Melksham undertaking (including the provisions relating to the manufacture and storage of gas and the manufacture and conversion of residual products on lands authorised to be used for such purposes by the Vendors which lands are described in the Schedule to the Melksham Gas Order 1886) and for the exercise by the Company of the powers conferred thereby and for the repeal of the remainder of the said provisions.

13. To make provisions as to the declaration of the calorific values of and to define the price which may be charged by the Company for gas supplied within the added limits (including provisions empowering the Company to charge different prices for gas supplied by them in different parts of the added limits).

14. To define or fix for the purposes of the intended Order and of the Bath Gas Order 1932 a basic price or basic prices for the gas to be supplied by the Company within the added limits or any part or parts thereof and to make provision as to the revision of such basic price or prices.

15. To amend section 40 of the said Order of 1932.

16. To make temporary provision with respect to the ascertainment of the rate of dividend on the consolidated ordinary stock of the Company and as to the period in which gas supplied in the added limits shall be deemed to have been supplied by the Company in case meter indices are read before or after such date or dates as the intended Order may prescribe.

17. To empower the Company to raise additional money by borrowing on mortgage and by the creation and issue of debenture stock or by either of such means.

18. To make provisions as to the rights privileges and liabilities of the holders of mortgages and debenture stock of the Company.

19. To empower the Company to purchase by agreement any mortgages debentures or debenture stock of the Company and to apply their funds for the purpose and to provide that any mortgages debentures or debenture stock so purchased shall be cancelled.

20. To make new or further provisions in regard to the Company's affairs including provisions as to:—the receipt to be obtained in the case of minors, the substitution of a card or other index for the shareholders' address book or for the portion of any register kept in lieu thereof, the indemnity which may be required before the issue of substituted certificates &c., the number of directors, the appointment of a managing director, the circumstances in which the office of director shall be vacated and the notice of candidature of auditors and to empower the directors to fill occasional vacancies in the office of auditor.

21. To make provisions as to the supply of gas to premises abutting on streets &c., forming the boundary of but outside the limits of supply of the Company and as to the breaking up of such streets for the purpose of affording such supply.

22. To make provision with respect to the following matters:—the inspection and testing of meters and the recovery of sums due or payable to the Company in respect of the sale or hire of apparatus and fittings for or in connection with the consumption or use of

gas or the provision of materials and work in connection therewith or the fixing, setting up, repairing, altering, maintaining or removal thereof.

23. To repeal alter or amend all or some of the provisions of the Bath Gas Acts and Orders 1856 to 1932 and any other Act or Order relating to the Company or their undertaking.

24. To incorporate with the Order with or without modification or to render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871, and the Companies Clauses Acts, 1845 and 1863.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 22nd day of June, 1935.

Any such objection shall state:-

(a) the specific grounds of objection; and (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection must at the same time be forwarded to the undermentioned Solicitors or Parliamentary Agents.

A copy of the draft Special Order, an Ordnance Map showing the situation of the existing and proposed works of the Company and the boundaries of the existing area of supply and of the added limits and an Ordnance Map showing the lands to be used for the manufacture and storage of gas and the manufacture and conversion of residual products have been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Wilts at his office at Trowbridge, with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Somerset at his office at Weston-super-Mare, with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Gloucester at his office at Gloucester and at the offices of the Company at 18, Old Bond Street, Bath.
