**THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.**

THE GOVERNING BODY OF ST. PETER'S COLLEGE, WESTMINSTER, commonly called WESTMINSTER SCHOOL having, on the 27th day of May, 1935, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending the existing Statutes of the School, the said Statute is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of St. Peter's College, Westminster, commonly called Westminster School on the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

WE, THE GOVERNING BODY OF ST. PETER'S COLLEGE, WESTMINSTER, commonly called WESTMINSTER SCHOOL, in virtue of the powers vested in us by the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, do hereby make the following Statute amending the Statute for determining and establishing the constitution of the Governing Body of St. Peter's College, Westminster,

commonly called Westminster School, dated 7th October, 1869, and amended 28th June, 1875, and 26th February, 1880.

**STATUTE.**

1. This Statute shall take effect from and after the approval thereof by His Majesty in Council.
2. The clause mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto, shall be read and construed as if the words set forth in the second column were inserted in the stead of the words mentioned in the third column.
