At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 21st day of February, 1935.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of February, 1935 (C.W.395/1935), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, and by subsequent Orders in Council, to approve revised conditions of service for Church of England Chaplains of Your Majesty's Navy :

“And whereas we consider that the scale of full pay of Church of England Chaplains should be increased, that their scale of retired pay should be reduced, and that certain other changes should be made in their conditions of service, rates of unemployed pay, half pay and withdrawal gratuities in accordance with the proposals contained in the Schedule annexed hereto :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the pro-

posals contained in the annexed Schedule with effect from the 25th day of December, 1934.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“ SCHEDULE.

“Chaplains (Church of England) entered into the Royal Navy on or after the 25th December, 1934.

“ PART I.—GENERAL CONDITIONS OF SERVICE.

“ 1. *Full Pay*.—The following scales of full pay to be substituted for the current and consolidated scales of full pay laid down in Section II, Part I of the Schedule to Order in Council of the 29th June, 1934, and Section II, Part I of the Schedule to Order in Council of the 9th November, 1934, respectively.

" 2. *Unemployed Pay, Half Pay and Allowances.*—The rules laid down in Clause 2 of the Schedule to Order in Council of the 26th May, 1927, to be applicable for determining the rates of unemployed pay, half pay and allowances, with the modification that to be eligible for unemployed pay, half pay and allowances on the scales applicable to Captains, R.N., a

Chaplain must have attained the age of 50 and 22 years' seniority.

PART II.—RETIREMENT.

" 1. *Retired Pay.*—The following standard scale of retired pay to be substituted for that laid down in Schedule V, Section IX, Part A IV of Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920.

(i) No Chaplain retired voluntarily, or compulsorily for age at the age of 50 or subsequently to be eligible for retired pay on the above scale unless he has completed 20 years' service. Such officers to be eligible for the gratuities laid down in Clause 3.

(ii) Except as modified by (i) above, eligibility for the above age and service scale to be governed by the rules laid down in Clause 1 of the Schedule to Order in Council of the 9th November, 1920.

(iii) The rule laid down in Schedule V, Section IX, Part A IV of Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, under which Officers are allowed to receive retired pay at the half pay rate not to be applicable to Chaplains retiring voluntarily and for age nor to Chaplains otherwise retired who have qualified for half pay on the Active List at the rate for Captains, R.N.

" 2. *Compulsory retirement for age.*—The age limit for compulsory retirement to be 55, but Chaplains may be compulsorily retired at any time after reaching the age of 50, at the discretion of the Admiralty, if their services are no longer required.

" 3. *Withdrawal Gratuities.*—The following scale of withdrawal gratuities to be substituted for the scale laid down in Clause 2 of the Schedule to Order in Council of the 9th November, 1920.

" 4. *Officers invalided.*—Chaplains who are invalided to receive retired pay under existing regulations, subject to the substitution of the revised scale shown in Clause 1 above for the age and service scale laid down in Schedule V, Section IX, Part A IV of Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920.

Invalided chaplains who are qualified for retired pay on the revised age and service

scale under the preceding clause may receive retired pay on the invaliding scale laid down in Clause 3 of the Schedule to Order in Council of the 9th November, 1920, if more advantageous to them.

Chaplains who are invalided for non-attributable causes after less than four years' service to be granted a gratuity not exceeding £100 for each complete year of service as laid down in Order in Council of the 26th June, 1923.

" 5. *Officers retired for Non-service, Incapacity or Misconduct.*—Chaplains so retired to receive retired pay under existing regulations, subject to the substitution of the revised scale shown in Clause 1 above for the age and service scale laid down in Schedule V, Section IX, Part A IV of Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920.

" 6. *Widows' Pensions, etc.*—The rules laid down in Clause 2 of the Schedule to Order in Council of the 26th May, 1927, to be applicable for determining the rates of pension or allowance for which the widows or other dependants of Chaplains may be eligible, with the modification that for his widow to be eligible for widow's pension, etc., on the scale applicable to Captains, a Chaplain must have attained the age of 50 and 22 years' seniority.

PART III.—GENERAL.

" 1. In this Schedule the term 'standard rate' or 'standard scale' shall have the same meaning as in Order in Council of the 16th December, 1925, and shall include any rate or scale described as a 'standard rate' or 'standard scale' in any subsequent Order in Council, and the term 'current rate' shall denote the corresponding rate of full pay, applicable with effect from the 1st July, 1934, as laid down in Order in Council of the 29th June, 1934. Similarly the term 'consolidated rate' shall have the same meaning as in Order in Council of the 9th November, 1934, and the

consolidated rates of full pay shown in Part I of this Schedule shall be subject to the provisions of that Order in Council.

"2. *Application of the new conditions to Officers entered on or before the 25th December, 1934.*—Chaplains already serving on the 25th December, 1934, to be given the option of remaining under the conditions of service then existing or of accepting the conditions of service laid down in Parts I and II of this Schedule, subject to the following provisions:—

(i) Chaplains who entered the Service before the 1st January, 1927, to remain eligible for allowances on the Captain's scale on attainment of 15 years' seniority as prescribed in existing regulations.

(ii) Chaplains retired compulsorily for age at the age of 50 or subsequently to be eligible for retired pay on the scale laid down in Clause 1 of Part II of this Schedule, subject to the provisions of Clause 1 of the Schedule to Order in Council of the 9th November, 1920, notwithstanding that they may not have completed 20 years' service."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by section one of the Anthrax Prevention Act, 1919 (9 & 10 Geo. 5. c. 23), that His Majesty may by Order in Council make provision for preventing the importation into the United Kingdom, either absolutely or except at specified ports and subject to any specified conditions as to disinfection and otherwise, of goods infected or likely to be infected with Anthrax:

And whereas it is further provided by the said section that an Order under that section may contain a declaration that goods of any specified class which are of any specified origin, or are exported from or through any specified country or place are goods likely to be infected with Anthrax, and that any such declaration shall be conclusive for all purposes:

And whereas it is further provided by the said section that an Order in Council under that Act may apply as respects any goods specified in the Order any of the provisions (including penal provisions) of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876 (39-40 Vict. c. 36), or any Act amending or extending that Act, with respect to goods whereof the importation is prohibited under those Acts with such modifications as appear necessary or expedient:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the goods hereinafter described are goods likely to be infected with Anthrax:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the said recited Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, to declare, and it is hereby declared:—

That goat hair as hereinafter defined, and all goods mixed therewith, and tops and yarn (including sliver and rovings and other intermediate products) made wholly or partly of such goat hair as aforesaid, are goods likely to be infected with anthrax.

And His Majesty is further pleased, by and with the advice aforesaid and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, to order, and it is hereby ordered:—

1. The importation into Great Britain of such goat hair as aforesaid and all goods mixed therewith is hereby prohibited, except subject to the conditions hereinafter specified.

2. The conditions under which such goat hair and goods mixed therewith may be imported are the conditions following, that is to say:—

(a) Such hair or goods imported merely for re-exportation by way of transshipment, or in the same ship, to a destination outside the United Kingdom shall be so re-exported;

(b) In other cases:—

(i) The Importer of any such hair or goods mixed therewith at the time of making entry under the Customs Acts of such hair or goods shall state in writing the country of origin and the true trade description of such goods.

(ii) All packages containing such hair or goods shall when landed be placed together and shall not be mixed with any other goods and shall if imported at the Port of Liverpool be delivered to the Director of the Government Wool Disinfecting Station (Home Office) at Liverpool or any agent of His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Home Affairs duly appointed to receive and to remove them to such Station, or if imported at any other Port shall as soon as practicable be removed and delivered to the Director of such Station and the Importer shall if so demanded by the proper Officer of Customs and Excise give such security by bond or otherwise for the due removal thereof to the Station as he may require. Provided that any such packages which have prior to importation been sold for re-exportation to a destination outside the United Kingdom and in respect of which notice and evidence to that effect has been given to the Director by the Importer not later than the date of making the Customs entry may be re-exported without removal to the Disinfecting Station if arrangements are made to the satisfaction of the Director for their re-exportation to such a destination within a reasonable period after the date of the entry and for their disposition pending such re-exportation.

(iii) Such hair or goods which have been delivered to the said Station shall not be removed therefrom until the Director of such Station has issued a certificate that such hair or goods have been disinfected; and if such hair or goods are not removed by the Importer from such Station within 48 hours of the issue and delivery to him of

such certificate they shall be removed and warehoused at the expense of the Importer as the said Secretary of State or his duly appointed agent shall from time to time direct. For the purposes of this condition such certificate if not delivered by hand shall be deemed to be delivered when the same is sent by post addressed to the Importer at his last known place of address in Great Britain.

(iv) The Importer shall pay the necessary expenses in respect of any such removal to and from the said Station and of disinfecting the goods and of any such warehousing after disinfection.

(v) If such hair or goods are lost destroyed or damaged whether by fire or any other means whatsoever and whether whilst being removed either to or from the said Station or at the said Station or being warehoused as aforesaid no claim for compensation shall be brought against His Majesty or any Officer or Servant of His Majesty or against the said Secretary of State or any of his agents in respect of any such hair or goods so lost destroyed or damaged as aforesaid.

If any of the foregoing conditions is not complied with in respect of any such hair or goods imported, Section 42 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, shall apply to such hair or goods as if they were goods enumerated and described in the Table of Prohibitions and Restrictions Inwards contained in that section and as if the importation of such hair or goods had been prohibited and the provisions of that Act with respect to goods whereof the importation is prohibited under that Act shall apply to such hair or goods accordingly.

3. The importation into Great Britain of tops and yarn (including sliver and rovings and other intermediate products) made wholly or partly of such goat hair as aforesaid, otherwise than merely for re-exportation by way of transshipment, or in the same ship, to a destination outside the United Kingdom, is hereby prohibited and the provisions of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, with respect to goods whereof the importation is prohibited under that Act are hereby applied to such tops and yarn as if such goods were enumerated and described in the Table of Prohibitions and Restrictions Inwards contained in Section 42 of that Act.

4. For the purposes of this Order "goat hair" means all goat hair other than hair excepted as hereinafter specified from the operation of this Order, and includes goat wool and noils, and other by-products in the production of tops and yarns made wholly or partly of such goat hair as aforesaid.

5. The provisions of this Order shall not apply to—

(a) China cashmere

(i) if shipped from a Port in China to Great Britain, provided that it is shipped direct or, if transhipped at an intermediate Port, that it is shipped on a through Bill of Lading and the through Bill of Lading is produced to the proper Officer of Customs and Excise;

(ii) if shipped to Great Britain from a Port other than a Chinese Port, provided that evidence is produced to the satisfaction of the Director of the Government

Wool Disinfecting Station or other person authorised by the Secretary of State for the purpose that the material was in fact produced in and shipped from China.

This exception shall only apply if the China cashmere is imported in unbroken bales as originally shipped from China.

(b) Drawn China goat hair which has been drawn for brush making or similar purposes, provided that evidence is produced to the satisfaction of the Director of the Government Wool Disinfecting Station or other person authorised by the Secretary of State for the purpose that the goat hair has been drawn in China and that it has undergone there a process of disinfection such as would be required for tail or mane horsehair from China in pursuance of the Regulations made by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Home Affairs on the 20th December, 1907, under Section 79 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

(c) Mohair (other than Van mohair)

(i) if shipped from the country of origin to Great Britain, provided that it is shipped direct or if transhipped at an intermediate Port, that it is shipped on a through Bill of Lading and the through Bill of Lading is produced to the proper Officer of Customs and Excise;

(ii) if shipped to Great Britain from a Port other than a Port in the country of origin, provided that evidence is produced to the satisfaction of the Director of the Government Wool Disinfecting Station or other person authorised by the Secretary of State for the purpose as to the origin of the material.

This exception shall only apply if the mohair is imported in unbroken bales as originally shipped from the country of origin.

6. The Order in Council of 9th March, 1921, regulating the importation of goat hair from India and of wool and animal hair from Egypt is hereby revoked in so far as it applies to the importation of goat hair into Great Britain.

7. This Order shall take effect as from the 22nd day of April, 1935.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, Clause 12 of the General Regulations respecting appointment to His Majesty's Civil Establishments, made under the Order in Council of the 22nd July, 1920, and published in the London Gazette of the 6th April, 1923, has been amended to read as follows, viz.:—

12. Every candidate shall satisfy the Commissioners that he or she is a natural-born

British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject. Provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates who are serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of persons who, being British subjects, and having served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, either (a) are serving and have served for not less than six months in unestablished uncertificated employment which in normal course, by departmental custom or by the grant of establishment to an unestablished class, confers a claim to nomination singly or by limited competition for established and certificated appointment and are nominated for that established and certificated appointment, or (b) are serving and have served in unestablished uncertificated employment for at least ten years.

(c) In the case of persons serving in unestablished uncertificated employment which in normal course, by departmental custom or by the grant of establishment to an unestablished class, confers a claim to nomination singly or by limited competition for established and certificated appointment, who are nominated for that established and certificated appointment, and (a) who satisfy the rule in respect of nationality for established appointment which was in force when their unestablished service began or (b) who being natural-born British subjects have served in unestablished uncertificated employment for at least ten years.

(d) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(e) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

(f) In respect of appointment to the Royal Mint and its Branches overseas, in the case of persons who have acquired British nationality by any annexation of territory to the Crown, and in the case of the children of such persons who are themselves of British nationality.

If the Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject, but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible, provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

A candidate will not be eligible for assignment or appointment to the Foreign Office or services under the control of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs unless he is a

natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within those Territories, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs of this regulation, he may be admitted to appointment or competition by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

NOTTINGHAMSHIRE AND DERBYSHIRE JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.

79,513.

(25th February, 1935.)

Whereas by the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1930, the Minister of Health made provision until the 31st day of March, 1935, for the combination of the administrative counties of Nottingham and Derby and the county boroughs of Nottingham and Derby, for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casual poor persons by a Joint Committee named the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid should, subject as hereinafter provided, be continued:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order.

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1935, shall come into operation on the 31st day of March, 1935, and shall remain in force until the 31st day of March, 1940.

Interpretation.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them—

“the combined areas” means the counties and county boroughs for the continued combination of which for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals provision is made by this Order;

“the Joint Committee” means the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Joint Vagrancy Committee constituted under the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1930;

“council” means the council of a county or county borough included within the combined areas, and “councils” means the councils of all the counties and county boroughs so included;

“casual” means any destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief, and includes any person admitted into any establishment by a council or otherwise

under the care of a council by way of poor relief who was, immediately before the date when he was so admitted or came under such care, a destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief;

“casual ward” means any ward, building or premises set apart or provided for the reception, relief or employment of casuals; and

“the Minister” means the Minister of Health.

Revocation of Previous Order.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1930, is hereby revoked, but without prejudice to any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred under that Order.

Combination of Counties and County Boroughs.

4. The counties of Nottingham and Derby and the county boroughs of Nottingham and Derby shall continue to be combined for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals.

Joint Committee.

5.—(1) For the execution of the purposes aforesaid, the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Joint Vagrancy Committee shall continue in existence as a body corporate having for the purposes of their constitution perpetual succession and a common seal.

(2) The Joint Committee shall consist of 20 members, each of whom shall be a member of the council by whom he is elected.

(3) Six members of the Joint Committee shall be elected by the council of the county of Nottingham, eight by the council of the county of Derby, four by the council of the county borough of Nottingham, and two by the council of the county borough of Derby.

Election of Members.

6.—(1) At the first meeting of the council held after the first day of February in each year each of the councils shall elect from their own body the number of members of the Joint Committee assigned to them by this Order.

(2) Every member of the Joint Committee shall come into office upon the first day of April following his election, unless he is elected to fill a casual vacancy, in which event he shall come into office upon his election.

(3) The clerk of each council shall forthwith after any election notify in writing to the clerk of the Joint Committee the name, address and description of each of the persons elected.

(4) A council may nominate from their own body a person to act on behalf of a member of the Joint Committee elected by the council at any meeting of the Joint Committee at which that member shall be unable to be present.

Period of Office.

7.—(1) Except as in this Article otherwise provided, a member of the Joint Committee shall hold office until the date on which his successor comes into office.

(2) A member of the Joint Committee who ceases to be a member of the council by whom he was elected shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Joint Committee:

Provided that a member of the Joint Committee shall not be deemed to have ceased to be a member of the council by whom he was elected if on or before the day on which he goes out of office he has been re-elected a member of the council.

(3) A member of the Joint Committee may resign his membership by sending to the clerk of the Joint Committee notice in writing of his desire to do so, whereupon a casual vacancy shall be deemed to have arisen, and the clerk of the Joint Committee shall forthwith notify the clerk of the council by whom the member was appointed of the vacancy.

(4) Any casual vacancy in the membership of the Joint Committee shall be filled as soon as practicable by the election by the council in whose representation the vacancy arises of a new member, and the person so elected shall hold office during the remainder of the term of office of the person in whose place he is elected.

Meetings and Proceedings.

8. The meetings and proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be conducted in accordance with the rules set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

Powers and Duties of Joint Committee.

9.—(1) It shall be the duty of the Joint Committee from time to time to take into consideration and furnish the Minister with their recommendations in regard to the following matters:—

(a) the number and situation of the casual wards which should be provided by any council;

(b) the number of casuall for whom accommodation should be provided at any existing casual ward and at any casual ward proposed to be established in the combined areas;

(c) the closing of any casual ward in the combined areas:

Provided that before making any such recommendation the Joint Committee shall notify the councils concerned of their proposals relating thereto and shall give a reasonable opportunity to every such council to make representation to the Joint Committee regarding the proposals.

(2) It shall also be the duty of the Joint Committee to take such steps, whether by public notice or otherwise, as shall be necessary with a view to the repression of begging and sleeping-out in the combined areas.

(3) The Joint Committee shall have power to repay to any council the whole or any part of any expenditure incurred by the council in—

(a) the provision of accommodation for casuall in accordance with any requirement of the Minister (including any necessary acquisition of sites);

(b) the maintenance of casual wards;

(c) the reception and relief of casuall;

(d) the transfer to an appropriate institution of any casual;

(e) the maintenance and care in such an institution of any casual so transferred;

(f) the burial of any casual;

(g) the maintenance, care and education of any casual, being a child in respect of whom the council have exercised the powers vested in them under Section 52 of the Poor Law Act, 1930;

(h) the removal of any casual to his place of settlement;

(i) the provision and supply of mid-day meals for casuall:

Provided that before making any repayment of expenditure falling within any of the classes enumerated in sub-paragraphs (a) (b) (c) (e) (g) and (i) of this paragraph, the Joint Committee shall obtain the consent of the councils.

(4) The Joint Committee shall also have power, with the approval of the Minister, to contribute by way of an annual subscription towards the support and maintenance of any institution which appears to the Joint Committee to be calculated to render useful aid in the administration of the relief of casuall.

(5) Nothing in this Order shall affect the powers and duties conferred or imposed on any of the councils in their capacity as a poor law authority, or shall deprive or relieve any of the councils of their powers, duties and obligations with reference to the relief of casuall, except so far as any such powers, duties or obligations are being exercised, undertaken or discharged by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order.

Sealing of Documents.

10. The seal of the Joint Committee shall be affixed in the presence of the chairman and two other members of the Joint Committee and of the clerk of the Joint Committee.

Expenses of Joint Committee.

11. A fund shall be established to be called the joint fund, to which all moneys received by the Joint Committee shall be carried and out of which all expenses incurred by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order shall be defrayed.

Apportionment of Expenses and Contribution Orders.

12.—(1) For the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred by the Joint Committee under this Order each of the councils shall make contributions to the joint fund in the proportion which the aggregate rateable value of all the hereditaments in their area as shown in the valuation lists on the 1st day of April or the 1st day of October, as the case may be, immediately preceding the date of the order made on the council by the Joint Committee for contributions in respect of those expenses bears to the aggregate rateable value of all the hereditaments in the combined areas as then shown in the valuation lists.

(2) For the purpose of obtaining contributions from the councils, the Joint Committee shall as soon as may be after the 31st day of March and the 30th day of September in each year make an order on each council for the payment to the Joint Committee by the council of such amount as may be required for the contributions of the council to the expenses of the Joint Committee either in one sum or by instalments on the dates mentioned in the order, and the council shall make payments to the Joint Committee in accordance with the requirements of the order.

(3) Any sum due under any order of the Joint Committee shall be a debt due from the council to whom the order is addressed and may be recovered accordingly:

Provided that the Joint Committee shall not institute proceedings for the recovery of the debt until the expiration of a period of three months after the date of the order.

Application of Statutes and Orders.

13.—(1) The statutory provisions and the orders and regulations of the Minister and his predecessors for the time being applicable to a council by reason of their being a poor law authority shall, so far as they are consistent with the provisions of this Order, apply to the Joint Committee as if the Joint Committee were a council of a county or county borough exercising poor law functions, and as if the combined areas were the area of such a council.

(2) The accounts of the income and expenditure of the Joint Committee and of their sub-committees and officers shall be made up and audited in like manner and subject to the same provisions as the accounts of a county council, and the enactments relating to the audit of those accounts and to all matters incidental thereto or consequential thereon (including the penal provisions of those enactments) shall apply and have effect as if they were herein re-enacted and in terms made applicable:

Provided that prior to audit a copy of the abstract of accounts shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils.

(3) The said accounts and all minute books of the Joint Committee and their sub-committees shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection and transcription without payment by any member of any of the councils or by any officer of any of the councils authorised by that council for that purpose.

(4) A copy of the auditor's report and of the abstract of the accounts of the Joint Committee, when duly audited, shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils within one month after the completion of the audit of the accounts of the Joint Committee.

(5) Nothing contained in this Article shall be deemed to confer on the Joint Committee any power of raising money by loan for the purposes of this Order.

Reports.

14. The Joint Committee shall furnish to any council such reports, returns and information as that council may from time to time require.

Settlement of Disputes.

15. In the event of any dispute arising in connection with the provisions of this Order between any of the councils and the Joint Committee, or between any two or more councils, the dispute may, on the application of any one or more of the parties affected, be referred to the Minister, who may, at his option, either decide the dispute himself or appoint some other person to decide it, and in the latter event, the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1889, and of any enactment amending that Act shall apply as though the person appointed by the Minister were a single arbitrator appointed by consent of the parties.

Financial Adjustments.

16. In the event of the revocation of this Order, the Joint Committee and the councils

may make agreements for the purpose of adjusting any property, income, debts, liabilities of, and any financial relations between, the parties to the agreement, and section 151 of the Local Government Act, 1933, shall apply as if this Order were an order made under Part VI of that Act.

SCHEDULE.

RULES AS TO MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

1.—(1) The Joint Committee shall in every year hold an annual meeting and at least three other meetings for the transaction of general business which as near as may be shall be held at regular intervals.

(2) The first meeting held after the 31st day of March in any year shall be the annual meeting.

2. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the Joint Committee may make standing orders for the regulation of their proceedings and business and may vary or revoke any such orders.

3. No business shall be transacted at a meeting of the Joint Committee unless at least seven members are present thereat.

4.—(1) The Joint Committee shall at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be chairman, and the chairman shall unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until his successor is appointed.

(2) The Joint Committee may at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be vice-chairman who shall, unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until immediately after the election of the chairman at the next annual meeting.

5.—(1) At a meeting of the Joint Committee the chairman, if present, shall preside.

(2) If the chairman is absent from a meeting of the Joint Committee the vice-chairman, if present, shall preside.

(3) If both the chairman and vice-chairman of the Joint Committee are absent, such member of the Joint Committee as the members present shall choose shall preside.

6.—(1) Every question at a meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting on that question.

(2) In the case of an equality of votes, the person presiding at the meeting shall have a second or a casting vote.

7.—(1) Minutes of the proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be drawn up and entered in a book kept for the purpose, and shall be signed at the same or next ensuing meeting of the Joint Committee by the person presiding thereat, and any minute purporting to be so signed shall be received in evidence without further proof.

(2) Until the contrary is proved, a meeting of the Joint Committee in respect of the proceedings whereof a minute has been so made and signed shall be deemed to have been duly convened and held, and all the members present at the meeting shall be deemed to have been duly qualified.

8. The proceedings of the Joint Committee shall not be invalidated by any vacancy among their number or by any defect in the election or qualification of any member thereof.

9. The Clerk or any authorised officer of a council may attend the meeting of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof and may speak but not vote thereat.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AND DOUBLE DIPPING AREAS

The following Areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising:—

The Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

Inverness.—An Area comprising:—

The Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray; and except the parish of North Uist and all the islands therein, together with the island of Berneray in the parish of Harris and all the grazing islands attached thereto*), in the county of Inverness.

The movement of sheep out of the following areas is regulated by the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934, as amended by the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934 (No. 3), the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1935, and the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1935 (No. 2).

Area No. 1.

So much of the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway line from Kirkby Stephen to Hawes Junction passes over the main Garsdale Road north-east of Garsdale Head, thence in a generally southerly direction along the said railway via Hawes Junction, Dent Station, Ribbleshead Station, Horton Station, Stainforth and Settle to the point where it joins the Branch line from Clapham Station; thence in a north-westerly direction along the latter railway via Giggleswick Station to Clapham Station; thence in a westerly direction along the railway via High Bentham Station to the point near Lower Bentham where the railway is carried over the road from Oxenforth Green to Lower Bentham; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Lower Bentham, Wards End, Four Lane Ends, Sunderland House, and Burton-in-Lonsdale, to the point where the road crosses the county boundary at Stainderber; thence following the county boundary in a north-easterly direction via Ireby Beck, Ireby Fell and Gragareth to the Stone marking the boundary of the counties of Lancaster, Westmorland and the West Riding of Yorkshire at Blea Gills; thence following the county boundary wall via Crag Hill to the point where it joins the wall enclosing the High Short Gill Allotment; thence along the east side of this wall and the wall enclosing the Short Gill Allotment to the point where it joins the Barbon—Dent road; thence in a south-westerly direction along the latter road to the point where it meets the wall separating the counties of Westmorland and the West Riding of Yorkshire; thence in a generally northerly direction along the said wall via Calf Top, Long Bank and Brown Knott to the point where it meets the eastern wall of Holme Fell; thence along the latter wall to the point where it is crossed by the London Midland and Scottish Railway line from Sedbergh to Kirkby Lonsdale; thence north along the said railway to Sedbergh Station; thence in a generally easterly direction along the road via Sedbergh to the point where the road forks at Thorns Hall; thence along the road crossing the River Rawthey to Hall Bank; thence following the River Clough through Garsdale and Garsdale Head to the point of commencement.

Commencing at the point where the London and North Eastern Railway from Barnard Castle to Lartington crosses the River Tees; thence in a general west-south-westerly direction along the railway via Lartington, Bowes and Barras Station to the Kirkby Stephen Station of the London and North Eastern Railway; thence in a south-westerly direction along the road to the Kirkby Stephen Station of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway; thence in a southerly direction along the London, Midland and Scottish Railway to its junction with the London and North Eastern Railway at Hawes Junction; thence in an easterly direction along the London and North Eastern Railway via Hawes, Askrigg, Redmire and Leyburn to the point where the road from Fingall to Hunton is crossed by the railway; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Hunton, Craggs Lane Farm, Scotton, Scotton Hall, Wood House, Richmond, Gilling Grange, Gilling and Moor End Plantation to the point where the road meets the Watling Street; thence in a north-westerly direction along the Watling Street via Ravensworth Lodge and Newsham Grange to Rokeby Park; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of Rokeby Park to the River Tees and thence in a north-westerly direction along the River Tees to the point of commencement.
