And whereas it is expedient to make other provision than in the said recited Order in Council is contained with regard to the composition of the said Legislative Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Northern Rhodesia (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1935."

2. Article 4 of the Northern Rhodesia (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, is hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the following Article is substituted therefor:—

"4. The *ex officio* Members of the Council shall be the persons for the time being law-

fully discharging the functions of Chief Secretary to the Government, of Attorney General, of Treasurer, of Senior Provincial Commissioner, and of Director of Medical Services."

3. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors in Council may from time to time revoke, add to, alter or amend this Order.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, 1935, and shall be published in the Northern Rhodesia Government Gazette.

And the Right Honourable Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas by Section 32 of the Act it is provided that His Majesty in Council may make Orders for altering, revoking or varying any Order in Council made under the Act, but that any Order made under the said Section should not affect prejudicially any rights or interests acquired or accrued at the date when the Order comes into operation, and should provide for the protection of such rights and interests:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to direct and doth hereby direct as follows:—

1. The Principal Order shall have effect as if:—

(a) in Article 1 the Spanish Zone of Morocco were included amongst the foreign Countries of the Copyright Union named therein;

(b) at the end of the Third Schedule there were inserted the following words and figures:—

Morocco (Spanish Zone), 21st February, 1935, 8th December, 1934;

(c) in Article 3 the words and figures "21st February, 1935," were substituted for the words "date of this Order" in the relation of that Article to any work to which the Act is applied by virtue of this Order.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect prejudicially any rights or interests acquired or accrued at the date of this Order by virtue of the Principal Order.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889, 52-3 V. c. 63, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as if it were an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (Rome Convention) (Morocco (Spanish Zone)) Order, 1935.

WHEREAS by an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the Twenty-sixth day of September, 1901, and known as the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1901, certain territories of West Africa by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested were defined and delimited and were named the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast and provision was made for the administration thereof:

And whereas by a further Order of His said late Majesty in Council bearing date the Twenty-second day of October, 1906, known as the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1906, the boundaries of the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast were further defined:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the Fourteenth day of July, 1922, and known as the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1922, the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1901, has been amended:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means, His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in the said Northern Territories:

And whereas it is expedient to make further and other provision in regard to the administration of the Northern Territories:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Northern Territories Order in Council, 1934."

2. The Northern Territories of the Gold Coast shall be the territories which are bounded as follows, namely:—

On the south by Ashanti, on the west and north by the line of the frontier between the British and French possessions, and on the east by the line of the frontier between the British possessions and Togoland under British Mandate.

3. In this Order, unless the subject or context otherwise requires—

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors.

"Secretary of State" means one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

"Treaty" includes any existing or future treaty, convention, agreement, or arrangement, made by or on behalf of His Majesty or any of His predecessors with any civilised power or with any native tribe, people, chief, or king, and any regulation appended to any such treaty, convention, agreement, or arrangement.

"Gazette" means the Gold Coast Government Gazette.

"Governor" includes the officer for the time being administering the Government of the Gold Coast Colony.

"Gold Coast" means the Gold Coast Colony, Ashanti and the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast as though they were a single territory.

4. The Governor of the Gold Coast Colony is hereby authorised, empowered and commanded to exercise on His Majesty's behalf all such powers and jurisdiction as His Majesty at any time before or after the date of this Order, had, or may have within the Northern Territories and to that end may take or cause to be taken all such measures, and may do or cause to be done all such matters and things therein as are lawful, and as in the interest of His Majesty's service he may think expedient, subject to such instructions as he may from time to time receive from His Majesty or through a Secretary of State.

5. The Governor may appoint a Chief Commissioner and all such Judges, Commissioners, Justices of the Peace and other necessary officers as may be lawfully appointed by His Majesty, all of whom unless otherwise provided by law shall hold their offices during His Majesty's pleasure.

6. The Executive Council of the Gold Coast Colony shall be and be deemed to be the Executive Council of the Northern Territories.

7. In the exercise of the powers and authorities hereby conferred upon him, the Governor may, amongst other things, from time to time by Ordinance provide for the administration of justice, the raising of revenue, and generally for the peace, order and good government of the Northern Territories, and of all persons therein, including the prohibition and punishment of acts tending to disturb the public peace.

The Governor, in issuing such Ordinances, shall respect any native laws by which the civil relations of any native chiefs, tribes, or populations under His Majesty's protection are now regulated, except so far as the same may be incompatible with the due exercise of His Majesty's power and jurisdiction, or clearly injurious to the welfare of the said natives.

8. Every Ordinance of the Governor shall be published in the Gazette, and shall, unless otherwise provided in such Ordinance, thereupon come into operation on the date of such publication, and thereafter shall, until disallowed by His Majesty or repealed or modified by any subsequent Ordinance, have effect as if contained in this Order, and the Governor shall take such measures as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Northern Territories.

9. His Majesty may disallow any such Ordinance wholly or in part, and may signify such

disallowance by Order in Council or through a Secretary of State, and upon such disallowance being notified in the Gazette, the provisions so disallowed shall, from and after a date to be mentioned in such notification, cease to have effect, but without prejudice to anything theretofore lawfully done thereunder. Due notification shall be publicly made by the Governor within the Northern Territories of the disallowance of any such Ordinance.

The right is hereby reserved to His Majesty, with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time, to make all such Laws or Ordinances as may appear to Him necessary for the peace, order and good government of the Northern Territories or any part thereof as fully as if this Order had not been made.

10. All Laws, Ordinances, Proclamations, by-laws and regulations of whatsoever nature in force at the date of the commencement of this Order within the Northern Territories, or any of them, shall continue in force until repealed or revoked by or in pursuance of any Law or Ordinance passed by the Governor.

Every suit, action, complaint, matter, or thing which is depending in any Court within the Northern Territories at the commencement of this Order shall and may be proceeded with in such Court in like manner as if this Order had not been passed.

11. The Governor shall use the Public Seal of the Gold Coast Colony for sealing all things whatsoever relating to the Northern Territories that are required to be under the Public Seal.

12. Whenever and so often as the Governor is absent from the seat of Government or is absent in the Gold Coast Colony or Ashanti or on a passage between any places in the Gold Coast or is in any of the territories adjacent to or near the Gold Coast in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties conferred or imposed upon him by His Majesty, he may by an instrument under the Public Seal appoint any person or persons to be his Deputy or Deputies within any part or parts of the Northern Territories during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities by this Order in Council or otherwise vested in the Governor as shall in and by such instrument be specified and limited but no others. Every such Deputy shall conform to and observe all such instructions as the Governor shall from time to time address to him for his guidance. Provided nevertheless that by the appointment of a Deputy or Deputies as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged altered or in any way affected otherwise than His Majesty may at any time hereafter think proper to direct.

13. The Governor may, subject to such instructions as may from time to time be given to him by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, dismiss or suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding any public office within the Northern Territories, or subject as aforesaid may take such other disciplinary action as may seem to him desirable.

14. When any crime or offence has been committed within the Northern Territories, or for

which the offender may be tried therein, the Governor may, as he shall see occasion, in His Majesty's name or on His Majesty's behalf, grant a pardon to any accomplice in such crime or offence who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the principal offender or of any one of such offenders if more than one; and further may grant to any offender convicted of any crime or offence, in any Court or before any Judge, Justice, Magistrate, or other officer within the Northern Territories, a pardon, either free or subject to lawful conditions, or any remission of the sentence passed on such offender, or any respite of the execution of such sentence, for such period as to the Governor may seem fit and may remit any fines, penalties, or forfeitures due or accrued to His Majesty.

15. This Order shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Gazette, and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Northern Territories.

16. The above-recited Orders in Council of the 26th day of September, 1901, the 22nd day of October, 1906, and the 14th day of July, 1922, shall from the commencement of this Order be revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

17. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, His Majesty was pleased to make provision for the administration of Togoland under British Mandate by the Togoland under British Mandate Order in Council, 1923 (hereinafter called the Principal Order):

And whereas Article seven of the Principal Order provided as follows:—

"7.—(1) The jurisdiction of the Chief Commissioner's Court of the Protectorate shall extend throughout the Northern Section; and for the purposes of this provision the term 'Chief Commissioner's Court' shall include the Courts of the Commissioners of the Protectorate.

(2) The Supreme Court of the Colony shall have and exercise throughout the Southern Section the like jurisdiction as it has and exercises in the Colony, and subject to the terms of any Proclamation issued under Article 4 of this Order, as if the said Section formed part of the Eastern Province thereof":

And whereas Article eight of the Principal Order provides as follows:—

"8. In the exercise of the powers and authorities hereby conferred upon him, the Governor shall be governed by the provisions of the Orders in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of September, 1901, and the fourteenth day of July, 1922, and known respectively as the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1901, and the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1922, or of any Order or Orders amending the same, and of any other Order in Council relating to the Protectorate or to the British Sphere, and by any Instructions relating to the Protectorate which he may have received or any other Instructions relating to the Protectorate or the British Sphere which he may receive from time to time from His Majesty or through a Secretary of State, and in any Order in Council or Instructions relating to the Protectorate and in force at the date of the commencement of this Order the expression 'Northern Territories of the Gold Coast' or 'Northern Territories' shall be deemed so far as may be necessary or appropriate for the purposes of this Order to include the British Sphere.

Provided, however, that the powers with regard to the dismissal and suspension of officers conferred by the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1922, or any Order amending or substituted for the same shall in the case of an officer serving in the Southern Section be exercised by the Governor, and in the case of an officer serving in the Northern Section by the Governor, or in his absence from such Section and from the Protectorate, by the Chief Commissioner of the Protectorate; and that the powers with regard to the grant of pardon respite and remission conferred by the said Order in Council or any Order amending or substituted for the same shall in the case of a crime or offence committed within the Southern Section, or for which the offender may be tried therein, be exercised by the Governor, and in the case of a crime or offence committed within the Northern Section, or for which the offender may be tried therein, by the Governor, or in his absence from such Section and from the Protectorate by the Chief Commissioner of the Protectorate":

And whereas by Ordinance provision will be made for the discontinuance of the Supreme Court of the Gold Coast Colony and for the establishment of a Court to be known as "The Supreme Court of the Gold Coast" to exercise jurisdiction throughout the Gold Coast, by which term is meant the Gold Coast Colony, Ashanti and the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast as though they were a single territory:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing even date herewith and known as the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1934, the Orders in Council bearing the dates mentioned in Article eight of the Principal Order made by His Majesty relating to the Northern Territories were revoked:

And whereas it is expedient to provide for the further administration of justice in Togoland under British Mandate and for the lawful

execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon the Governor of the Gold Coast Colony by the Principal Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Togoland Under British Mandate Order in Council, 1934".

2. On the date when the Ordinance constituting the Supreme Court of the Gold Coast comes into operation Article seven of the Principal Order shall be revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the following Article shall be substituted therefor:—

"7.—(1) The Supreme Court of the Gold Coast shall have and exercise throughout the Northern Section the like jurisdiction as it has and exercises in the Protectorate, and as if the said Northern Section formed part of the Protectorate; and shall have and exercise throughout the Southern Section, the like jurisdiction as it has and exercises in the Colony and, subject to the terms of any Proclamation issued under Article four of this Order, as if the said Southern Section formed part of the Eastern Province of the Colony.

(2) The jurisdiction of the Chief Commissioner's Court of the Protectorate shall extend throughout the Northern Section."

3. On the date when the Order in Council bearing even date herewith and known as the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1934, comes into operation, Article eight of the Principal Order shall be revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder and the following Article shall be substituted therefor:—

"8. In the exercise of the powers and authorities hereby conferred upon him the Governor shall follow the provisions of the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1934, or of any Order or Orders amending the same, and of any other Order in Council relating to the Protectorate or to Togoland under British Mandate, and of any Instructions relating to the Protectorate which he may have received or any other Instructions relating to the Protectorate or Togoland under British Mandate which he may receive from time to time from His Majesty or through a Secretary of State, and in any Order in Council or Instructions relating to the Protectorate and in force at the date of the commencement of this Order the expression 'Northern Territories of the Gold Coast' or 'Northern Territories' shall be deemed so far as may be necessary or appropriate for the purposes of this Order to include Togoland under British Mandate."

4. All Laws, Ordinances, Proclamations, bye-laws and regulations of whatsoever nature in force in Togoland under British Mandate at the date of the revocation of Article eight of the Principal Order or any of them, shall continue in force until repealed or revoked by or in pursuance of any law or Ordinance passed by the Governor.

Every suit, action, complaint, matter, or thing within Togoland under British Mandate which is depending in the Supreme Court of the Gold Coast Colony at the date of the revocation of Article seven of the Principal Order may be proceeded with in the Supreme Court of the Gold Coast.

5. This Order shall be published in the Gold Coast Government Gazette; and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times as he may think proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Colony, the Protectorate and Togoland under British Mandate.

And the Right Honourable Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The method by which the cheese-milk price for the month as certified above has been computed is as follows:—

(i) The range of price quotations in respect of sales by wholesale of "New Zealand Finest White" cheese and of "Canadian Finest White" cheese, as published by the London Provision Exchange Ltd., for each of the periods ended at 11.30 a.m. on each of the Fridays in the preceding month, has been examined.

(ii) The average of the mean prices for the two kinds of cheese has been ascertained for each of the said periods, exceptional quotations being disregarded. The average of the periodic averages so ascertained has then been calculated to two places of decimals and expressed in pence per pound.

(iii) From the figure thus obtained one penny three farthings has been subtracted and the balance gives the figure certified above.
