THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

THE GOVERNING BODY OF ST. PETER'S COLLEGE, WESTMINSTER, commonly called WESTMINSTER SCHOOL having, on the 27th day of May, 1935, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending the existing Statutes of the School, the said Statute is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of St. Peter's College, Westminster, commonly called Westminster School on the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

WE, THE GOVERNING BODY OF ST. PETER'S COLLEGE, WESTMINSTER, commonly called WESTMINSTER SCHOOL, in virtue of the powers vested in us by the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, do hereby make the following Statute amending the Statute for determining and establishing the constitution of the Governing Body of St. Peter's College, Westminster,

commonly called Westminster School, dated 7th October, 1869, and amended 28th June, 1875, and 26th February, 1880.

STATUTE.

- 1. This Statute shall take effect from and after the approval thereof by His Majesty in Council.
- 2. The clause mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto, shall be read and construed as if the words set forth in the second column were inserted in the stead of the words mentioned in the third column.

SCHEDULE.

I. Subject to the exceptions set out in Paragraphs IV and V hereof, no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the roads specified in the First Schedule hereto any heavy locomotive, light locomotive, motor tractor or heavy motor car, or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver.

II.—(a) No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle on any road specified in the first column of the Second Schedule hereto otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to such road in the second column of that Schedule.

(b) Excepting as may be necessary for the purposes of road maintenance or reconstruction, or as may momentarily be necessary for the avoidance of an accident, no vehicle may be halted on the roads numbered (3) and (4) in the Second Schedule or on any converging road within fifty feet of either of those two roads.

III.—(a) No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding twenty miles per hour on the road specified in the Third Schedule hereto.

(b) Nothing in this paragraph shall be deemed to permit any vehicle to travel at a speed which would, apart from this Order, be unlawful.

IV. Nothing in this Order contained shall prevent the driving on the roads specified in the First Schedule of any vehicle which is being used:—

(i) for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or

other premises situate on or adjacent to the said roads;

(ii) for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

(iii) in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the

supply of gas, water or electricity or any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports.

(iv) in the course of Military Training Operations.

V. Nothing in this Order contained shall prevent the driving on the road firstly specified in the First Schedule of any public service vehicle operating as a stage carriage under a road service licence issued under Part IV of the Road Traffic Act, 1930.
