PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the first day of November, 1928, and entitled *The West African Court of Appeal Order in Council, 1928* (in this Order referred to as the *Principal Order*), a Court, called the *West African Court of Appeal* (in this Order referred to as the *Court of Appeal*), was constituted for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Majesty's Supreme Courts of the Colonies of the Gold Coast, Sierra Leone and the Gambia, and from His Majesty's Chief Commissioner's Court of Ashanti, and from His Majesty's Courts in the territories of West Africa known as the Protectorates of Sierra Leone and the Gambia, and the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, and Togoland under British Mandate:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 20th day of January, 1930, and entitled the *West African Court of Appeal (Amendment) Order in Council, 1930*, the *Principal Order* was amended in certain respects:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 26th day of February, 1934, the *Principal Order* was further amended by making further and better provision than that theretofore in force for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Majesty's

Supreme Court of Nigeria and by making provision for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Majesty's High Court of the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas provision has been made by Ordinance that His Majesty's Supreme Court of the Gold Coast Colony shall cease to exercise jurisdiction and that in place of the said Court there shall be established a Court to be known as the Supreme Court of the Gold Coast to exercise jurisdiction throughout the Gold Coast, by which term is meant the Gold Coast Colony, Ashanti, the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, and Togoland under British Mandate as though they were a single territory and that the said Supreme Court of the Gold Coast shall, in addition to exercising the jurisdiction hitherto conferred on His Majesty's Supreme Court of the Gold Coast Colony, have and exercise part of the jurisdiction hitherto conferred on His Majesty's Chief Commissioner's Court of Ashanti and on His Majesty's Chief Commissioner's Court of the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the hearing of appeals from the said Supreme Court of the Gold Coast and from other Courts of the Gold Coast:

And whereas it is expedient that for this purpose the *Principal Order* should be further amended as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the *British Settlements Act, 1887*, and the *Foreign*

Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council, 1935", and shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Order.

2. The preamble to the Principal Order is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the words—

"His Majesty's Supreme Court of Nigeria and from His Majesty's Supreme Courts of the Colonies of the Gold Coast, Sierra Leone, and the Gambia, and from His Majesty's High Court of the Protectorate of Nigeria and from His Majesty's Chief Commissioner's Court of Ashanti, and from His Majesty's Courts in the territories of West Africa known as the Protectorates of Sierra Leone and the Gambia and the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast and the British Sphere of Togoland"

and by substituting therefor the words—

"His Majesty's Supreme Court of Nigeria and from His Majesty's Supreme Court of the Gold Coast and from other Courts of the Gold Coast, by which term is meant the Gold Coast Colony, Ashanti, the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast and Togoland under British Mandate as though they were a single territory, and from His Majesty's Supreme Courts of the Colonies of Sierra Leone and the Gambia and from His Majesty's High Court of the Protectorate of Nigeria and from His Majesty's Courts in the territories of West Africa known as the Protectorates of Sierra Leone and the Gambia".

3. Article 5 (2) of the Principal Order is hereby amended by inserting after the word "Nigeria" where it first occurs therein the words "and of the Supreme Court of the Gold Coast".

4. This Order shall commence and have effect on such day as may be fixed by notification in the London Gazette by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

And the Right Honourable Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of February, 1934, the Principal Order was amended to make provision for regulating appeals from the West African Court of Appeal to His Majesty in Council in respect of the Colony and Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas it is expedient that the Principal Order should be further amended as hereinafter provided:

It is hereby ordered, by The King's Most Excellent Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers in that behalf in His Majesty vested, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the "West African (Appeal to Privy Council) Further Amendment Order in Council, 1935".

2. The preamble to the Principal Order is hereby amended—

(a) by deleting the words "a further Order in Council bearing even date with this Order" and by substituting therefor the words "the West African Court of Appeal (Amendment) Order in Council, 1930, the West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council, 1934, and the West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council, 1935".

(b) by deleting the words "the Gold Coast", and "the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast and the British Sphere of Togoland" and by adding after the word "Gambia" where it secondly occurs the words "and from the Gold Coast by which term is meant the Gold Coast Colony, Ashanti, the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast and Togoland under British Mandate as though they were a single territory".

3. This Order shall commence and have effect on such day as may be fixed by notification in the London Gazette by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

And the Right Honourable Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 21st day of February, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage)

of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (*inter alia*) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, and Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of London embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip and Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, are now full the Reverend Henry Derwent Hinde being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, and the Reverend Frederick Edward Palmer Langton being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the total revenue of the Benefices hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice which would remain, after making such provision as is hereinafter recommended and proposed for the payment of a Curate or Lay Worker to assist the Incumbent of such United Benefice, would be more than is required to form a competent provision for the United Benefice, and that it is desirable that the surplus revenue should be applied as hereinafter recommended and proposed for the benefit of the Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Mark, Myddelton Square, situate in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London, being a Benefice wherein the provision for the cure of souls is now insufficient:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, and the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer with Saint Philip' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, shall (until

revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, and the then Incumbent of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer shall have been instituted to Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, before that date and shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Philip, Clerkenwell, shall be transferred to the Church of The Holy Redeemer, Clerkenwell, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Philip, Clerkenwell, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the union taking effect a Curate or Lay Worker shall be employed to assist the Incumbent in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice and that a part of the endowment of the United Benefice that is to say an annual sum of £150 being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, shall be appropriated and paid by us to the Incumbent of the United Benefice conditionally upon the employment of such Curate or Lay Worker provided always that any part

of the said annual sum of £150 per annum which may not be expended as aforesaid in any one year shall be held or invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the purpose of augmenting the provision herein recommended and proposed for the payment of a Curate or Lay Worker.

"6. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied first towards the payment of the expenses and compensations referred to in Clause 7 (b) of this Scheme if and in so far as the net proceeds of any sale or sales of the materials and site of the said Church of Saint Philip, Clerkenwell as contemplated by Clause 7 (a) of this Scheme shall be insufficient to meet the cost of such expenses and compensations and subject thereto the net proceeds of the sale of the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the purpose of augmenting the Funds for a Curate or Lay Worker proposed to be created by Clauses 5 and 8 of this Scheme in equal shares up to a maximum of £175 per annum and any ultimate residue of such net proceeds shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in equal shares for the augmentation of the United Benefice and for the augmentation of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Mark, Myddelton Square.

"7.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Philip, Clerkenwell shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations and (2) any residue of such net proceeds shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Philip, Clerkenwell, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of The Holy Redeemer, Clerkenwell, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of London and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Philip, Clerkenwell, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of London for use in any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of London which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Philip, Clerkenwell, as aforesaid.

(d) That in the event of the services of any church officers and servants of the said Church of Saint Philip, Clerkenwell, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect, such church officers and servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners under the provisions of this clause, receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of office and other circumstances of the case, shall seem to us and to the Bishop of London equitable and proper: Provided always that it shall be lawful for us, if we shall see fit so to do, in all or any of these cases, to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

"8. That with the consent of the Reverend Frederick John Dove, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Mark, Myddelton Square, and as such Incumbent Patron of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect a portion of the endowment of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, that is to say an annual sum of £200 being a further part of the aforesaid larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, and shall be held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Mark, Myddelton Square, and shall be payable as to £50 per annum in augmentation of the stipend of the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Mark, Myddelton Square, and as to £150 per annum to the Incumbent of such last mentioned Benefice conditionally upon the employment within the Parish of Clerkenwell, Saint Mark, Myddelton Square, of an Assistant Curate or Lay Worker: Provided always that any part of the said annual sum of £150 per annum which may not be expended as aforesaid in any one year shall be held or invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the purpose of augmenting the provision herein recommended and proposed for the payment of a Curate or Lay Worker.

"9. That with the consent of the said Frederick John Dove, being the Patron as hereinbefore mentioned of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip (which consent is testified as aforesaid), after the said union has taken effect the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Philip, Clerkenwell, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the Church of Saint Philip, Clerkenwell, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY.

Fred Westby Lomax.

Whereas Fred Westby Lomax, formerly of 357, Oxford Road, Manchester, being a person duly registered under the Dentists Act, 1878, as amended by the Dentists Act, 1921, and being a person duly registered under the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said Fred Westby Lomax cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, nor to carry on the business of manufacturing, selling or distributing any of the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920 applies:

Now, therefore, after consultation with the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, and in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by No. 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by No. 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said Fred Westby Lomax the authority granted by the said Regulations to Registered Dentists to be in possession of and to administer the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies and to persons who lawfully keep open shop for the retailing of poisons to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, or to manufacture any extract or tincture of Indian hemp, or any preparation to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies or to carry on the business of retailing, dispensing or compounding the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Act applies.

(AS AMENDED).

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport has received an application from the Scottish Federation of Aerated Water Manufacturers' and Bottlers' Association, being an organisation representative of employers in a section of the road transport industry concerned with the conveyance of goods by road, which the Minister of Labour has certified to be a proper body to make such an application, for the variation during certain months of the year of the periods of driving time and rest laid down in Section 19 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended by Section 31 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933, for the employment of drivers of road vehicles of certain types.
