THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

Order for the Alteration of Coroners' Districts.

Whereas it is provided by Section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, that a county council may submit, after complying with such requirements as to notice and consideration of objections as may be prescribed, to the Secretary of State a draft order providing for such alteration of any existing division of the county into coroners' districts as appears to them to be suitable and that the Secretary of State, after taking into consideration any objections to the draft order made in the prescribed manner and within the prescribed time, may make an order, either in the terms of the draft submitted to him or with such modifications as he thinks fit:

And whereas the administrative county of Northampton is now divided into three coroners' districts:

And whereas the county council of the said county has, pursuant to Section 12 of the said recited Act, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft order providing for the alteration of the division of the said county into coroners' districts :

And whereas the requirements of the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, have been complied with:

Now therefore in pursuance of the power vested in me by Section 12 of the said recited Act, I hereby order that the existing division of the administrative county of Northampton into coroners' districts shall be altered, and that the said districts shall be named and constituted as set out in the Schedule to this Order and substituted for the existing districts.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of August, 1935, provided however that nothing herein contained shall affect the proceedings at any inquest begun by a coroner before that day.
