(2) For the purposes of this Section the expression "His Majesty's Dominions" includes any territory in respect of which a mandate under the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty:

And whereas Palestine is a territory in respect of which a mandate under the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 20th December, 1934, it was ordered that Sections 103, 104 and 105 of the said Act shall from the date of the said Order extend to Palestine:

And whereas by an Ordinance promulgated on the 28th day of February, 1935, further to amend the Companies Ordinance, 1929, it was provided that a Company having a share capital and registered in Palestine may, if so authorised by its Articles, cause to be kept in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland a Branch Register of Members resident in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Companies Act, 1929, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Sections 98 and 100 of the Companies Act, 1929, shall subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in the schedule hereto apply to and in relation to any Branch Registers kept in England by companies registered in Palestine as they apply to and in relation to the Registers of companies within the meaning of the Companies Act, 1929.

Section 98.

In subsection (1)

For the words "registered office of the Company" there shall be substituted the words "the place of business established by the Company within Great Britain".

After the words "every officer of the Company" there shall be inserted the words "and every person resident in Great Britain authorised to accept on behalf of the Company service of process and any notices required to be served on the Company".

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Holton (Saint Peter) and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Blyford, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Holton (Saint Peter) and Blyford duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Holton (Saint Peter) and Blyford and the Parish of the Benefice of Halesworth in the said County of Suffolk and in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alterations of boundaries, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Holton (Saint Peter) and Blyford are now full being held in plurality by the Reverend David Charles Williams under the authority of a Dispensation:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint

Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said David Charles Williams (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Holton (Saint Peter) and the said Benefice of Blyford shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Holton (Saint Peter) with Blyford' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said David Charles Williams if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Holton (Saint Peter) and Blyford shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Holton (Saint Peter) and Blyford shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Holton (Saint Peter) shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patron of the said Benefice of Holton (Saint Peter) shall have the first, the second and the fourth turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Blyford shall have the third turn.

"5. That upon the union taking effect all that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Blyford (containing Blyford Farm) which is situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Holton shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Holton (Saint Peter).

"6. That upon the union taking effect all that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Holton (Saint Peter) which is situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Blyford and lies to the east of Cherrytree Farm shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Blyford.

"7. That with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and as such Bishop Patron of the said

Benefice of Halesworth (testified as aforesaid), and with the consent of the Reverend Henry Christian Newbery being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Halesworth (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect (a) all those two parts of the Parish of the said Benefice of Holton (Saint Peter) which are now comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Halesworth (which said parts are more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and are thereon coloured pink) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Halesworth and (b) all that part of the northern projection of the Parish of the said Benefice of Halesworth lying to the north of the new boundary of the Civil Parish of Halesworth (which said part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured blue) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Holton (Saint Peter).

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme,

and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Cadbury and Stockleigh Pomeroy duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Cadbury and Stockleigh Pomeroy are now full the Reverend Thomas Diggle Chard being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Cadbury and the Reverend Henry Benjamin William Hammond being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stockleigh Pomeroy:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Cadbury and the said Benefice of Stockleigh Pomeroy shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Cadbury with

Stockleigh Pomeroy' but that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report inter alia upon the union of the said three Benefices of Everton, Saint Peter; Everton, Saint Ambrose; and Liverpool, All Saints, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Liverpool and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Liverpool signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices, which said Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Liverpool embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas all of the said three Benefices of Everton, Saint Peter; Everton, Saint Ambrose; and Liverpool, All Saints, are now full the Reverend John Speakman being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Peter; the Reverend Alfred Mortimer Pocock being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Ambrose; and the Reverend Francis Ewart Cooke being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Liverpool, All Saints:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose

to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Peter, the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Ambrose, and the said Benefice of Liverpool, All Saints, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Peter with Saint Ambrose and All Saints.'

"2. That (a) if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme all of the three said Benefices shall be vacant the union of such three Benefices shall forthwith take effect but (b) if upon that day two only of the three said Benefices shall be vacant then pending the union of all of the three said Benefices such two vacant Benefices shall forthwith be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls and the union of all of the three said Benefices shall take effect upon the next vacation thereafter of the third of the three said Benefices, and (c) if upon that day one only of the three said Benefices shall be vacant then, pending the union of all of the three said Benefices, such vacant Benefice and that one of the other two Benefices which shall next fall vacant thereafter shall upon such last named vacation be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls and the union of all of the three said Benefices shall take effect upon the next vacation thereafter of the third of the three said Benefices and (d) if upon that day none of the said three Benefices shall be vacant then the union of such three Benefices shall take effect upon the first vacation of that one of the three said Benefices which shall last be vacated after that day and pending the union of all the three said Benefices as aforesaid so soon as any two of the three said Benefices shall have been vacated after that day such two Benefices shall upon the vacation of the Benefice secondly vacated be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls.

"3. That in the case of any and every union taking effect as aforesaid the Parishes of the Benefices comprised in the union shall be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"4. That in the case of any and every union comprising the said Benefice and Parish of Everton, Saint Peter, the Church of Saint Peter, Everton, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and the Table of Fees for the Parish of such Church shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"5. That in the event of the said Benefices and Parishes of Everton, Saint Ambrose, and Liverpool, All Saints, only being united under the provisions aforesaid then pending the union of all the three said Benefices, the Church of Saint Ambrose, Everton, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and the Table of Fees for the Parish of such Church shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"6. That upon any and every union taking effect as aforesaid the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church or Churches not hereinbefore designated the Parish Church of the United Parish shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"7. That upon any union comprising the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Ambrose, taking effect as aforesaid the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Ambrose, shall, pending the provision of a new Parsonage House, become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice, and in the event of the union of the said two Benefices of Everton, Saint Peter, and Liverpool, all Saints, only taking effect as aforesaid, the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Peter, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice pending the union of all three of the said Benefices.

"8. That so soon as conveniently may be after any union has taken effect as aforesaid any Parsonage House of the Benefices concerned which has not become the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice as provided in Clause 7 of this Scheme and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that so much of the net proceeds of such sale or sales as shall be approved by us and by the Bishop of Liverpool shall be held and applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for and towards the cost of the provision of a new Parsonage House for the United Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Peter with Saint Ambrose and All Saints, and such further part of the said net proceeds as shall be approved by us and by the said Bishop of Liverpool may be held and applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for and towards the cost of the provision of a Clergy House for the United Benefice and any residue of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"9. That upon any union comprising the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Peter, taking effect as aforesaid the Curate Fund at present in our hands applicable towards the stipend of a Curate for the said Benefice of Everton, Saint Peter, shall become applicable towards the stipend of a Curate for the United Benefice.

"10. That at any time and from time to time after two only of the said Benefices have become united as aforesaid the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall, pending the union of all three of the said Benefices employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of the clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may

be necessary not exceeding the sum of £245 in any one year.

"11. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Welsh Bicknor, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Goodrich and the Benefice of Marstow (being part of the United Benefice of Marstow with Pencoyd), all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council (hereinafter referred to as the original Order in Council) dated the 28th day of July, 1930, and published in the London Gazette on the following day and made pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, provision was made for the union of the said Benefices of Goodrich and Marstow under the style of 'The United Benefice of Goodrich with Marstow' and by the terms of such Order the union of the said two Benefices of Goodrich and Marstow will become effective upon the vacation of the United Benefice of Marstow with Pencoyd by the Reverend William Rowlands now Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas since the publication in the London Gazette of the original Order in Council Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the

said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Welsh Bicknor, Goodrich and Marstow, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Reverend Frederic Hooper Aldrich-Blake of Weston Hall, Ross, in the said County of Hereford:

"And whereas the Advowsons or perpetual rights of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Goodrich and the said United Benefice of Marstow with Pencoyd are vested in the Bishop of Hereford for the time being:

"And whereas the said Frederic Hooper Aldrich-Blake is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Hereford for the time being to the intent that the Patronage of the United Benefice hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted shall be vested wholly in the See of Hereford:

"And whereas the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor, hereinafter recommended and proposed to be united with the said Benefices of Goodrich and Marstow:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Goodrich and the said United Benefice of Marstow with Pencoyd are now full, the Reverend Isaac Henry Lea Bickley being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Goodrich, and the said William Rowlands being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Marstow with Pencoyd as aforesaid and the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor is at present vacant:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices thereby extending the provisions of the original Order in Council by including the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor in the union provided for by such Order and for supplementing or amending the provisions of such Order where necessary in consequence of the

inclusion of the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor as aforesaid which scheme is based upon the terms of the hereinbefore mentioned Report to the said Bishop of Hereford, and provides further for effecting such transfer of patronage as is hereinbefore mentioned:

"And whereas there is in the hands of the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty a Fund which is at present available for and towards the provision of a Parsonage House for the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor:

"Now, therefore, with the consent so far as the transfer of patronage hereinafter recommended is concerned of the said Frederic Hooper Aldrich-Blake (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consent also of the said Isaac Henry Lea Bickley (testified by his signing this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That upon the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor now vested in the said Frederic Hooper Aldrich-Blake as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"2. That if before the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the union of the said Benefices of Goodrich and Marstow shall have taken effect in accordance with the terms of the original Order in Council then upon the said date (a) the United Benefice of Goodrich with Marstow and the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor shall forthwith be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Goodrich with Marstow and Welsh Bicknor' and (b) the Incumbent (if any) at that date of the said United Benefice of Goodrich with Marstow shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of 'Goodrich with Marstow and Welsh Bicknor'; but if at the said date the union of the said Benefices of Goodrich and Marstow shall not have taken effect as provided in the original Order in Council, then (1) the said Benefices of Goodrich and Welsh Bicknor shall forthwith be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Goodrich with Welsh Bicknor'; (2) the Incumbent (if any) at that date of the said Benefice of Goodrich shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Goodrich with Welsh Bicknor; and (3) the United Benefice of Goodrich with Welsh Bicknor so formed, and the said Benefice of Marstow shall immediately upon the next avoidance after the said date of the said United Benefice of Marstow with

Pencoyd be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Goodrich with Marstow and Welsh Bicknor' and the Incumbent (if any) of the United Benefice of Goodrich with Welsh Bicknor shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Goodrich with Marstow and Welsh Bicknor.

"3. That upon any of the unions hereinbefore referred to taking effect the Parishes of the Benefices affected shall continue distinct in all respects.

"4. That upon any union affecting the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor taking effect the Fund at present held by the said Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty as aforesaid for and toward the provision of a Parsonage House for the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Welsh Bicknor and shall be held by the said Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty as to one moiety thereof for the augmentation of the Benefice of Dixton and as to the other moiety thereof for the augmentation of the Benefice of Hereford, Saint Martin, both in the said Diocese of Hereford.

"5. That upon the union of all of the said Benefices of Goodrich, Marstow and Welsh Bicknor taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice, namely the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge and other endowments except the glebe of the United Benefice shall be charged with a sum of £250 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate as aforesaid which said fund of £250 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purpose aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £250 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate.

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for regulating the incomes of the Dean and the Canons of the Cathedral Church of Chichester:

“Whereas by Section 66 of the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, as amended by Section 20 of the said Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, it is provided that by a Scheme of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, ratified by Order of Your Majesty in Council in the manner in the said Acts contemplated, such annual sums may be determined on to be paid and shall accordingly be paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as after due enquiry and a calculation of the average annual revenues of the said Dean and Canons shall give to the Dean of the said Cathedral Church an average annual income of One thousand pounds and to the respective Canons of the said Cathedral Church an average annual income of Five hundred pounds and that it shall be lawful by such Scheme and Order in Council to carry such purpose into effect by any mode of payment, contribution, augmentation or endowment which may be deemed fit:

“And whereas it has been made to appear to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the share of the annual income derived from the Estates now vested in the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church and applicable to the payment of the incomes of the Dean and the four Canons thereof has not in fact been sufficient to provide such average

annual incomes and that in particular during the period of 4½ years ended on the 29th day of September, 1934, the total sum by which the share of the income of the Dean and Chapter derived from the Estates hereinbefore referred to and applicable to the payment of the incomes of the Dean and the Canons of the said Cathedral Church has fallen short of the total amount which would have been required to provide the said average annual incomes for the said Dean and the Canons during the whole of such period by the sum of £2,182 15s. 3d.:

"And whereas it is intended in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by the Cathedrals Measure, 1931, Section 20, to make to the said Dean and Chapter of Chichester out of our Common Fund such annual grant or grants to be applicable towards the payment of the incomes of the said Dean and Canons respectively as will be sufficient, together with the share of the income derived from the said estates hereinbefore referred to (or any annual income for which the same may be exchanged under the provisions of the said Cathedrals Measure, 1931) applicable to the incomes of the said Dean and Canons, to the said Dean and Canons, to provide in future years so long as such grant may be continued an average income of not less than One thousand pounds for the Dean and Five hundred pounds for each Canon of the said Cathedral Church:

"And whereas we have satisfied ourselves after due enquiry and consideration that the arrangement hereinafter recommended and proposed should be adopted by us in respect of the deficiency hereinbefore referred to in the incomes of the said Dean and the said Canons respectively during the said period of 4½ years ended on the 29th day of September, 1934:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Chichester in their corporate capacity (testified by their Common or Capitular Seal being affixed to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that immediately after the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be duly published in the London Gazette, there shall be paid by us to the said Dean and Chapter a sum of £2,182 15s. 3d., which sum of £2,182 15s. 3d. shall be treated as income due to the said Dean and Chapter and applicable to the incomes of the said Dean and Canons prior to the 29th day of September, 1934, and the receipt or receipts of the said Dean and Chapter under their Common or Capitular Seal or of their treasurer for the time being shall be a good and valid discharge to us for all and every sum or sums of money which shall therein be expressed to have been paid to them or him by us under the authority of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matter aforesaid in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate within the Parish of Weaverham, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Weaverham, of the Parish of Whitegate and of the Parish of Delamere, both in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Weaverham, of the said Parish of Whitegate, and of the said Parish of Delamere, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Sandiway, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of Chester, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said

Parish of Weaverham, with the consent of the Right Honourable Thomas, Baron Delamere, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Whitegate, and with the consent of the Right Honourable James Ramsay MacDonald, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the Patron of the Rectory of the said Parish of Delamere (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Weaverham, of the said Parish of Whitegate, and of the said Parish of Delamere, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Sandiway, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Sandiway'.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Sandiway, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Weaverham, of the Parish of Whitegate, and of the Parish of Delamere, all in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester, which taken together are bounded upon all sides by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of Small Brook where the boundaries of the said Parish of Weaverham, of the said Parish of Delamere, and of the New Parish of Christ Church, Crowton, in the said County and Diocese, all meet, and extending thence first south-eastward and then in various directions along the boundary which divides the said Parish of Delamere from the said Parish of Weaverham for a distance of 1 mile and 36 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the road from Warrington to Tarporley, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last mentioned Road for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Common Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Common Lane (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Delamere from the said Parish of Whitegate) for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary of the Northwich Parliamentary County Division, and extending thence first eastward and then in various directions along the said Parliamentary County Division Boundary for a distance of 1 mile and 3 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the fence forming the western boundary of Pettypool Wood, and extending thence first northward and then eastward along the said fence for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the western boundary of Pettypool Park, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Watling Street

upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Whitegate from the said Parish of Weaverham and extending thence first north-eastward and then north-westward along the said boundary for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of Watling Street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Watling Street (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Weaverham from the said Parish of Whitegate) for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Weaverham from the New Parish of Saint John, Hartford, in the said County and Diocese, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of 30 chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary diverges north-eastward to the south of Hodge Lane, and extending thence first north-westward to and then first south-westward, then north-westward and then again south-westward along the middle of Hodge Lane for a distance of 1 mile and 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Millington Lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of Millington Lane for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the said road leading from Warrington to Tarporley, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to Cuddington, and extending thence westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of $43\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Barrastitch Lane and Cuddington Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Cuddington Lane for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading past the southern side of the park attached to Delamere House towards Norley, and extending thence first north-westward and then westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Weaverham from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Crowton, and extending thence south-westward along such boundary (thereby following for the most part the middle of Small Brook) for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of Small Brook where the boundaries of the said Parish of Weaverham, of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Crowton, and of the said Parish of Delamere all meet, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of January, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Thornton le Moor, and the Benefice of North Owersby (being part of the United Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby) both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Thornton le Moor and a part of the said United Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby, namely the said Benefice of North Owersby, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lincoln and therein recommended the union of the said Benefice of Thornton le Moor and the said Benefice of North Owersby and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lincoln signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union which said Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Lincoln embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Thornton le Moor is now full the Reverend George Percival Morris being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said United Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby was constituted under the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 14th February, 1921, and published in the London Gazette on the 25th day of the same month, whereby the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Owersby with Kirkby cum Osgodby and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Kingerby were united:

"And whereas the patronage of the said United Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby now belongs as to one alternate turn of presentation or nomination to Walter Boynton, Esquire, and Annie Maria Boynton, wife of the said Walter Boynton, both of The Lodge, Trimley, Ipswich, in the County of Suffolk:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said George Percival Morris (testified by his signing this

Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of North Owersby (the area of which is conterminous with the area of the Civil Parish of North Owersby) shall be severed from the said United Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby and the Benefice of North Owersby so severed and the said Benefice of Thornton le Moor shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of North Owersby with Thornton le Moor' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Caistor and the Archdeaconry of Lindsey but the Parish of the said Benefice of North Owersby and the Parish of the said Benefice of Thornton le Moor shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the severance of the said Benefice of North Owersby from the said United Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby as hereinbefore recommended and proposed the name or designation of the remaining part of the said United Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby shall be 'The United Benefice of Kingerby with Kirkby' but no alteration shall be made in the patronage thereof by reason of such severance.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and (a) the said George Percival Morris if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Thornton le Moor shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of North Owersby with Thornton le Moor and (b) the Incumbent (if any) at that day of the said United Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby shall become and be Incumbent of the United Benefice of Kingerby with Kirkby referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme without the necessity of any further presentation or admission thereto.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the house situate at North Owersby and now being part of the endowments of the said United Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of North Owersby with Thornton le Moor.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect (a) the whole of the endowments including the Parsonage House, at present belonging to the said Benefice of Thornton le Moor shall belong to the United Benefice of North Owersby with Thornton le Moor (b) so much of the glebe at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby as is situate within the area of the Civil Parish of North Owersby shall also belong to the United Benefice of North Owersby with Thornton le Moor, and (c) the net income arising from all the Owersby tithe rentcharges vested in the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty and now attached to the said United Benefice of Owersby with Kingerby and from the proceeds of the redemption of any such tithe rentcharges and from the securities representing the accumulations of sinking fund payments in respect of the same tithe rentcharges upon the extinguishment thereof in accordance with the provisions of the Tithe Act, 1925, shall be appropriated and distributed by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty as to

one moiety of such net income in payment to the Incumbent of the United Benefice of North Owersby with Thornton le Moor, and as to the other moiety of the said net income in payment to the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Kingerby with Kirkby and the net income arising from any such tithe rentcharge so vested in the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty shall be the balance payable to the Incumbent under the provisions of Section 5 of the Tithe Act, 1925, after the transfer payment and deductions made in accordance with the same Section from the gross amount actually collected from time to time.

"6. That after the said Union has taken effect the right of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice of North Owersby with Thornton le Moor from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be exercised as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice after the union the said Walter Boynton and Annie Maria Boynton shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Thornton le Moor shall have the second and the third turns.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Lincoln has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for

the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

STATUTE TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES IN RELATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE, MADE UNDER "THE UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923" (13 & 14 GEORGE V., CHAPTER 33), WHICH AMENDING STATUTE IS NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING IN COUNCIL.

We, The Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE D.

CHAPTER XIV.

ELECTIONS TO PROFESSORSHIPS.

By inserting the words "and except so far as is otherwise provided in this Statute with respect to the Jacksonian Professorship of Natural Philosophy" after the word "Crown" in Section 1, and by adding the following section:—

18. The Board of Electors to the Jacksonian Professorship of Natural Philosophy shall be the Council, but an election to the Professorship by the Council shall not be valid unless the General Board shall have concurred therein.

A STATUTE to amend Statute II made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5, ch. 33), for the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College in the University of Oxford, duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting specially summoned for this purpose and holden on Friday, February 22nd, 1935, and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and ordered for sealing after the consent of the University had been given on the nineteenth day of March, 1935 (*Oxford University Gazette*, LXV, No. 2092, page 476), and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

Whereas it is expedient to amend Statute II of the College Statutes in order to enable the Master and Fellows, having regard to economic conditions, to increase the emoluments of the Mastership and to provide if necessary for their modification within reasonable limits:

Now, therefore, we, the Master and Fellows of the said College, in virtue of all and every the powers enabling us contained in Statute XIII. 1 of our Statutes and Section 7 (2) of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5, ch. 33), do alter and amend the Statutes of the College in so far as they relate to the emoluments of the Mastership by the following omissions and alterations:

In Statute II, clause 4, line 1, we strike out the words "a fixed" and we substitute the word "such".

In Statute II, clause 4, line 2, we strike out the words "£900" after the words "annual stipend of" and we substitute the words "not less than £900 nor more than £1,200 as the Master and Fellows may from time to time allocate".

In Statute II, clause 4, line 9, we strike out the words "an "entertainment allowance"" after the words "only as" and we substitute the words "a yearly allowance to meet the expenses of entertainment and any other charges incurred by him by reason of his tenure of office".

AMENDMENT OF COLLEGE STATUTE.

We, the Warden and Fellows of Merton College, Oxford, beg respectfully to submit to His Majesty, The King in Council the following amendments to the College Statute IV, Sections 1 and 2, which were passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting at a Stated General Meeting of the College specially summoned for the purpose on Monday, December 10, 1934. Notice of these amendments has been given to the Hebdomadal Council, as required by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.

NEW STATUTE AMENDING STATUTE IV.

Section 1. To be amended and to read as follows:—

"The number of Postmasterships shall not be less than twenty-four or greater than forty-eight, and the number of Open Exhibitions shall not be greater than twenty-four, excluding Postmasterships and Exhibitions which are renewed for a fifth year under section 7 (a) of this Statute."

The words "Not more than nine Postmasterships nor more than six Open Exhibitions shall be filled up in any one year" to be deleted.

Section 2. £7,000 to be substituted for, £5,000.
