## DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1932.

## WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY.

Whereas John Alex. Ross, M.B., Ch.B. (Aberdeen), of 18, Blake Road, Fulham, London, S.W.6, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said John Alex. Ross cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said John Alex. Ross, the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves, Indian hemp, and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said John Alex. Ross to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.

### COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

#### EXPLOSIVES IN COAL MINES.

The Secretary for Mines gives notice that, under Section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, he has made an Order amending the Explosives in Coal Mines Order, 1934, to the extent of providing that, for the purpose of permitting trials or tests with the firing simultaneously of two or more shots in the same place, the Board of Trade may grant exemption from the provisions of Clause 6 (g) of the said Order, subject in each case to the taking of such precautions as the Board may direct.

The new Order is entitled the Explosives in Coal Mines (Simultaneous Shotfiring) Order, 1935, and will remain in force for twelve months from the date thereof, namely, twelve months from 24th April, 1935.
