The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in Egypt:

And whereas provision is made by the Egypt Order in Council, 1930, S.R. & O. 1930 (No. 744), p. 539 (in this Order referred to as "the Principal Order"), for the exercise of such jurisdiction:

And whereas by the Egypt (Red Sea Light Dues) Order in Council, 1932, S.R. & O. 1932 (No. 864), p. 522, provision was made for the levying of certain light dues on British ships passing through the Suez Canal after or before a voyage through the Red Sea:

And whereas it is now desirable to reduce the Dues prescribed in the Order in Council of 1932 aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, 53 & 54 Vict. c. 37 and 3 & 4 Geo. V. c. 16 or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Egypt (Red Sea Light Dues) Amendment Order in Council, 1935, and shall be read as one with the Egypt (Red Sea Light Dues) Order in Council, 1932, the Principal Order and with any Order amending the latter.

2. Article 2 of the Egypt (Red Sea Light Dues) Order in Council, 1932, is hereby amended by the substitution of the words "one twentieth of one penny" for the words "one sixteenth of one penny".

3.—(1) This Order shall come into force on the fifteenth day of March, 1935.

(2) This Order shall be published in notices exhibited in the London Gazette and in His Majesty's Consulates in Egypt.

(3) Proof shall not in any proceeding or matter be required that the provisions of the preceding paragraph of this article have been complied with nor shall any act or proceeding be invalidated by any failure to comply with these provisions.

The Right Honourable Sir John Simon, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd March, 1935, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th March, 1935, to Saturday, the 30th March, 1935, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for

the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

#### COUNTY OF SALOP.

##### CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926. CORONERS' DISTRICTS.

Whereas it is provided by Section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, that a county council may submit, after complying with such requirements as to notice and consideration of objections as may be prescribed, to the Secretary of State a draft order providing for the division of the county into such coroners' districts as they think expedient, or for such alteration of any existing division of the county into coroners' districts as appears to them to be suitable and that the Secretary of State after taking into consideration any objections to the draft made in the prescribed manner and within the prescribed time, may make the Order either in the terms of the draft submitted to him or with such modifications as he thinks fit:

And whereas by an Order of Her late Majesty in Council dated the 30th day of June, 1845, the county of Salop was divided into coroners' districts:

And whereas by subsequent Orders in Council and divers other means various alterations of the division of the said county into coroners' districts were effected and it is now desirable that an Order should be made defining the coroners' districts of the said county and enumerating the parishes comprised therein:

And whereas the parishes of Bangor, Bettisfield, Bronington, Haighton, Hanmer, Iscoyd, Overton, Penley, Tybroughton, Willington and Worthenbury in the Hundred of Maelor which is a detached part of the county of Flint partly surrounded by the counties of Cheshire, Denbigh and Salop, having the largest common boundary with the said county of Salop, is deemed by virtue of section 40 of the Coroners Act, 1887, to be within the said county of Salop for the purposes of holding coroners' inquests:

And whereas the county council of the said county of Salop have, pursuant to section 12 of the first recited Act, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order with regard to the coroners' districts of the said county of Salop including the aforementioned parishes in the Hundred of Maelor:

And whereas the requirements of the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927,

dated the 28th day of April, 1927, made by the Secretary of State, have been complied with;

Now therefore I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by Section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, do hereby order that the county of Salop including the aforementioned parishes in the Hundred of Maelor shall be divided into coroners' districts, named and constituted as set out in the Schedule hereto.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1935.

**YORKSHIRE CASUAL POOR  
ASSISTANCE AUTHORITY.**

**POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.**

9th March, 1935.

Whereas by the Yorkshire Casual Poor Assistance Authority Orders, 1930 and 1931, the Minister of Health made provision until the 31st day of March, 1935, for the combination of the administrative counties of the East, North, and West Ridings of Yorkshire, and the county boroughs of Barnsley, Bradford, Dewsbury, Doncaster, Halifax, Huddersfield, Kingston upon Hull, Leeds, Middlesbrough, Rotherham, Sheffield, Wakefield, and York, for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casual poor persons by a Joint Committee named the Yorkshire Casual Poor Assistance Authority;

And whereas it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid should, subject as herein-after provided, be continued:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order.

*Short Title.*

1. This Order may be cited as the Yorkshire Casual Poor Assistance Authority Order, 1935, shall come into operation on the 31st day of March, 1935, and shall remain in force until the 1st day of April, 1940.

*Interpretation.*

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have

the respective meanings hereby assigned to them—

“the combined areas” means the counties and county boroughs for the continued combination of which for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals provision is made by this Order;

“the Joint Committee” means the Yorkshire Casual Poor Assistance Authority constituted under the Yorkshire Casual Poor Assistance Authority Orders, 1930 and 1931;

“council” means the council of a county or county borough included within the combined areas, and “councils” means the councils of all the counties and county boroughs so included;

“casual” means any destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief, and includes any person admitted into any establishment by a council or otherwise under the care of a council by way of poor relief who was, immediately before the date when he was so admitted or came under such care, a destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief;

“casual ward” means any ward, building or premises set apart or provided for the reception, relief or employment of casuals; and

“the Minister” means the Minister of Health.

*Revocation of Previous Orders.*

3. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the Yorkshire Casual Poor Assistance Authority Orders, 1930 and 1931, are hereby revoked, but without prejudice to any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred under those Orders.

*Combination of Counties and County Boroughs.*

4. The counties of the East, North, and West Ridings of Yorkshire and the county boroughs of Barnsley, Bradford, Dewsbury, Doncaster, Halifax, Huddersfield, Kingston upon Hull, Leeds, Middlesbrough, Rotherham, Sheffield, Wakefield, and York, shall continue to be combined for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals.

*Joint Committee.*

5.—(1) For the execution of the purposes aforesaid, the Yorkshire Casual Poor Assistance Authority shall continue in existence as a body corporate having for the purposes of their constitution perpetual succession and a common seal and shall have power to hold land for the purposes of their functions without licence in mortmain.

(2) The Joint Committee shall consist of 16 members, each of whom shall be a member of the council by whom he is elected, one member of the Joint Committee being elected by each of the councils.

*Election of Members.*

6.—(1) At the first meeting of the council held after the first day of February in each year each of the councils shall elect from their own body one member to represent them on the Joint Committee.

(2) Every member of the Joint Committee shall come into office upon the first day of April following his election, unless he is



elected to fill a casual vacancy, in which event he shall come into office upon his election.

(3) The clerk of each council shall forthwith after any election notify in writing to the clerk of the Joint Committee the name, address and description of each of the persons elected.

(4) A council may nominate from their own body a person to act on behalf of a member of the Joint Committee elected by the council at any meeting of the Joint Committee at which that member shall be unable to be present.

*Period of Office.*

7.—(1) Except as in this Article otherwise provided, a member of the Joint Committee shall hold office until the date on which his successor comes into office.

(2) A member of the Joint Committee who ceases to be a member of the council by whom he was elected shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Joint Committee:

Provided that a member of the Joint Committee shall not be deemed to have ceased to be a member of the council by whom he was elected if on or before the day on which he goes out of office he has been re-elected a member of the council.

(3) A member of the Joint Committee may resign his membership by sending to the clerk of the Joint Committee notice in writing of his desire to do so, whereupon a casual vacancy shall be deemed to have arisen, and the clerk of the Joint Committee shall forthwith notify the clerk of the council by whom the member was appointed of the vacancy.

(4) Any casual vacancy in the membership of the Joint Committee shall be filled as soon as practicable by the election by the council in whose representation the vacancy arises of a new member, and the person so elected shall hold office during the remainder of the term of office of the person in whose place he is elected.

8.—(1) The meetings and proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be conducted in accordance with the rules set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

(2) The Joint Committee shall prepare and submit to the councils at the end of each year a report of its proceedings during the preceding year, and shall include in such report a record of the attendances of each member at meetings of the Committee and its Sub-Committees.

*Powers and Duties of Joint Committee.*

9.—(1) It shall be the duty of the Joint Committee from time to time to take into consideration and furnish the Minister with their recommendations in regard to the following matters:—

(a) the number and situation of the casual wards and special institutions which should be provided by any council;

(b) the number of casuals for whom accommodation should be provided at any existing casual ward and at any casual ward or special institution proposed to be established in the combined areas;

(c) the closing of any casual ward or special institution in the combined areas.

(2) It shall also be the duty of the Joint Committee to take such steps, whether by public notice or otherwise, as shall be neces-

sary with a view to the repression of begging and sleeping-out in the combined areas.

(3) Subject to the statutory provisions and orders and regulations for the time being in operation, the Joint Committee may make rules in regard to the administration of casual wards and special institutions within the combined areas, and in particular to the following matters, namely—

(i) times and methods of admission;

(ii) searching;

(iii) bathing, night clothing and bedding;

(iv) smoking;

(v) treatment of sick, aged and infirm casuals;

(vi) treatment of female and child casuals;

(vii) treatment and training of casuals in special institutions;

(viii) dietary;

(ix) discharge and detention; and

(x) tasks;

and any rules so made shall, except so far as may be approved by the Joint Committee, be binding on each of the councils:

Provided that before making any such rules the Joint Committee shall notify the councils concerned of their proposals relating thereto and shall give a reasonable opportunity to every such council to make representation to the Joint Committee regarding the proposals.

(4) The Joint Committee shall also have power, with the approval of the Minister, to contribute by way of an annual subscription towards the support and maintenance of any institution which appears to the Joint Committee to be calculated to render useful aid in the administration of the relief of casuals:

Provided that no subscription in excess of £100 shall be made to any association or institution in respect of any one year, unless the Joint Committee have given notice to each of the councils of their intention to make application to the Minister for his approval, and if a majority of the councils object to the proposal the application shall not be made.

(5) Nothing in this Order shall affect the powers and duties conferred or imposed on any of the councils in their capacity as a poor law authority, or shall deprive or relieve any of the councils of their powers, duties and obligations with reference to the relief of casuals, except so far as any such powers, duties or obligations are being exercised, undertaken or discharged by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order.

(6) The Chairman or such other member or members as may be appointed by the Joint Committee for the purpose may at such times as the Joint Committee may decide or approve visit and inspect any of the casual wards under the control and management of any of the councils:

Provided that the Joint Committee or member or members so appointed shall not intervene in any matter which is not within the powers conferred upon them by this Order, but nothing shall prevent the Joint Committee from making representations to or conferring with any of the councils upon any matter relating to a casual ward under the control of such council.

*Expenses of Members.*

10.—(1) The Joint Committee may defray the reasonable expenses incurred in attending

meetings by members of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof and by poor law officers of any of the councils and any other persons who attend meetings at the request of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee for the purpose of assisting them in their deliberations:

Provided that the payment to any person shall not exceed the sum of seven shillings and six pence in respect of each day on which he attends a meeting in addition to the amount of the third class return rate fare for the journey between the nearest railway station available to him at his residence and the place of meeting.

(2) The Joint Committee may confer with other Joint Committees for all or any of the purposes of this order and may pay their reasonable share of the expenses of such conferences and of the attendance of their representatives thereat.

#### *Contracts and Expenditure.*

11. All contracts and agreements relating to the purposes of this order involving an expenditure exceeding £50 shall be made under the authority of a resolution of the Joint Committee, and shall be signed and sealed on their behalf by the chairman or other member of the Joint Committee, and countersigned by the clerk of the Joint Committee, and no other expenditure shall be incurred unless authorized by resolution of the Joint Committee.

#### *Expenses of Joint Committee.*

12. A fund shall be established to be called the joint fund, to which all moneys received by the Joint Committee shall be carried and out of which all expenses incurred by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order shall be defrayed.

13.—(1) The Joint Committee may defray the cost of the construction of new casual wards, the extension or improvement of existing wards, or the conversion of other buildings into casual wards, or the alteration of existing casual wards, by annual payments out of the joint fund to meet charges for interest and repayment of loan or contributions to sinking fund on outstanding debt:

Provided that—

(a) the cost of any alterations to buildings not exceeding £50 shall not be borne by the Joint Committee;

(b) plans and estimates shall be submitted to the Joint Committee for their approval before the execution of the work;

(c) payments made by the Joint Committee shall not exceed a rate of £80 per bed in the case of conversion of other buildings into casual wards, or of new wards, or £50 per bed in the case of alterations of existing wards;

(d) the cost of the purchase of land (or site value) shall not be defrayed by the Joint Committee;

(e) the cost of initial equipment only shall be included as part of the cost of new casual wards.

(2) Councils which have incurred expenditure for which a loan was raised in the provision of casual wards shall, as from the date of this order, receive from the Joint Committee an annual payment which will be sufficient to discharge the outstanding debt together with the interest thereon:

Provided that for the purposes of this paragraph any capital expenditure in excess of £50 which has been incurred by any council since the 1st day of April, 1930, in the provision of new casual wards, the improvement of existing casual wards, or the conversion of any building or buildings into casual wards, shall be treated as if it had been provided for by monies borrowed by way of a loan repayable in 20 years from the date when the expenditure was incurred.

14.—(1) The Joint Committee shall in respect of each accounting period pay to each of the councils a sum (calculated as hereinafter provided) in respect of each casual relieved by the Council during that accounting period.

(2) The sum payable to a council under paragraph (1) of this article shall be determined by the Joint Committee in respect of each accounting period by reference to the average cost throughout the previous accounting period of maintaining a casual for one night in the casual wards of the combined areas, the cost of maintenance for this purpose being taken as including the cost of repairs and management of the casual wards together with all establishment charges but excluding loan charges.

#### *Apportionment of Expenses and Contribution Orders.*

15.—(1) For the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred by the Joint Committee under this Order each of the councils shall make contributions to the joint fund in the proportion which the aggregate rateable value of all the hereditaments in their area as shown in the valuation lists on the 1st day of April immediately preceding the date of the order made on the council by the Joint Committee for contributions in respect of those expenses bears to the aggregate rateable value of all the hereditaments in the combined areas as shown in the valuation lists on the said date.

(2) For the purpose of obtaining contribution from the councils, the Joint Committee shall as soon as may be after the 31st day of March and the 30th day of September in each year make an order on each council for the payment to the Joint Committee by the council of such amount as may be required for the contributions of the council to the expenses of the Joint Committee either in one sum or by instalments on the dates mentioned in the order, and the council shall make payments to the Joint Committee in accordance with the requirements of the order.

(3) Any sum due under any order of the Joint Committee shall be a debt due from the council to whom the order is addressed and may be recovered accordingly:

Provided that the Joint Committee shall not institute proceedings for the recovery of the debt until the expiration of a period of three months after the date of the order.

#### *Application of Statutes and Orders.*

16.—(1) The statutory provisions and the orders and regulations of the Minister and his predecessors for the time being applicable to a council by reason of their being a poor law authority shall, so far as they are consistent with the provisions of this Order, apply to the Joint Committee as if the Joint Committee were a council of a county or county borough exercising poor law functions, and as

if the combined areas were the area of such a council.

(2) The accounts of the income and expenditure of the Joint Committee and of their sub-committees and officers shall be made up and audited in like manner and subject to the same provisions as the accounts of a county council, and the enactments relating to the audit of those accounts and to all matters incidental thereto or consequential thereon (including the penal provisions of those enactments) shall apply and have effect as if they were herein re-enacted and in terms made applicable:

Provided that prior to audit a copy of the abstract of accounts shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils.

(3) The said accounts and all minute books of the Joint Committee and their sub-committees shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection and transcription without payment by any member of any of the councils or by any officer of any of the councils authorised by that council for that purpose.

(4) A copy of the auditor's report and of the abstract of the accounts of the Joint Committee, when duly audited, shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils within one month after the completion of the audit of the accounts of the Joint Committee.

(5) Nothing contained in this Article shall be deemed to confer on the Joint Committee any power of raising money by loan for the purposes of this Order.

#### *Reports.*

17. The Joint Committee shall furnish to any council such reports, returns and information as that council may from time to time require.

#### *Settlement of Disputes.*

18. In the event of any dispute arising in connection with the provisions of this Order between any of the councils and the Joint Committee, or between any two or more councils, the dispute may, on the application of any one or more of the parties affected, be referred to the Minister, who may, at his option, either decide the dispute himself or appoint some other person to decide it, and in the latter event, the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1889, and of any enactment amending that Act shall apply as though the person appointed by the Minister were a single arbitrator appointed by consent of the parties.

#### *Financial Adjustments.*

19. In the event of the revocation of this Order, the Joint Committee and the councils may make agreements for the purpose of adjusting any property, income, debts, liabilities of, and any financial relations between, the parties to the agreement, and section 151 of the Local Government Act, 1933, shall apply as if this Order were an order made under Part VI of that Act.

#### *Power of Minister to vary Order.*

20.—(1) The Minister may at any time by Order provide—

(a) for the exclusion of any of the combined areas from the operation of this Order at the end of the financial period occurring next after the expiration of six months from the date on which the council of such area give notice to the Minister and to the Joint

Committee of their desire to be so excluded; or

(b) for the re-instatement of any area so excluded or the extension of the operation of this Order so as to include any other area adjoining any of the combined areas as from the commencement of the next financial period after the receipt by the Minister of applications from the council of such area and from the Joint Committee for such re-instatement or inclusion.

(2) Any such Order may make such provision as may appear to be necessary or convenient for adapting the provisions of this Order to the alteration so made and to the incidents and consequences thereof and shall have effect as an amendment of this Order.

### SCHEDULE.

#### *Rules as to Meetings and Proceedings.*

1.—(1) The Joint Committee shall in every year hold an annual meeting and at least three other meetings for the transaction of general business which as near as may be shall be held at regular intervals.

(2) The first meeting held after the 31st day of March in any year shall be the annual meeting.

2. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the Joint Committee may make standing orders for the regulation of their proceedings and business and may vary or revoke any such orders.

3. No business shall be transacted at a meeting of the Joint Committee unless at least five members are present thereat.

4.—(1) The Joint Committee shall at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be chairman, and the chairman shall unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until his successor is appointed.

(2) The Joint Committee may at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be vice-chairman who shall, unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until immediately after the election of the chairman at the next annual meeting.

5.—(1) At a meeting of the Joint Committee the chairman, if present, shall preside.

(2) If the chairman is absent from a meeting of the Joint Committee the vice-chairman, if present, shall preside.

(3) If both the chairman and vice-chairman of the Joint Committee are absent, such member of the Joint Committee as the members present shall choose shall preside.

6.—(1) Every question at a meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting on that question.

(2) In the case of an equality of votes, the person presiding at the meeting shall have a second or a casting vote.

7.—(1) Minutes of the proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be drawn up and entered in a book kept for the purpose, and shall be signed at the same or next ensuing meeting of the Joint Committee by the person presiding thereat, and any minute purporting to be so signed shall be received in evidence without further proof.

(2) Until the contrary is proved, a meeting of the Joint Committee in respect of the proceedings whereof a minute has been so made and signed shall be deemed to have been duly convened and held, and all the members present at the meeting shall be deemed to have been duly qualified.

8. The proceedings of the Joint Committee shall not be invalidated by any vacancy among their number or by any defect in the election or qualification of any member thereof.

9. The Clerk or any authorised officer of a council may attend any meeting of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof and may speak but not vote thereat.
