## HOME OFFICE NOTICE.

PHARMACY AND POISONS ACT, 1933.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, after the expiration of forty days from this date, to make Rules under section 23 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933 (23 & 24 Geo. V. Ch. 25) with respect to the matters and for the purposes specified in that section.

It is intended that the Rules shall come into force on May 1st, 1936, the date on which the

relevant sections of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933, will come into operation; as from that date the various existing statutory provisions and regulations relating to the sale, supply, storage and transport of poisons will be repealed.

Notice is also given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, after the expiration of forty days from this date, (i) to confirm the Poisons List, being the list of the substances which are to be treated as poisons for the purposes of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933, prepared and submitted to him by the Poisons Board for his approval, and (ii) to make an Order in pursuance of section 20 (4) of the Act approving, for the purposes of that section, any hospital, infirmary or dispensary maintained by any public authority or out of any public funds or by a charity or by voluntary subscriptions.
