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HE King of Spain is perfectly recovered of his late Illness; He goes every day abroad to take the Air, and Diverts himself with Walking in the Evenings; and with other Recreations. His Catholick Majesty has continued the Duke of Medina Cell for years in the Viceroyalty of Naples, and a Commission to that purpose was sent him by the last Courier that went to Italy. The King has not yet disposed of the Viceroyalty of Peru; 'Tis said the principal Pretenders to that Employment are, the Duke of Albuquerque, the Marquis of Gasanaga, and the Marquis of Chily. His German Forces continue in the mean time their march to the General Rendezvous; The Train of Artillery is ready at Lemberg to be feat to the Army; The Forces of Poland are encamped near Mmaperlisk in Ruffand; The Crown General is come to Marienpul, where he waits for the King's arrival; And all the Preparations for the Campagne are in fuch forwardness, that it is hoped the same will be opened before the end of this month. Brassles, Aug. 17. The last Letters from Madrid, which are dated the first of this month, bring the good News, that the King of Spain is very well again, and gives Audience to the foreign Ministers. The States of the everal Provinces of the Spanish-Netherlands are assembled to consider of the Supplies which are demanded of them for Maintaining the Forces designed to be kept on for in time of Peace, which it is intended shall amount to 25000 Men

with 12 Companies of Horse, the like number of Dragoons, and 7 of Coslacks on Foot, and some Cannon, and attackt him. However it be, the Great General Sapieha is gone from hence to Lemberg, and has fent Orders to the Lithuanian Forces under his Command, to march with all possible: diligence to the general Rendezvous of the King's Army.

Vrenna, Aug. 6. The Moscovice Ambassadors had their Publick Audience on the 28th paft: The Czir, upon the Advice he had received, that a great part of the Cofficks who were under his Subjection, being incouraged and affilted by the Turks and Tartars, their Neighbours, have Rebelled, and are in Arms against him, alreved his delign of going to Italy, and parted from this place the 30 h on his return to Molicory. He has taken with him the first his return to Molivar. He has taken with him the fieft and fecond of his Ambassidors, leaving the third to finish the Negociation they came hither about. Prince Eugene of Savoy went hence the 3d Instant to Hungary; where the Imperial Forces are all joined together at their General Rendezvous at Verssmarton, and as soon as the Train of Artillery is arrived there, they will march to Peter-Waradin. The Count of Gecklesberg, who went lately with a Party of the Garison of Hermansladt to make an Attempt upon the Turks who are employed in repairing Vypalanka, is returned without having been able to effect his Design, by reason the Country round that place lies all under Water.
