At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 4th day of *May*, 1935.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of April, 1935 (P.M. 2342/34), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 13th day of December, 1921, the 26th day of May, 1925, and the 23rd day of July, 1931, to sanction the grant of additional retired pay under certain conditions to Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces in respect of service in certain salaried appointments after retirement from the Active List, such increased retired pay to be subject to revision periodically according to the cost of living:

"And whereas in the opinion of Your Majesty's Government it is desirable that the remuneration of public servants should cease to be subject to such revision and should be consolidated:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to direct that the said additional retired pay shall be consolidated on the same basis and at the same date and subject to the same conditions as the salaries payable in respect of the posts concerned, except that for Officers in receipt of salaries which have been augmented by a cost of living bonus on the Civil Service Scale the supplementary retired pay based on bonus shall be consolidated in accordance with the rules prescribed in Treasury Minute of the 27th July, 1934, relative to the calculation of consolidated rates of pension to be granted to Civil Servants, or in any subsequent Treasury Minute dealing with the same subject.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of May, 1935 (C.W. 3840/35), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Section 3 of the Officers of Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that Officers of the Reserve shall be entitled to receive such pay and allowances as we, with the consent of Your Majesty in Council, may from time to time appoint:

"And whereas by the Naval Forces Act, 1903, it is enacted that the Admiralty shall have power to raise and maintain a Force to be called the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and that any Volunteer enrolling under this Act, when serving for training afloat or called out for actual service shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

"And whereas by Clause 9 of Section X of Schedule V to Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, and by certain subsequent Orders Your Majesty was pleased to direct that the rates of full pay, unemployed pay and half pay authorised therein for Officers of Your Majesty's Naval, Marine, Naval Reserve and Naval Volunteer Reserve Forces should be subject to revision periodically according to the cost of living:

"And whereas by Clause 2 of the Schedule to Your Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of July, 1931, Your Majesty was pleased to direct that the standard rates of the salaries of Naval and Royal Marine Officers employed on certain Inspection, Research, Design and Experimental Ordnance Duties should be such as we might lay down from time to time with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury under the provisions of Order in Council of the 29th November, 1879, and should be subject to review according to the cost of living at the same dates and in the same manner as the ordinary rates of full pay of Officers on the General Active List:

"And whereas in consequence of a decision by Your Majesty's Government that the remuneration of public servants should cease to be subject to such periodical revision Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 9th day of November, 1934, to direct that the full pay, unemployed pay, half pay and certain salaries and allowances payable to Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces should

be consolidated as from the 1st day of September, 1934, at rates approximately 9½ per cent. below standard rates subject, however, to the proviso that the consolidated rates then approved should not be issued until the state of the national finances might permit:

"And whereas Your Majesty was pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing date the 21st day of February, 1935, to sanction revised rates of pay for Church of England Chaplains and a revised scale of salary for the Chief Constable, Royal Marine Police:

"And whereas Your Majesty's Government have judged it to be expedient that the date aforesaid, from which the said consolidated rates in full should be issued, shall be the 1st day of July, 1935:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to direct that the consolidated rates of full pay, unemployed pay, half pay, salaries and allowances laid down by Your Orders in Council bearing date the 9th day of November, 1934, and the 21st day of February, 1935, shall be issued as from the 1st day of July, 1935:

"And further to direct that, as from the same date, the rates of the salaries of Naval and Royal Marine Officers employed on certain Inspection, Research, Design, and Experimental Ordnance Duties and included in the scheme sanctioned by Your Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of July, 1931, shall cease to be subject to periodical review according to the cost of living and shall be such as we may lay down from time to time with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury under the provisions of Order in Council of the 29th November, 1879.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of April, 1935 (E.106/35), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as

are from time to time directed by Order in Council;

"And whereas various rates of extra duty pay were approved by Order in Council dated the 19th December, 1923, for non-commissioned Officers and men employed in appointments at the Royal Marine Divisions, and the Depot, R.M., Deal:

"And whereas as from 1st April, 1935, the manufacture and repair of boots and shoes at the Royal Marine Divisions at Portsmouth and Plymouth, and at the Depot, R.M., Deal, will be undertaken as a direct Naval Service instead of through the medium of the Shoemaking Funds as hitherto, the manufacture of boots and shoes at the Royal Marine Division, Chatham, being in abeyance pending completion of a three-year trial with boots obtained from the private trade, although facilities for repair will be the same as at the other Divisions:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment of extra duty pay as from 1st April, 1935, to the Shoemaking Staffs at Royal Marine Establishments as follows, pending completion of the trial of contract made boots at the Chatham Division:—

WHEREAS by Section 9 of the Weights and Measures Act, 1904 (4 Edw. 7. c. 28) it is provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to specify new fees to be paid in respect of the Verification and Stamping of Weights, Measures and Weighing and Measuring Instruments in substitution for the fees specified in the First Schedule of the Weights and Measures Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 21):

And whereas it is provided by subsection (2) of Section 3 of the Weights and Measures

(Amendment) Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 8) that the aforesaid power of His Majesty shall include and be deemed always to have included the power of specifying fees to be paid whether or not the weighing or measuring apparatus is found correct or is stamped:

And whereas His Majesty by Order in Council dated the 8th day of June, 1929 (S.R. & O. 1929, No. 482) directed that the fees specified in the Schedule to that Order should be taken upon the verification and stamping of measuring instruments used in trade for the measurement of liquid fuel or lubricating oil for sale in individual quantities not exceeding twenty gallons:

And whereas the Board of Trade have represented to His Majesty that it would be expedient to specify new fees to be paid upon the verification and stamping of such measuring instruments:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Order in Council dated 8th June, 1929 (S.R. & O. No. 482) is hereby revoked.

2. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall be paid in respect of the verification and stamping of measuring instruments used in trade for the measurement of liquid fuel and lubricating oil for sale in individual quantities not exceeding twenty gallons.

3. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall likewise be paid in respect of any such instrument which on testing is found to be incorrect or defective.

4. This Order may be cited as the Measuring Instruments (Liquid Fuel and Lubricating Oil) Verification and Stamping Fees Amendment Order, 1935, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1935.

WHEREAS by section 18 of "The Extradition Act, 1870", it is among other things enacted that if, by any law or Ordinance made after the passing of the said Act by the legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British possession, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any foreign state, or by any subsequent Order, either—

Suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Act, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign

state, and so long as such law or Ordinance continues in force there and no longer;

Or direct that such law or Ordinance, or any part thereof, shall have effect in such British possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the said Act:

And whereas by an Ordinance numbered 6 of 1877, enacted by the Legislature of the Gold Coast Colony, the short title of which was "The Extradition Ordinance", it was provided that all powers vested in and acts authorized or required to be done by a police magistrate or any justice of the peace in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals in the United Kingdom under "The Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873", should be vested in and should in the Colony be exercised and done by any District Commissioner in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals under the said Acts:

And whereas by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1877, it was directed that the said Extradition Ordinance, 1877, should have effect in the Colony of the Gold Coast as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870:

And whereas by an Ordinance numbered 8 of 1935, enacted by the Legislature of the Gold Coast Colony, the short title of which is "The Extradition Ordinance, 1935", it is provided that the Extradition Ordinance of the Gold Coast Colony shall be repealed and that "all powers vested in, and acts authorized or required to be done by, a police magistrate in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals in the United Kingdom under the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1932, are hereby vested in, and may in the Colony be exercised and done by, any District Magistrate in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals under the said Acts" and that "all powers vested in and acts authorized or required to be done by any justice of the peace in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals in the United Kingdom under the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1932, are hereby vested in and may in the Colony be exercised and done by any District Magistrate or District Commissioner in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals under the said Acts":

And whereas it is further provided by the said Ordinance that the said Ordinance shall not come into operation until His Majesty shall by Order in Council direct that the said Ordinance shall have effect within the said Colony as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870", but that the said Ordinance shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council shall have been published in the Gold Coast Gazette and with effect from the date of such publication:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of "The Extradition Act, 1870", and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, revoke the said Order of the 23rd day of November, 1877, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder and to the continuance and completion as if this Order had not been made of any proceedings pending at the date of this Order, and direct that the said Ordinance:

shall have effect in the Colony of the Gold Coast, without modification or alteration, as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870".

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 24th May, 1935, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 27th May, 1935, to Saturday, the 1st June, 1935, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

WE whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the twelfth day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five before the King's Remembrancer at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts

produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four to the 31st day of December One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four both days inclusive. We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of silver coins with four additional coins from one of such packets, making altogether one crown, fourteen half-crowns, no florins, twenty-four shillings, thirty-two sixpences, one fourpence, thirty-four threepences, two twopences and one penny. We then weighed each one pound troy weight (at its standard weight) of the coins so taken out and ascertained that the said coins so bulked were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We then took for assay one pound troy (at its standard weight) of the coins so weighed, comprising one crown, ten half-crowns, no florins, twenty shillings, twenty sixpences, one fourpence, twenty-one threepences, two twopences and one penny, and we ascertained that the amount of variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920 was, for such pound so taken for assay minus three thousandths ($-.003$) of an ounce on the whole, and that, therefore such pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was on the whole within the variation from standard weight so allowed. We then assayed separately the coins in the pound troy so taken for assay, comparing them with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said coins was on the whole within the remedy as to fineness prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus six ten-thousandths ($-.0006$) on the whole of the coins in such pound, and that, therefore, the said pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was, on the whole, within the variation from fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the said packets of silver coins, and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the remedy as to weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, being one hundred and twenty-four thousandths of an ounce ($-.124$) below the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts.
