PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 22nd day of March, 1935 (N. 716/35), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Orders in Council bearing dates the 29th day of February, 1908, the 30th day of May, 1919, the 17th day of May, 1920, and the 5th day of November, 1926, sanctioned certain changes in the Non-Substantive Gunnery Ratings held by Petty Officers and Seamen of the Royal Navy and by Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Marines, whereby men are at present employed and paid in the Non-Substantive ratings of Gunlayer, First and Second Class, Director Layer, First and Second Class, and Rangetaker, First, Second and Third Class:

“And whereas we are of opinion that only one class of Director Layer and one class of Gunlayer are now required for the efficient performance of the Gunnery duties of Your Majesty's Fleet:

“And whereas we are also of opinion that it is desirable to abolish the rating of Rangetaker, Third Class, and to provide other remuneration for rangetaking duties in Submarines:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals, with effect from the 1st day of April, 1935:—

(1) The non-substantive ratings of Director Layer and Gunlayer to be established, with pay of 1s. a day and 6d. a day, respectively;

(2) Existing holders of the non-substantive ratings of Director Layer, Second Class, and Gunlayer, Second Class, to be assimilated to the new grades as we may direct; men holding the ratings of Director Layer, First Class, and Gunlayer, First Class, to continue to hold those ratings and receive the present rates of pay of 1s. 3d. a day and 1s. a day, respectively, so long as they remain efficient in the non-substantive rating;

(3) The non-substantive rating of Rangetaker, Third Class, to be abolished; ratings performing rangetaking duties in Submarines to be granted an allowance of 2d. a day, to be designated ‘Rangefinding Allowance in Submarines.’

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by paragraph IV, Section IX, Schedule V of Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, scales of retired pay were laid down for certain ranks of Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that the scale should be extended:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Lieutenant-Commanders (Executive) who have passed out of the zone for promotion to Commander and who are at least 35 years of age and under the age of 40 may be permitted to retire voluntarily, at the discretion of the Admiralty, when the state of the list permits, with retired pay at the rate of £240 per annum (standard rate).

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend George, Lord Bishop of Chichester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I the Right Reverend George, Lord Bishop of Chichester, in pursuance of the 26th section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace that there are in the County of Sussex and my Diocese of Chichester the Vicarage of the Parish Church of Billingshurst and the Rectory of the Parish Church of Pulborough the limits and boundaries of the said Parishes respectively being well known and defined.

"That on the western side of the said Parish of Billingshurst and immediately abutting thereon lies a certain contiguous part (hereinafter referred to as 'the contiguous area') of the said Parish of Pulborough.

"That the boundaries of the said Parishes of Billingshurst and Pulborough are delineated on the plan annexed hereto.

"That the contiguous area is coloured brown on the said plan.

"That according to the last Census the population of the said Parish of Billingshurst is One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight persons and the population of the said Parish of Pulborough is Two thousand one hundred and sixty-five persons.

"That the population of the contiguous area is One hundred and seventy persons.

"That the said Parish Church of Billingshurst is conveniently situate for and adapted to the accommodation of the inhabitants of the contiguous area and the most distant portion thereof being one mile more or less from the said Parish Church of Billingshurst.

"That good roads lead from all parts of the contiguous area to the said Parish Church of Billingshurst.

"That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Billingshurst belongs to me in right of the See of Chichester and the Patronage of the said Rectory of the Parish Church of Pulborough belongs to the Right Honourable Charles Henry Baron Leconfield.

"That the present Vicar of Billingshurst is the Reverend James Ernest Gardiner, Clerk in Holy Orders, and the present Rector of Pulborough is the Reverend Ernest Isaac Frost, Clerk in Holy Orders.

"That it appears to me that the contiguous area may under the provisions of the Act of Parliament passed in the session holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 106, be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Pulborough and be annexed to the said Parish of Billingshurst for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Act of Parliament I have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I do submit the same to Your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said Lord Leconfield the patron of the said Rectory of the Parish Church of Pulborough and of the said James Ernest Gardiner and Ernest Isaac Frost as the present Incumbents of Billingshurst and Pulborough respectively to the intent that Your Grace may if after full consideration and enquiry you should be satisfied with the said Scheme certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME"

"That there shall be separated from the said Rectory of the Parish Church of Pulborough and annexed to the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Billingshurst for ecclesiastical purposes all that contiguous part of the said Parish of Pulborough (hereinafter referred to as 'the contiguous area') which is delineated on the plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured brown.

"That the contiguous area shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the

said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Billingshurst and that the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Billingshurst shall have the exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

"That upon the next vacancy taking effect in the said Rectory of the Parish Church of Pulborough after the date hereof there shall be transferred to the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Billingshurst so much of the endowments now belonging to the said Rectory of the Parish Church of Pulborough as shall produce the net annual sum of one hundred pounds the said annual sum to be as from the date of the said vacancy in the said Rectory of the Parish Church of Pulborough due and payable to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Billingshurst.

"That the inhabitants of the contiguous area shall henceforth in common with the Parishioners of the said Parish of Billingshurst be entitled to accommodation in the said Parish Church of Billingshurst and be liable, subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repair of the said Parish Church of Billingshurst and shall cease to be entitled to any accommodation in the said Parish Church of Pulborough and to be liable (subject as aforesaid) to the repair thereof except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew in the said Parish Church of Pulborough who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the inhabitants of the contiguous area shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the said Parish Church of Billingshurst as they might have had in the said Parish Church of Pulborough.

"That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the contiguous area shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Billingshurst.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

"CONSENTS."

"We, George, Lord Bishop of Chichester, in right of the See of Chichester the Patron or person entitled to present or collate to the Vicarage of the Parish Church of Billingshurst and the Right Honourable Charles Henry Baron Leconfield the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory of the Parish Church of Pulborough (if the same or either of them were now vacant) and the Reverend Ernest Isaac Frost the Incumbent of the Benefice of Pulborough and the Reverend James Ernest Gardiner the Incumbent of the Benefice of Billingshurst do hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands this fourth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932. SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATIONS. (William Marwood Waton.)

Whereas in pursuance of the power conferred upon the Secretary of State by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, the authorisations to persons who lawfully keep open shop for the retailing of poisons in accordance with the provisions of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, to be in possession of and supply Raw Opium, Coca leaves and Indian hemp, or to manufacture any extract or tincture of Indian hemp or any preparation to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies or to carry on the business of retailing, dispensing or compounding the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Act applies, were, by Notice dated the 8th March, 1932, and published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 11th March, 1932, withdrawn from William Marwood Waton, Pharmacist, of 17, New Yard, Nottingham, who had been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said William Marwood Waton has applied and the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain has recommended that the said authorisations may now be restored to him:
