REQUISITIONS FOR CERTIFICATES OF BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES.

WALSALL AND WEST BROMWICH (WIGMORE SCHOOLS) JOINT COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT, 1930. SECTION 3.

(28th May, 1935.)

Whereas by the Walsall and West Bromwich (Wigmore Schools) Joint Committee Order 1932 (in this order referred to as "the order of 1932") the Minister of Health made provision

for the combination of the county boroughs of Walsall and West Bromwich for the purpose of the management and control of the Wigmore Schools by a joint committee named the Walsall and West Bromwich (Wigmore Schools) Joint Committee;

And whereas application has been made to the Minister by the councils of the county boroughs of Walsall and West Bromwich for an order revoking the order of 1932 and dissolving the joint committee:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the power conferred on him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930 and of all powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order.

1. This order may be cited as the Walsall and West Bromwich (Wigmore Schools) Joint Committee (Dissolution) Order, 1935, and shall come into operation on the 30th day of June, 1935.

2.—(1) The order of 1932 is hereby revoked, and the joint committee dissolved.

(2) Notwithstanding the revocation and dissolution aforesaid, the joint committee and their clerk and treasurer shall continue to act for such period as may be necessary for the purposes of the audit of the accounts of the joint committee, and of winding up the affairs of the joint committee, and during the period aforesaid so much of the order of 1932 as may be necessary for those purposes shall continue in force.

3. Any sum received under the order of 1932 or this order by a council shall be paid into the general rate fund of the council.

4. The accounts of the joint committee and their committees and officers (if any) shall, instead of being made up to the 31st day of March, 1935, be made up to such date as may be necessary for the purposes of article 2 of this order, and shall be audited by the district auditor in like manner and with the like incidents and consequences as if this order had not been made:

Provided that any sum certified by the district auditor to be due from any person shall be paid by that person to the treasurer to the council of the county borough of West Bromwich, and shall be divided between the councils represented on the joint committee in the proportions in which the councils contributed to the joint fund of the joint committee during the financial year ending the 31st day of March, 1935.
