His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to John Samuel Mathias, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 18th March, 1935 at the pumping station of the National Oil Refineries at Queen's Dock, Swansea, a workman went down into a drainage chamber connected with pipes through which oil is pumped from ships to storage tanks on shore, and was overcome by fumes. He fell unconscious into oil which had collected to a depth of two feet at the bottom of the chamber. Mathias went down into the chamber without a gas mask and tried to effect a rescue; but he had to return to fresh air when on the point of collapse. Mathias recovered sufficiently to go down a second time; but although he was able to catch hold of the unfortunate workman, he was again forced to give up the attempt at rescue because of the poisonous gases in the chamber. Had he been successful, the life of the first workman, whose body was recovered somewhat later, might have been saved. The coroner and jury at the inquest warmly commended Mathias's bravery. WHEREAS by the Stalybridge Hyde Mossley and Dukinfield Tramways and Electricity Board Act 1901 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1901") the Stalybridge Hyde Mossley and Dukinfield Tramways and Electricity Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") were authorised to construct and have constructed and opened for traffic certain tramways including the tramways in the borough of Mossley in the County Palatine of Lancaster described in the Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as "the abandoned tramways."

'And whereas Part III of the Tramways Act, 1870 (except Section 43 thereof) is incorporated with the Act of 1901 and in the said Part III it is enacted by Section 41 inter alia as follows:-

"If at any time after the opening of any tramway in any district for traffic the promoters discontinue the working of such tramway, or of any part thereof, for the space of three calendar months (such discontinuance not being occasioned by circumstances beyond the control of such promoters for which purpose the want of sufficient funds shall not be considered a circumstance beyond their control) and such discontinuance is proved to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade, the said. Board, if they think fit, may by order declare that the powers of the promoters in respect of such tramway or the part thereof so discontinued shall, from the date of such order, be at an end, and thereupon the said powers of the promoters shall cease and determine, unless the same are purchased by the local authority in manner by this Act provided."

And whereas by virtue of the Ministry of Transport Act 1919 and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order 1919, the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act 1870 have been transferred to the Minister of Transport.

And whereas the Board have applied to the Minister of Transport for an Order under the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870, declaring that the powers of the Board in respect of the abandoned tramways shall be at an end and it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister of Transport that the working of the abandoned tramways has been discontinued for the space of three calendar months.

Now therefore the Minister of Transport in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act 1870, hereby orders and declares that the powers of the Board in respect of the abandoned tramways shall from the date of this Order be at an end.

This Order may be cited as the Stalybridge Hyde Mossley and Dukinfield Tramways (Sesser of Powers) Order, 1935.

(a) So much of Tramway No. 1 as is situate in Manchester Road between the junction of that road with Stamford Road and the boundary of the borough of Mossley near Shadworth

(c) Tramway No. 3 situate in Manchester

Road, Stamford Road and Stamford Street.

(d) So much of Tramway No. 4 as was conconstructed and is situate in Stockport Road between the junction of that road with Stamford Street and the Haddens Public House.
