A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING A NEW DESIGN FOR A SILVER COIN OF THE REALM.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by Proclamation to determine the design for any coin:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine a new design, hereinafter specified, for the silver Crown, being one of the silver coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, to be struck at Our Mint in London during the year one thousand nine

hundred and thirty-five in commemoration of Our Silver Jubilee:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in Our Proclamation of the third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, the design for the silver Crown to be struck at Our Mint in London during the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five shall be as follows:—For the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription "GEORGIVS V. DG. BRITT: OMN: REX. FD. IND: IMP:": and for the reverse the image of Saint George on horseback, armed and with sword drawn triumphing over the Dragon, together with the word "CROWN" and the date of the year "1935" and upon the edge of the piece in incuse letters the inscription "DECUS ET TUTAMEN. ANNO REGNI XXV".

2. This Proclamation shall come into operation on the fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this fourth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and in the twenty-fifth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 31st day of January, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union (1) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew, with a part of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, and (2) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Northumberland and in the Diocese of Newcastle:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Harold, Bishop of Newcastle, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union (1) of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew, with a part of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, and (2) of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Newcastle and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Newcastle signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefices of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew, and Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, are now full, the Reverend Evan Lewis Owen being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew, and the Reverend George Hinchliffe being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints; and the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, is at present vacant:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Harold, Bishop of Newcastle (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said Evan Lewis Owen and George Hinchliffe (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, and all that part (containing the Parish Church) of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, which lies to the east and south of an imaginary line commencing at the point where the southern

boundary of the Parish of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, crosses the middle of Pilgrim Street and extending thence northward along the middles of Pilgrim Street and Northumberland Street for a distance in all of 16 chains and a half or thereabouts to the junction of Northumberland Street with Saville Row and proceeding thence eastward in a straight line along the middles of Saville Row, Saville Place and Ellison Place for a distance in all of 22 chains and a half or thereabouts to the eastern boundary of the said Parish of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of ‘ The Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints ’ (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints).

“ 2. That the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew, and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of ‘ The Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew ’ (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew).

“ 3. That the Church of the Parish of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the same United Parish.

“ 4. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, shall be vacant, then the said unions shall forthwith take effect, but if upon that day the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, shall be full, then the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter.

“ 5. That upon the unions taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Peter, Newcastle upon Tyne, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Peter, Newcastle upon Tyne, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew, to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

“ 6. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew, and (c) so soon as conveniently may

be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for and towards the cost of the provision of a Church or Churches in or near the City of Newcastle upon Tyne to be selected by the Bishop of Newcastle.

“ 7. That with the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the said Harold, Bishop of Newcastle, being the Patron in right of his See, of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, (Saint Peter, upon the unions taking effect (a) a part of the endowments and property of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, that is to say an annual payment of £262 being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, shall be excepted out of the unions and shall be applied by us for and towards the augmentation of a certain other Benefice in the said Diocese of Newcastle, and two new Districts intended to be constituted within the said Diocese of Newcastle, that is to say as to £80 per annum for and towards the augmentation of the Benefice of Saint Lawrence, Byker, as to £91 per annum for and towards the endowment of a certain new District intended to be formed in or upon the outskirts of the western part of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne and as to £91 per annum for and towards the endowments of a certain other new District intended to be formed in or upon the outskirts of the eastern part of the said City of Newcastle upon Tyne, and (b) all other the endowments and property (excepting the Parsonage House) of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter, shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew.

“ 8. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Peter shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Newcastle under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or in repayment of any

advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations; (2) for and towards the cost of the provision of a Church or Churches in the vicinity of Newcastle upon Tyne and for or towards the augmentation of a Benefice or Benefices situate within the City of Newcastle upon Tyne or for either or both of these purposes as the Bishop of Newcastle shall determine; and any ultimate residue shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Newcastle.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Peter, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Newcastle, and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Peter, Newcastle upon Tyne, or such of them as the Bishop of Newcastle shall select, shall be removed to the same Parish Church, and any of such articles not so removed shall be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Newcastle which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Peter, Newcastle upon Tyne, as aforesaid.

(d) That in the event of any Church Officers and Servants of the said Church of Saint Peter, Newcastle upon Tyne, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect, such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this Clause, receive such reasonable compensation as, having regard to age, length of office and other circumstances of the case, shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Newcastle equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

“ 9. That upon the unions taking effect, all real and personal property held or applicable under any special trust or trusts as a repair fund or for any other purpose in relation to the fabric of the said Church of Saint Peter, Newcastle upon Tyne, or the ornaments thereof, shall so far as the instrument or instruments creating such trust or trusts shall not otherwise provide be applied for the like purpose or purposes for the benefit of the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, and the trust fund created for the maintenance and repair of the Plummer Memorial Window in the said Church of Saint Peter, Newcastle upon Tyne, so far as such trust fund shall not be required to meet the expenses in connection with any removal and refixing in another place and for the repair and maintenance of such Memorial Window if so removed and refixed shall also so far as the trusts permit be applied as a Fabric Repair Fund for the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints.

" 10. That after the said unions have taken effect, (a) the patronage of the United Benefice of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, All Saints, shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, All Saints, and (b) the patronage of the United Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew, shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Newcastle upon Tyne, Saint Andrew.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Peter, Newcastle upon Tyne, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Peter, Newcastle upon Tyne, and of the site thereof, together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto, and provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Newcastle has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 22nd day of February, 1934, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Kilburn, Saint Paul, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, and Kilburn, Saint Paul, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report subject to an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul and the Parish of the Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Mary, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the approval of the said Bishop of London embodies certain modifications thereof including the said alteration of boundaries:

" And whereas the said Benefice of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, is now full the Reverend Crowther Smith being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul, is at present vacant:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, and the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Kilburn, Holy Trinity' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice) and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, shall be the Parish Church

of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices of Kilburn, Holy Trinity and Kilburn, Saint Paul, shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul, only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, and the then Incumbent of Kilburn, Saint Paul, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul, and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul, if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, shall have been instituted to Kilburn, Holy Trinity, subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, before that date and shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul, and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Kilburn, Saint Paul, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Kilburn, Saint Paul, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That in the event of the services of any of the Church Officers or Servants of the Church of Kilburn, Saint Paul, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect, such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of Clause 9 of this Scheme receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of office and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of London equitable and proper; provided always that it shall be lawful for us in all

or any of the cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London, established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"6. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"7. That upon the union taking effect the endowments and property of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul, consisting of an annual sum of £366 payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul, together with a capital sum of £1,500 at present held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the purpose of providing a Parsonage House for the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul, shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say, (a) as to an annual sum of £56 as an addition to the endowments of the United Benefice; (b) as to an annual sum of £75 as an addition to the endowments of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Mary; (c) as to a further annual sum of £75 as a fund to be held and administered by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for and towards the cost of clerical or lay assistance for the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Mary; and (d) the balance of the said annual sum of £366 namely an annual sum of £160 shall be held and accumulated by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners together with the said capital sum of £1,500 and the interest thereon for the benefit of the proposed new District referred to in Clause 9 of this Scheme.

"8. That upon the union taking effect a Curate shall be employed to assist the Incumbent in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice and the two Curate Grants of £120 per annum and £60 per annum respectively which are at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in respect of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, shall be combined to provide an annual sum of £180 payable conditionally upon the employment of a Curate within the Parish of the United Benefice at a Stipend of not less than £180 per annum.

"9.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Kilburn, Saint Paul, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as

follows, that is to say, (1) a sufficient sum shall be appropriated for the payment of the compensation or compensations mentioned in Clause 5 of this Scheme or for the repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations as in the same Clause is provided, and (2) the residue of such net proceeds shall be held and accumulated by us as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection of a new Church to be dedicated to Saint Paul for a District to be selected by the Bishop of London as the District for which such Church shall be built.

"(c) That the font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Kilburn, Saint Paul, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Kilburn, Holy Trinity, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of London, and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Kilburn, Saint Paul, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of London for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of London which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Kilburn, Saint Paul.

"11. That with the consent of John Francis William Deacon of Mabledon, Tonbridge, in the County of Kent, Esquire; the Venerable Ernest Newton Sharpe, Archdeacon of London; John Malcolm Falconer, of Apperley Bridge, Bradford, in the County of York, Esquire; and the Reverend Douglas Harry Grose Sargent, of Number 32 Coleherne Road, London, S.W.10, being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Mary (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), and with the consent of the Reverend Frank Mellows now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Mary (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Paul, which lies to the north east of the middle of High Road shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Kilburn, Saint Mary.

Birchington Road and at present used as a Church Hall in connection with the said Church of Kilburn, Saint Paul.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Kilburn, Saint Paul, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the Church of Kilburn, Saint Paul, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by Miss Edith M. Cameron, of 36 West End Lane, London, N.W.6, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 14th day of May, 1934:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be approved:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by Order of the 29th day of March, 1935, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bidford is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Right Reverend Mervyn, Bishop of Coventry, in his private capacity:

"And whereas the said Mervyn, Bishop of Coventry, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of or presentation to the said Benefice of Bidford now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Coventry:
