(Application for Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the Portsmouth Gas Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") whose address is The Square, Portsmouth, for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934 for all or some of the following among other purposes (that is to say):—

To authorise the Company on the land hereinafter mentioned to erect, maintain, alter, improve, extend and renew gasholders, machinery and apparatus and do all such acts as may be proper for storing gas and for supplying gas.
