And whereas by the Saint Lucia (Legislative Council—Extension of Duration) Order in Council, 1933, it is provided that notwithstanding anything contained in Clause XLVII of the Saint Lucia (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, the Governor shall not be obliged to dissolve the Legislative Council now existing until the expiration of four years from the date of the return of the first writs at the last preceding general election:

And whereas it is expedient that the duration of the Legislative Council now existing shall be further extended:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers enabling Him in that behalf is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Saint Lucia (Legislative Council—Extension of Duration) Order in Council, 1935.

II. Notwithstanding anything contained in Clause XLVII of the Saint Lucia (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, or in Clause II of the Saint Lucia (Legislative Council—Extension of Duration) Order in Council, 1933, the Governor shall not be obliged to dissolve the Legislative Council now existing until the expiration of five years from the date of the return of the first writs at the last preceding general election.

III. His Majesty hereby reserves to Himself, His Heirs and Successors, full power and authority from time to time to revoke, alter or amend this Order as to Him or Them shall seem fit.

IV. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Saint Lucia Gazette.
