His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to make a posthumous Award of the Decoration of the Albert Medal in recognition

of the gallantry displayed by Mr. Thomas Gibson, late Cook in the s.s. "Usworth," in the following circumstances:—

In December, 1934, the s.s. "Usworth" of Newcastle was in distress in the North Atlantic Ocean while on a voyage from Montreal to Queenstown with a cargo of grain.

Attempts were made to save the vessel but at about midnight on 13/14th December it became clear that she would have to be abandoned by her crew. Very gallant efforts were then made by the Belgian s.s. "Jean Jadot" and the s.s "Ascania" of Liverpool to take off the crew. In the course of these efforts the "Ascania" manœuvred as close as was possible to the "Usworth," and about 2 p.m. on 14th December, sent away a lifeboat to her. There had been a whole gale from the west-north-west which at this time had slightly moderated, but there were still frequent heavy squalls and high seas; oil was being pumped on the sea. The lifeboat from the pumped on the sea. Ascania " got under the lee of "Usworth," about fifteen feet away from her, with the crew ready to pull away as the "Usworth" drifted down on to the lifeboat.

Those on the "Usworth" were told to jump one at a time into the lifeboat, but in the excitement three members of the "Usworth's" crew jumped into the water together. One of the men who jumped from the "Usworth" was the cook, T. Gibson. He was a strong swimmer and would probably have reached the "Ascania's" lifeboat in another two or three strokes, but the messroom boy, L. Jones, who had got into difficulties, shouted for help and Gibson was seen to tread water and then to turn back. Unfortunately he was unable, in the oil-coated sea, to swim with the boy to the "Ascania's" lifeboat, and, notwithstanding attempts made to save them by those remaining on the "Usworth," they were swept under "Usworth's" stern and both were the

There is no doubt that Mr. Gibson sacrificed his life in attempting to save the messroom boy.

"Ascania," in recognition of their services to the crew of the s.s. ິ່ 'Usworth.''

and to repeal or revoke the powers of the Council in relation to the supply of gas in any other areas.

- 2. To empower the Council to purchase take and hold retain sell lease exchange or otherwise dispose of lands for the purpose of the gas undertaking of the Council.
- 3. General provisions as to the conduct of the gas undertaking of the Council including the supply and purchase of gas in bulk, the laying of pipes in private streets, the provision of dwelling houses offices and showrooms, notice of discontinuance of the supply of gas, inspection and testing of meters, position of meters, prevention of improper use of gas, fittings not to be subject to distress, relief from obligation to supply, power to compel repairs in case of danger, use of moneys forming part of sinking and other funds, service of gas demand notes, alternative provisions in regard to the service of Notices upon consumers, the recovery of sums due for fittings and the exemption of the Council and their officers from personal liability.
- 4. To provide that all moneys received by the Council in connection with their gas undertaking whether on capital or revenue account shall be carried to and form part of the general rate fund of the urban district of Tyldesley and that all payments and expenses made and incurred by the Council in respect of the said undertaking shall be paid or transferred out of the said general rate fund.
- 5. To make provision in regard to the form and nature of the accounts of the said undertaking to be kept by the Council.
- 6. To provide as to the method by which and the purposes for which the surplus revenue of the said undertaking shall be expended and applied by the Council, and amongst other things to permit of the formation of a reserve fund in connection with the said undertaking to be invested or to be applied in making good any deficiency charged to the said general rate fund, in meeting any extraordinary claims or demand in respect of the said undertaking or in or towards the payment of the cost of renewing improving or extending any works forming part of the said undertaking or otherwise for the benefit thereof.
- 7. To make special provision for the regulation of the charges to be made for gas supplied by the Council by reference to the amount of the surplus gas revenue and the moneys for the time being remaining in the reserve fund referred to in paragraph 6 of this Notice, and in particular if the said reserve fund amounts to more than one twentieth of the aggregate capital expended for the time being on the gas undertaking of the Council to provide that the Council shall fix such amount as they think
