1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or
£10,000. They will be dated at the option of

payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the
Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not
less than £50,000, and must specify the date on
which the Bills required are to be dated, and
the net amount per cent. (being an even
multiple of one penny) which will be given for

the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

TOY MANUFACTURING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS NEWLY BROUGHT WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE TRADE BOARD.

In accordance with the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under section 18 of the

Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Toy Manufacturing Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO FIX minimum rates of wages for male and female workers newly brought within the scope of the Trade Board by the Trade Boards (Toy Manufacturing) Order, 1935.
