“And whereas Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of October, 1923, sanctioned the payment of Dispensing Allowance of 2d. a day to Sick Berth Attendants passed for Leading Sick Berth Attendant when employed on dispensing duty to a substantial extent in ships bearing not more than two Sick Berth ratings:

“And whereas we consider that Sick Berth ratings borne for duty with Dental Officers should be excluded when assessing the number of Sick Berth ratings borne:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council, to sanction the amendment of the aforementioned Order in Council accordingly.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or

having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas, under the provisions of Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of August, 1903, Candidates for Commissions as Medical Officers of Your Majesty's Navy who, at the time of passing the qualifying examination for admission into the Royal Navy, hold or are about to hold posts as Resident Medical or Surgical Officer in a recognised Civil Hospital may be allowed to serve in these civil appointments, subject to certain conditions, after the date of entry into the Royal Navy:

"And whereas we consider that this provision, as modified by Your Majesty's Orders in Council bearing dates the 25th day of July, 1927, the 5th day of November, 1929, and the 19th day of May, 1931, should be applicable to Candidates who enter the Naval Medical Service as Surgeon Lieutenants for Short Service, and that the time spent in the Civil Hospital appointment should count for purposes of seniority, pay, and promotion, and retired pay or gratuity on retirement in the manner prescribed in Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of June, 1934:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the foregoing proposal.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the

Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Ann, Nottingham, the New Parish of Saint Matthias, Snenton, the New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, the New Parish of Saint Jude, Nottingham, and the District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, all in

the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas District Chapelries have been assigned to each of the Churches of Saint Ann, Nottingham; Saint Matthias, Snenton; and Saint Jude, Nottingham, and separate Districts for spiritual purposes have been constituted by the names of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, and Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, by the Orders in Council, the dates of which are stated in the 3rd Column of the following Table:—

"And whereas the District Chapelries named in the foregoing Table and the District of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parishes and of the said District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Ann, Nottingham, of the said New Parish of Saint Matthias, Snenton, of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Nottingham, and of the said District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Nottingham; (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such new Parish and shall be annexed to

and shall in future form part of the said District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton; and (thirdly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Matthias, Snenton, which is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured blue shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Ann, Nottingham.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

*"The First Schedule.*

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Jude, Nottingham, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the north-west upon the west and upon the south-west by the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Nottingham, upon the east and upon the north-east by the District of Saint James, Porchester, in the said County and Diocese.

*"The Second Schedule.*

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, and to be annexed to the District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that other portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, which is bounded upon part of the north-east and upon the north-west by the said District of Saint James, Porchester, upon the west by

the New Parish of Saint Matthias, Snenton, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south by the said District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the remaining part of the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, at a point in the middle of Foxhill Road opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to the Robin Hood Allotment Gardens, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the stream which flows past the southern side of Valley Farm, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, from the said District of Saint James, Porchester.

*"The Third Schedule."*

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Matthias, Snenton, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Ann, Nottingham, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Matthias, Snenton, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the east partly by the said District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, partly by that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, which is described in the Second Schedule, and partly by the said District of Saint James, Porchester, upon the north, upon the west, and upon part of the south-west by the said New Parish of Saint Ann, Nottingham, and upon the remaining part of the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Ann, Nottingham, from the said New Parish of Saint Matthias, Snenton, at the northern end of the fence forming the south-eastern boundary of Woodlane Gardens, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Thorneywood Lane opposite to the middle of the footpath leading into the road called Thorneywood Mount, upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthias, Snenton, from the said District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when

this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of the Holy Saviour, Sugley, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Saviour, Sugley, should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Harold Ernest, Bishop of Newcastle (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly



represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Saviour, Sugley, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of Newburn which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of the Holy Saviour, Sugley.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of the Holy Saviour, Sugley, in the County of Northumberland and in the Diocese of Newcastle, being:—

"All that portion of the Parish of Newburn, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south-east and upon the north-east by the said New Parish of the Holy Saviour, Sugley, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Saviour, Sugley, from the said Parish of Newburn, at the centre of the bridge which carries the Coronation and Blucher Pit branch of the North Wallbottle Wagonway across Newburn Lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of Newburn Lane for a distance of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the Throckley Colliery Wagonway, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last mentioned Wagonway and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of  $29\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Lemington Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Lemington Road for a distance of  $7\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to the River Tyne, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Newburn from the said New Parish of the Holy Saviour, Sugley."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the

same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of May, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Old Romney, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Midley and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Ivychurch, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Old Romney, Midley and Ivychurch, duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of Canterbury and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Old Romney and Ivychurch, the Parish of Snaive (being one of the Parishes of the United Benefice of Brenzett with Snargate and Snaive) the Parish of Appledore (being one of the Parishes of the United Benefice of Appledore with Kenardington) the Parish of Brookland (being one of the Parishes of the United Benefice of Brookland with Fairfield) and the Parish of New Romney (being one of the Parishes of the United Benefice of New Romney with Hope) all in the said County and Diocese, and the said Archbishop of Canterbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union of Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Archbishop of Canterbury embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Old Romney, Midley and Ivychurch are all now full the said Benefices of Old Romney and Midley being held together in plurality by

the Reverend Eustace Henry Lord under the authority of a Dispensation, and the said Benefice of Ivychurch being held by the Reverend George Hewitt:

"And whereas the Church of the Parish of the said Benefice of Midley is in ruins:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the total revenues of the three Benefices hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice would be more than is required to form a competent provision for the United Benefice and that it is desirable that the surplus revenue should be applied as hereinafter recommended and proposed for the benefit of certain Benefices in the said Diocese of Canterbury not having a competent provision, namely the Benefice of Romney, Saint Mary in the Marsh, and the Benefice of Warehorne:

"And whereas the share of the patronage of the United Benefice when the unions which are hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect which on a fair and just apportionment would be assignable in respect of the interest of the Patron of the said Benefice of Midley would in our opinion be negligible:

"And whereas there is a pension charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Ivychurch in favour of the Reverend Newcome Reginald Raven, a former Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Old Romney, the said Benefice of Midley and the said Benefice of Ivychurch shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ivychurch with Old Romney and Midley' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices of Old Romney and Midley shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided, but the Parish of the said Benefice of Ivychurch shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That, pending the union of all three of the said Benefices as hereinbefore recommended and proposed, with the consent of the said Eustace Henry Lord (testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Old Romney and the said Benefice of Midley shall be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Old Romney with Midley' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices of Old Romney and Midley shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided, and

"(a) the said Eustace Henry Lord, if he is then Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Old Romney and Midley shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Old Romney with Midley and his admission

thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to such United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the same United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices of Old Romney and Midley for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Old Romney and Midley shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice; and

"(b) the patronage of the United Benefice of Old Romney with Midley shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Old Romney.

"3. That the Church of the Parish of Old Romney shall be the Parish Church of the Parish of Old Romney with Midley and that the Tables of Fees for the said Parish of Old Romney shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the same United Parish.

"4. That the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall take effect on the first avoidance subsequent to the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette of either the said Benefice of Ivychurch or the United Benefice of Old Romney with Midley if the Incumbent at that time of the other of such Benefices shall with the approval of the Archbishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Ivychurch with Old Romney and Midley but if he shall not so consent or if the Archbishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of such Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Ivychurch with Old Romney and Midley.

"5. That upon the union which is referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ivychurch shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Old Romney and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"6. That after the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme has taken effect, the right of presentation to the United Benefice shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said Benefices of Old Romney and Ivychurch alternately, and if under any of the provisions of Clause 4 of this Scheme an Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ivychurch shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice then

the Patron of the said Benefice of Old Romney shall have the first turn but otherwise the Patron of the said Benefice of Ivychurch shall have the first turn.

"7. That with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, as Patron of the said United Benefice of Brenzett with Snargate and Snaive, as Patron of the said United Benefice of Appledore with Kenardington, and as one of the alternate Patrons of the said United Benefice of New Romney with Hope (which consent is testified as aforesaid), and with the consent of the Right Honourable John Viscount Sankey, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, being on behalf of Your Majesty the other alternate Patron of the said United Benefice of New Romney with Hope (testified by his signing this Scheme), and with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ at Canterbury, as the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Brookland with Fairfield (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Eustace Henry Lord (testified as aforesaid), and with the consents also of the said George Hewitt, of the Reverend Horace Hammond, now Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Brenzett with Snargate and Snaive, of the Reverend George Wright, now Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Appledore with Kenardington, of the Reverend Arthur William MacMichael, now Incumbent of the said United Benefice of New Romney with Hope, and of the Reverend Arthur Stoddart Bousfield, now Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Brookland with Fairfield (all which consents are testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), upon the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme taking effect (a) all that detached part of the said Parish of Snaive lying close to the Church of Saint George at Ivychurch and all that detached part of the said Parish of Brookland which lies adjacent to and to the east of such detached part of the Parish of Snaive, and also all that detached part of the said Parish of Appledore which lies adjacent to and to the north of the said detached part of the Parish of Brookland shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Ivychurch and (b) all that western projection of the said Parish of New Romney which lies to the south and west of the middle of the road leading from Brenzett to Old Romney, and all that detached part of the said Parish of New Romney which lies to the north of Bow Bridge, shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the United Parish of Old Romney with Midley.

"8. That upon the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect or upon the hereinbefore mentioned pension to the said Newcome Reginald Raven ceasing to be payable, whichever shall the later happen, the net income derived by the Incumbent of the United Benefice from all the tithe rentcharges vested in the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty and formerly attached to the said three Benefices of Old Romney, Midley and Ivychurch respectively and from the proceeds of the redemption of any such tithe rentcharges and from the securities representing the accumulations of sinking fund payments in respect of the

same tithe rentcharges upon the extinguishment thereof in accordance with the provisions of the Tithe Act, 1925, shall be appropriated and distributed by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty as follows, that is to say, as to four fifth parts of such net income in payment to the Incumbent of the United Benefice and as to the remaining one fifth part thereof in payment to the Incumbents of the said two Benefices of Romney, Saint Mary in the Marsh, and Warehorne in equal shares, and the net income derived from any such tithe rentcharge so vested in the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty shall be the balance payable to the Incumbent of the United Benefice under the provisions of Section 5 of the Tithe Act, 1925, after the transfer payment and deductions made in accordance with the same Section from the gross amount actually collected from time to time.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the said Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of Canterbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly

published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

"I Martin by Divine permission Bishop of Rochester do in pursuance of the 26th section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, cap. 106, hereby represent to your Grace:—

"1. There is in the County of Kent and my Diocese of Rochester the Rectory of Ightham the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the respective Ecclesiastical Parishes of Kemsing and Wrotham and contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of one thousand five hundred and eighty-nine and the net annual value thereof is four hundred and eighty-eight pounds.

"2. In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of Kemsing the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Ightham and contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of nine hundred and fifteen and the net annual value thereof is four hundred and thirty-three pounds.

"3. In the same County and Diocese is the Rectory of Wrotham the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Ightham and contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of two thousand three hundred and sixteen and the net annual value thereof is one thousand one hundred and seventy pounds.

"4. In the same County and Diocese is the Rectory of Plaxtol a detached portion of which Parish known as Willmot Hill lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Shipbourne. The Parish of Plaxtol contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of nine hundred and eighty-three and the net annual value thereof is four hundred and seven pounds.

"5. In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of Shipbourne the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the detached portion of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Plaxtol known as Willmot Hill and contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of four hundred and fifty-four and the net annual value thereof is three hundred and fifty-four pounds.

"6. In the same County and Diocese is the Rectory of Leybourne a detached portion of which Parish lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Mary the Virgin Platt. The

Parish of Leybourne contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of three hundred and sixty-two and the net annual value thereof is four hundred and eighty-three pounds.

"7. In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of St. Mary the Virgin Platt the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the detached portion of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Leybourne referred to in paragraph 6 hereof. The Parish of St. Mary the Virgin Platt contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of one thousand one hundred and fifty-two and the net annual value thereof is four hundred and eighty-six pounds.

"8. In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of Aylesford a detached portion of which Parish lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Mereworth. The Parish of Aylesford contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of three thousand six hundred and sixty-four and the net annual value thereof is six hundred and twenty pounds.

"9. In the same County and Diocese is the Rectory of Mereworth the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the detached portion of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Aylesford referred to in paragraph 8 hereof. The Parish of Mereworth contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of six hundred and thirty-six and the net annual value thereof is five hundred and eighty-two pounds.

"10. The Northern portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Ightham lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Ightham and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Kemsing.

"11. The South-western corner of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Wrotham lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Wrotham and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Ightham.

"12. The detached portion of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Plaxtol known as Willmot Hill lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Plaxtol and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Shipbourne.

"13. The detached portion of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Leybourne containing the properties known as 'Highlands,' 'Little Comp,' 'Comp,' 'Broom Cottage' and 'Leybourne Lodge' lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Leybourne and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Mary the Virgin Platt.

"14. The detached portion of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Aylesford forming part of Mereworth Woods lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Aylesford and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Mereworth.

"15. It appears to me that the following alterations in the boundaries of the said respective Ecclesiastical Parishes may be made with advantage to the interest of religion, viz.:-

(a) The Northern portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Ightham be united to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Kemsing.

(b) The South-western corner of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Wrotham be united to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Ightham.

(c) The detached portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Plaxtol known as

Willmot Hill be united to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Shipbourne.

(d) The detached portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Leybourne containing the properties known as 'Highlands,' 'Little Comp,' 'Comp,' 'Broom Cottage' and 'Leybourne Lodge' be united to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Mary the Virgin Platt.

(e) The detached portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Aylesford forming part of Mereworth Woods be united to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Mereworth.

"16. The Reverend Leonard William Browne is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ightham and Edith Maude Winniffrith of Upper Restoration House Rochester in the County of Kent Widow is the Patron thereof.

"17. The Reverend Charles Henry Earle Freeman is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kemsing and the Rochester Diocesan Board of Patronage are the Patrons thereof.

"18. The Reverend Arthur Percival Pascoe is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wrotham and the Dean and Chapter of our Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary of Rochester are the Patrons thereof.

"19. The Reverend Wilmot Phillips is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Plaxtol and I the said Bishop of Rochester in right of my said Bishopric am the Patron thereof.

"20. The Reverend Francis Longe Schreiber is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shipbourne and Maude Lucia Heron Cazalet of 66 Grosvenor Street in the County of London Widow is the Patron thereof.

"21. The Reverend Harry William Thorne is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leybourne and Sir David Henry Hawley of Gayton Manor in the County of Northampton Baronet is the Patron thereof.

"22. The Reverend Arthur James Cross is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of St. Mary the Virgin Platt and I the said Bishop of Rochester in right of my said Bishopric am the Patron thereof.

"23. The Reverend Canon Frederick John Everett is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Aylesford and the Dean and Chapter of our Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary of Rochester are the Patrons thereof.

"24. The Reverend Howard Bertram Mayne is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Mereworth and the Right Honourable Evelyn Hugh John Viscount Falmouth and Baron le Despencer is the Patron thereof.

"25. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Act, I, the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the said Districts of the said Ecclesiastical Parishes of Ightham Wrotham Plaxtol Leybourne and Aylesford so proposed to be annexed to the said respective Parishes of Kemsing Ightham Shipbourne St. Mary the Virgin Platt and Mereworth and the mode



in which it appears to me the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, Tithe rentcharges, dues, rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and right to Pews may be made with justice to all parties interested.

"And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said respective Patrons and Incumbents of the said respective Parishes and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the Consents of the said respective Patrons and Incumbents thereto to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

#### "SCHEME.

"1. It is proposed to separate the following District from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Ightham in the County of Kent and Diocese of Rochester and unite the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Ecclesiastical Parish of Kemsing.

"Such District shall consist of all that portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Ightham which lies to the north of an imaginary line running along the centre of the Maidstone and Ashford Branch of the Southern Railway.

"Such District is coloured yellow on the plan No. 1 hereto annexed and thereon indicated by the letter 'A'.

"2. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Wrotham in the same County and Diocese and unite the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Ecclesiastical Parish of Ightham.

"Such District shall consist of all that portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Wrotham which is bounded on the north by an imaginary line running along the centre of the Maidstone and Ashford Branch of the Southern Railway and on all other sides by the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Ightham.

"Such District is coloured green on the plan No. 1 hereto annexed and thereon indicated by the letter 'B'.

"3. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Plaxtol in the same County and Diocese and unite the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Ecclesiastical Parish of Shipbourne.

"Such District shall consist of all that detached portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Plaxtol which is known as Willmot Hill.

"Such District is coloured pink on the plan No. 1 hereto annexed and thereon indicated by the letter 'C'.

"4. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Leybourne in the same County and Diocese and unite the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Mary the Virgin Platt.

"Such District shall consist of all that detached portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Leybourne which contains the properties known as 'Highlands', 'Little Comp', 'Comp', 'Broom Cottage' and 'Leybourne Lodge'.

"Such District is coloured blue on the plan No. 2 hereto annexed and thereon indicated by the letter 'D'.

"5. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Aylesford in the same County and Diocese and to unite the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Ecclesiastical Parish of Mereworth.

"Such District shall consist of all that detached portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Aylesford which is situate within the confines of the woods known as Mereworth Woods and forms part of Blaze Wood and Kate Reed Wood.

"Such District is coloured brown on the plan No. 3 hereto annexed and thereon indicated by the letter 'E'.

"The Inhabitants of the said Districts shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the respective Churches of the Parishes from which they are separated (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within any of the said Churches) but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Churches of the respective Parishes to which such Districts are respectively united and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates (Abolition) Act, 1868, to the repair of such last mentioned Churches.

"The Incumbent of the respective Parish to which each such District is united shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within such District or Districts as are so united to his Parish.

"The Inhabitants of the said districts shall have each and the same right to have marriages baptisms and christenings solemnised and performed in the Churches of the respective parishes to which such districts are respectively united.

"All fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said districts shall henceforth belong to the incumbents of the parishes to which such districts are respectively united.

"The Tithe rentcharges amounting to nineteen pounds one shilling set out in the Schedule hereunder written at present vested in Queen Anne's Bounty in trust for the Incumbent of the Benefice of Leybourne aforesaid together with the sinking fund relating to such Tithe rentcharges shall upon the day when any Order of His Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette be thenceforth vested in Queen Anne's Bounty in trust for the Incumbent of the Benefice of St. Mary the Virgin Platt aforesaid.

"Except as hereinbefore provided no alteration shall be made in the Tithe rentcharge or other endowments of the said Benefices or any of them.

"No alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or any of them.

"THE SCHEDULE hereinbefore referred to (being an Extract from the Tithe Apportionment of the Parish of Leybourne in the County of Kent confirmed on the 30th day of September, 1843).

**WHEREAS** His Majesty has accepted a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations in respect of the Tanganyika Territory:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the nineteenth day of March, 1926, and known as the "Tanganyika (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1926," provision was made for the establishment and constitution of a Legislative Council in and for the Tanganyika Territory:

And whereas by the said Order in Council His Majesty reserved to Himself power from time to time to revoke, alter, add to, or amend the said Order:

And whereas it is expedient to make other provisions than in the said Order in Council are contained in regard to the constitution of the said Legislative Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Tanganyika (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1935.

II. Clauses Six and Seven of the Tanganyika (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1926, are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the following Clauses are substituted therefor:

" VI. The Official Members of the Council shall consist of the persons for the time being discharging the functions of:—

The Chief Secretary, the Attorney General, the Treasurer, the Director of Medical Services, the Director of Education, the Deputy Chief Secretary, the General Manager of the Railway, the Provincial Commissioner, Eastern Province, the Controller of Customs, the Director of Public Works, the Director of Lands and Mines, the Director of Agriculture, the Postmaster General of the Amalgamated Services of Kenya, Uganda and the Tanganyika Territory."

" VII. The Unofficial Members of the Council shall be such persons not holding office in the Territory as the Governor may from time to time by instrument under the Public Seal appoint, subject to disallowance or confirmation by His Majesty, signified through a Secretary of State.

Every such Member shall vacate his seat at the end of five years from the date of the instrument by which he was appointed or at such earlier date as may be provided by that instrument.

Provided that if any such Member is provisionally appointed as hereinafter provided to fill a vacant seat in the Council and his provisional appointment is immediately followed by his definitive appointment, the aforesaid period of five years shall be reckoned from the date of the instrument provisionally appointing him.

Every such Member shall be eligible to be reappointed by the Governor for a further period or further periods each not exceeding five years, subject to the approval of His Majesty, signified through a Secretary of State."

III. This Order shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by proclamation in the Gazette and shall be published in the said Gazette, and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Territory.

IV. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council may at any time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

time the amount (if any) of the profits to be applied as aforesaid.

17. To make provision in regard to the formation by the Company of a capital redemption fund, a reserve fund, a special purposes fund and a renewal fund.

18. To make provisions as to the payment of half-yearly dividends by the directors without the sanction or direction of a General Meeting.

19. To make provision in regard to the reading of meter indices and as to the service of notices upon consumers.

20.
