God Walter Howard Frere, D.D., late Bishop thereof; and His Majesty has been pleased to recommend to the said Sub-Dean and Chapter the Venerable Joseph Wellington Hunkin, O.B.E., M.C., D.D., Archdeacon of Coventry, Rector of Rugby and Chaplain to His Majesty, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Truro.

METROPOLITAN POLICE COURTS (HOLIDAYS) ACT, 1897.

Whereas by section 1 of the Metropolitan Police Courts (Holidays) Act, 1897, the Secretary of State may by Order close the Metropolitan Police Courts on any day appointed under section 4 of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, to be observed as a Bank Holiday:

And whereas Monday, the 6th May, 1935, has under section 4 of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, been duly appointed to be observed as a Bank Holiday, I do hereby order that on that day the Metropolitan Police Courts be closed in accordance with the provisions of the statute first aforementioned.
