-Thames, that is to say, the Parish of Burstow, at present in the Rural Deanery of Godstone, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Reigate, and the Parish of Chaldon, at present in the said Rural Deanery of Reigate, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Caterham; and each of the said Parishes shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry in which it is hereby included and to which it is hereby transferred and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas notices of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act been transmitted to the Archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Kingston-upon-Thames, to the Archdeacon of Lewisham, and to the Archdeacon of Southwark, and they have severally expressed their approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint John, Drypool, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York, being:—

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATIONS OF
 (1) ASSISTANT INSPECTOR OF TAXES IN THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT, AND
 (2) THIRD CLASS OFFICER IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR.

Competitions under these Regulations are open both to men and women. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 21 and 24; candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st September of the year in which the examination is held.

In reckoning age for competition, the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every Candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage; but exception to the rule requiring resignation on marriage may, in individual circumstances, be made where the employment of a married woman is considered advisable in the light of her special qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department in which she is serving.

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for ad-

mission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
