**W**HEREAS by subsection (2) of section 31 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933 (in this Order referred to as "the Act"), it

is provided that the Act shall come into operation on the appointed day, and that the appointed day shall be such day as His Majesty may by Order in Council appoint, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act:

And whereas certain provisions of the Act were brought into operation by the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933 (Date of Commencement) Order (No. 1), 1933:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-six shall be the appointed day for the provisions of sections 7 to 14 of the Act for all purposes, and for the provisions of subsection (4) of section 31 of the Act and of the Third Schedule to the Act, in so far as they effect the repeal of section 26 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868.

2. The first day of May, nineteen hundred and thirty-six shall be the appointed day for all purposes for all provisions of the Act not previously brought into operation.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order may be cited as the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933 (Date of Commencement) Order, 1935.

And whereas the Birnam detachment of the 5th Volunteer Battalion, the Royal Highlanders, was by virtue of that Order transferred as part of the 5th Volunteer Battalion, the Royal Highlanders, detailed in the first column of the said Schedule to the Territorial Force and became a unit of the Territorial Force known by the title of the 8th Battalion the Royal Highlanders (Cyclist) as detailed in the second column of the said Schedule:

And whereas by the Territorial Army and Militia Act, 1921, the Territorial Force became known as the Territorial Army:

And whereas subsequently to the disbandment of the 8th Battalion, Royal Highlanders (Cyclist), the 6th/7th (Perth and Fife) Battalion The Black Watch (Royal Highlanders), now designated the 6th/7th (Perth and

Fife) Battalion The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment), became the unit of the Territorial Army which was recruited in the Birnam district and succeeded to the use of the property at and Birnam referred to in the second column of the Schedule to this Order :

And whereas the Trustee named in the first column of the Schedule to this Order holds the property described and set opposite to his name in the second column of that Schedule in trust for the unit of the Territorial Force mentioned in the third column of that Schedule for the purposes and subject to the limitations mentioned in the deed referred to in the fourth column of that Schedule, and it is expedient that such property should be transferred from this Trustee to the County Association mentioned in the fifth column of that Schedule :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order,

and it is hereby ordered, that as from the date of this Order the said property shall be by virtue of this Order transferred from the said Trustee to and vested in the said County Association subject to any charges thereon and to any liabilities in or towards the discharge of which the said property is properly applicable, and shall be held by the said County Association for the benefit of the said unit of the Territorial Army that is to say the 6th/7th (Perth and Fife) Battalion, The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment), or for such other purposes as the Association with the consent of the said unit (to be ascertained in manner prescribed by regulations of the Army Council) shall direct but so that the interest of any beneficiary other than the said unit shall not without the consent of such beneficiary be affected.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of May, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Luckington, in

the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Bristol :

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Luckington is vested for an estate in fee simple without encumbrances in Alice Maud Ottley, Spinster, Catherine Florence Lucy Ottley, Spinster, and Mary Veale Ottley, Spinster, all of Number 1, Chalfont Road, in the City of Oxford :

“ And whereas the said Alice Maud Ottley, Catherine Florence Lucy Ottley and Mary Veale Ottley, are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Luckington, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Archdeacon of Swindon for the time being :

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Ronald Erskine Ramsay, Bishop Suffragan of Malmesbury, is now Archdeacon of Swindon and as such Archdeacon he is willing to accept such transfer and in token thereof has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned :

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, has to the same transfer given that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary and in token of the same consent has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned :

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Luckington which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend

to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Luckington:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Alice Maud Ottley, Catherine Florence Lucy Ottley and Mary Veale Ottley (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) with the consent of the said Ronald Erskine Ramsay, Bishop Suffragan of Malmesbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Luckington now vested in them, the said Alice Maud Ottley, Catherine Florence Lucy Ottley and Mary Veale Ottley as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Ronald Erskine Ramsay as Archdeacon of Swindon, and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Ronald Erskine Ramsay, Bishop Suffragan of Malmesbury, as Archdeacon of Swindon, and by his successors in the same Archdeaconry for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of May, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the Archdeaconries of Surrey and Dorking, both in the Diocese of Guildford:

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend John Victor, Bishop of Guildford, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries of Surrey and Dorking are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said John Victor, Bishop of Guildford (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order (first), the Parish of Saint Mary, Ewshott, at present in the Rural Deanery of Aldershot, in the said Archdeaconry of Surrey, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Farnham, in the same Archdeaconry, and (secondly) the Parish of Ockham, at present in the Rural Deanery of Leatherhead, in the said Archdeaconry of Dorking, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Woking, in the same Archdeaconry, and each of the Parishes hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery to which it is hereby transferred and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notices of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Surrey and to the Archdeacon of Dorking, and they have severally expressed their approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby

to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Guildford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94; of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94; and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 23rd day of May, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 28th day of April, 1876, and published in the London Gazette on the 2nd day of the following month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of All Saints situate at Shooter's Hill, in the Parish of Plumstead, in the said County of Kent and at that time in the Diocese of Rochester, but now in the said Diocese of Southwark, and such District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead, should be

altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of Plumstead which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, being:—

"All that portion of the Parish of Plumstead, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south by the New Parish of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west by the said New Parish of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead, from the said Parish of Plumstead crosses the middle of Nithdale Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Nithdale Road for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Plum Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Plum Lane for a distance of 16½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence forming the south-western boundary of Shrewsbury Park, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then first south-eastward and then southward along such fence for a distance of 23½ chains or thereabouts to its southern end, and continuing thence southward in a straight line in the same direction as the latter portion of the said fence for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Plumstead from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation

and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Jerome, Dawley, situate partly within the Parish of Hillingdon and partly within the Parish of Hayes, both in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Hillingdon, of the said Parish of Hayes, and of the Parish of Harlington, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Hillingdon, of the said Parish of Hayes, and of the said Parish of Harlington, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Jerome, Dawley, situate as aforesaid:
