SUPREME COURT, ENGLAND, FUNDS RULES.

Notice is hereby given in accordance with section 1 (1) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that after the expiration of at least 40 days from the date hereof, the Lord Chancellor, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, proposes to make rules as to payment out of Court in proceedings under section 84 of the Law of Property Act, 1925 (Restrictive Covenants).

Notice is further given that under section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, the Lord Chancellor, with the same concurrence as aforesaid, has, on account of urgency, made the above Rules to come into operation forthwith, as Provisional Rules.
