**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 5th day of July, 1935, (C.W. 5460/35), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of February, 1932, to sanction the payment of certain salaries for Recruiting Staff Officers and Naval Medical Officers employed on Your Majesty's Naval Recruiting Staff:

"And whereas Your Majesty was pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date 25th day

of July, 1934, to sanction certain modifications in these salaries:

"And whereas in view of the improved state of the national finances we consider it desirable that these salaries should be further revised:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of salaries at the following rates to these Officers with effect from the 1st day of July, 1935 :—

To Recruiting Staff Officers, Royal Marines :—

In London	...	...	£375 per annum.
Elsewhere	...	...	£325 per annum.

To Royal Naval Recruiting Officers—£325 per annum.

To Royal Naval Medical Officers—£300 per annum.

"These proposals are in accordance with directions issued by the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by Subsection 1 of Section 64 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the provisions of Part II of the Act, including any enactments for the time being in force amending or substituted for the said provisions, shall extend, with such exceptions, adaptations, or modifications (if any) as may be specified in the Order, to the Isle of Man, any of the Channel Islands and any colony:

And whereas by Subsection (3) of the said Section 64 it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct—

(a) That any provision of Part II of the Act which is expressed to apply only to British ships registered in the United Kingdom shall apply to British ships registered in any country or part of His Majesty's dominions to which the provisions of that part of the Act can be extended by virtue of the before recited provisions of that Section; and

(b) That any reference in that part of the Act to a port in the United Kingdom shall be construed as including a reference to a port in any such country or part of His Majesty's dominions as aforesaid:

And whereas by virtue of an Order in Council dated 10th day of November, 1932, made in pursuance of Section 67 of the Act, Part II of the Act came into operation in the United Kingdom on the first day of January, 1933:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section 64, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to direct, and it is hereby directed, as follows:—

1. The provisions of Part II of the Act (with the exception of the provisions set out in the first part of the Schedule hereto), and the provisions of Sections 68, 69, 70, 71, 72 and 73 of the Act in so far as they relate to the provisions of Part II hereinbefore mentioned shall extend to the Isle of Man with the adaptations and modifications specified in the second part of the Schedule.

2.—(a) The provisions of Part II of the Act which are expressed to apply only to British ships registered in the United Kingdom shall apply to British ships registered in the Isle of Man.

(b) References in Part II of the Act to a port in the United Kingdom shall be construed as including references to a port in the Isle of Man.

3. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping Load Line Convention (Isle of Man) Order, 1935, and shall come into force on the first day of August, 1935.

### PART II.

#### *Adaptations and Modifications.*

1.—(a) In sub-section (5) of Section 48, after the words "Board of Trade" there shall be inserted the words "or the Collector of Customs at the request of the Board of Trade".

(b) In sub-section (5) of Section 53 for the words "Board of Trade" there shall be substituted the words "Collector of Customs".

(c) In paragraph (a) of Section 57, after the words "hereinbefore provided" there shall be inserted the words "or by the Harbour Master or other Officer duly authorised".

(d) Section 66 shall have an effect as if:

(I) in the definition of "Country to which the Load Line Convention applies" there were substituted for the words "under the last foregoing section" the words "by His Majesty in Council"; and

(II) the following words were added thereto—

"'Foreign-going ship' includes every ship employed in trading or going between some place or places in the United Kingdom and some place or places situate beyond the following limits, that is to say, the coasts of the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man and the Continent of Europe between the River Elbe and Brest inclusive.

'Home trade ship' includes every ship employed in trading or going within the following limits, that is to say, the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man and the Continent of Europe between the River Elbe and Brest inclusive.

'Ship Surveyor or Engineer Surveyor' means any person appointed by the Board of Trade to be a Surveyor of Ships under Section 724 of the principal Act.

'Board of Trade Inspector' means any person appointed by the Board of Trade as an Inspector under Section 728 of the principal Act".

(e) Section 71 shall have effect as if for the words "Section two hundred and eighty-two of the Principal Act" there were substituted the words "section eighteen of the Isle of Man Merchant Shipping (Passenger Steamers Survey) Act, 1885."

(f) Section 72 shall have effect as if for the word "summarily" there were substituted the words "at the suit of the Attorney General of the Isle of Man, any Officer of Customs, the Chief Constable or any Officer of police, before a High Bailiff or two Justices of the Peace."

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Cross, Middleton, situate in the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Middleton (in Rothwell) in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Cross, Middleton, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Middleton (in Rothwell) which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Cross, Middleton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Cross, Middleton':

"And with the like consent of the said Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners,

further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Cross, Middleton, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that, so long as the Reverend Joseph Thomas Horton, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Middleton (in Rothwell), shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church of Saint Cross, Middleton, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Joseph Thomas Horton.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Cross, Middleton, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Middleton (in Rothwell), in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon, which is bounded upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Townend, Morley, upon the south-west and upon the south by the Parish of Woodkirk (otherwise known as West Ardsley) both in the said County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, upon the south-east by the New Parish of Loffhouse, in the said County of York and in the said Diocese of Ripon, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, upon the north-east and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Loffhouse from the said New Parish of Middleton (in Rothwell) crosses the middle of Throstle Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Throstle Lane for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Throstle Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Throstle Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thorpe Crescent, and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the middle of Thorpe Crescent for a distance of 17½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thorpe Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Thorpe Road for a distance of 17½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Middleton Park Grove, and extending thence first south-westward and then westward along the middle of Middleton Park Grove for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sissons Street, and extending thence first southward and then westward along the middle of Sissons Street for a distance of 8½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sissons Lane and Sissons Avenue, and extending thence first westward and then north-westward along the middle of Sissons Avenue for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sissons Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Sissons Road for a distance of 11 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Sissons Row,

and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Sissons Row for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Number 14 and Number 9 Sissons Row, and extending thence north-westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the said house and premises known as Number 9 Sissons Row, and extending thence south-westward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 12 yards or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence which divides the close numbered 117 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Middleton published in the year 1931 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 118 upon the said maps, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 117 and the closes numbered 137, 138, 139 and 149 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 118 and the closes numbered 136, 135 and 140 upon the same maps for a distance of  $20\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 149 from the said close numbered 140 crosses the middle of the footpath leading to Mill Farm, and extending thence first south-westward, then westward and then north-westward along the middle of the said footpath (thereby passing under the Beeston and Batley Branch Line and also under the Main Line of the London and North Eastern Railway) for a distance of  $26\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Mill Shaw Beck, and extending thence westward in a straight line for a distance of 3 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Mill Shaw Beck upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Middleton (in Rothwell) from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Townend, Morley."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Buckland Monachorum which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Paul, situate at Yelverton, as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Yelverton.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Yelverton, being:—All that part of the

Parish of Buckland Monachorum, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say:—upon a small part of the west by the Parish of Tamerton Foliot, upon the south-east by the Parish of Bickleigh, upon the east by the Parish of Meavy, upon the north partly by the Parish of Walkhampton and partly by the New Parish of Horrabridge, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Horrabridge from the said Parish of Buckland Monachorum crosses the middle of the road leading from Horrabridge through Axtown to Plymouth, and extending thence southward along the middle of such road for a distance of 1 mile and 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction at Roborough Rock with the road leading to Miltoncombe, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 1064 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Buckland Monachorum published in the year 1906 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation, and extending thence first south-eastward to such fence and then first south-eastward and then in various directions along the fences forming the western boundaries of the said close numbered 1064 and of the closes numbered 1065, 1031 and 1031A, the western and southern boundaries of the close numbered 1028A and the western boundary of the close numbered 1028 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 33½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the western boundary of the said close numbered 1028 reaches the western side of the old turnpike road leading to Plymouth, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then southward along the middle of the said old turnpike road for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the main road from Tavistock to Plymouth, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said main road for a distance of 1 mile and 55 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Buckland Monachorum from the said Parish of Tamerton Foliot.

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

**WHEREAS** the Right Reverend William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"We William Lord Bishop of Exeter in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the Benefice or Rectory of Saint Edmund Exeter the Parish whereof contains a population of 751 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 250 persons. The net annual value of the Benefice of Saint Edmund Exeter is Three hundred and thirty-one pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Vicarage of Saint Thomas Exeter the Parish whereof contains a population of 10,687 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 750 persons. The net annual value of the Benefice of Saint Thomas Exeter is Four hundred and fifty-five pounds or thereabouts.

"That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a portion of the Parish of Saint Thomas Exeter (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto edged with blue) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Saint Edmund Exeter to which it is contiguous.

"The Patrons of the Benefice of Saint Edmund Exeter are The Incorporated and the Reverend Frank Oswald Urwin is the Incumbent thereof.

"The Patron of the Benefice of Saint Thomas Exeter is the Right Reverend The Lord Bishop of Exeter and the Reverend Gordon Basil Nicholls is the Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes, rentcharges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

**" SCHEME.**

"It is proposed to separate from the said Parish of Saint Thomas Exeter and annex to the said Parish of Saint Edmund Exeter all that part of the Parish of Saint Thomas the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance Map hereto annexed and edged with blue.

"That the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Edmund Exeter shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within such portion so to be separated from Saint Thomas Exeter.

"That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Saint Edmund Exeter but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Saint Thomas Exeter.

"That any inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Saint Edmund Exeter as they might have had in their Parish Church of Saint Thomas Exeter.

"That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portion so to be separated from Saint Thomas Exeter shall belong to the Incumbent of Saint Edmund Exeter.

"That the tithe rentcharge arising from the lands proposed to be separated from Saint Thomas Exeter and added to Saint Edmund Exeter shall remain the property of the Incumbent of Saint Thomas Exeter.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

**" CONSENTS.**

"We, the Right Reverend William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the Benefice of Saint Thomas Exeter (in case the same were now vacant) the Reverend Gordon Basil Nicholls Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas Exeter Toc H Incorporated the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice of Saint Edmund Exeter (in case the same were now vacant) and the Reverend Frank Oswald Urwin Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Edmund Exeter hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our respective hands and Toc H Incorporated have set their seal this sixteenth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

**W**HEREAS the Right Reverend Martin, Lord Bishop of Rochester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I Martin by Divine permission Bishop of Rochester do in pursuance of the twenty-sixth Section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, cap. 106, hereby represent to your Grace:—

"1. There is in the County of Kent and my Diocese of Rochester the Vicarage of Frindsbury the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the respective Ecclesiastical Parishes of Strood St. Mary Strood and Higham with Merston and contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of three thousand five hundred and forty-one and the net annual value thereof is Four hundred and forty-six pounds.

"2. In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of Strood the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury and contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of eight thousand three hundred and sixty-five and the net annual value thereof is Four hundred and twenty-two pounds.

"3. In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of St. Mary Strood the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury and contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of three thousand four hundred and thirty-nine and the net annual value thereof is Three hundred and sixty-six pounds.

"4. In the same County and Diocese is the United Benefice of Higham with Merston the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury and contains according to the Census of 1931 a population of one thousand six hundred and fifty-four and the net annual value thereof is Six hundred and nineteen pounds.

"5. The western portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury which lies to the west of Stonehorse Lane lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Frindsbury and adjacent to the said respective Ecclesiastical Parishes of Strood and Higham with Merston.

"6. The eastern portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Mary Strood lies at a distance from the Parish Church of St. Mary Strood and adjacent to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury.

"7. It appears to me that the following alterations in the boundaries of the said respective Parishes may be made with advantage to the interests of religion viz. :—

(a) The western portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury which lies to the west of Stonehorse Lane be united as to part thereof to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Strood and as to the remainder to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Higham with Merston.

(b) The eastern portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Mary Strood be united to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury.

"8. The Reverend Henry Frampton Shepherd is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Frindsbury and I the said Bishop of Rochester in right of my said Bishopric am the Patron thereof.

"9. The Reverend Frederick William Kay is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Strood and The Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary of Rochester are the Patrons thereof.

"10. The Reverend James Richard Foster is the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Higham with Merston and The Master Fellows and Scholars of the College of St. John the Evangelist in the University of Cambridge are the Patrons thereof.

"11. The Reverend Stanley Moorcroft Epps is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of St. Mary Strood and I the said Bishop of Rochester in right of my said Bishopric am the Patron thereof.

"12. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth Section of the said Act I the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the said Districts of the said Ecclesiastical Parishes Frindsbury and St. Mary Strood so proposed to be annexed to the said respective Parishes of Strood Higham with Merston and Frindsbury and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands Tithe rentcharges dues rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested.

"And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said respective Patrons and Incumbents of the said respective Parishes and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the Consents of the said respective Patrons and Incumbents thereto to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

#### "SCHEME.

"1. It is proposed to separate the following District from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury in the County of Kent and Diocese of Rochester and unite the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Ecclesiastical Parish of Strood aforesaid.

"Such District shall consist of all that portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury which is bounded on the north-west or west side thereof by the boundary of the City of Rochester on the north-east side thereof by the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Mary Strood and on the south or south-east side thereof by the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Strood.

"Such district is coloured yellow on the plan hereto annexed and thereon indicated by the letter 'A'.

"2. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury and unite the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Ecclesiastical Parish of Higham with Merston aforesaid.

"Such District shall consist of all that portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury which is bounded on the south side thereof by an imaginary line running along the centre of Watling Street on the south-east side thereof by the boundary of the City of Rochester on the east side thereof by an imaginary line running along the centre of Stonehorse Lane and on the north or north-west side thereof by the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Higham with Merston.

"Such District is coloured green on the plan hereto annexed and thereon indicated by the letter 'B'.

"3. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Mary Strood and unite the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury aforesaid.

"Such District shall consist of all that portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Mary Strood which lies to the north-east of an imaginary line running along the centre of Mill Road being bounded on all other sides by the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Frindsbury.

"Such District is coloured pink on the plan hereto annexed and is thereon indicated by the letter 'C'.

"The Inhabitants of the said Districts shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the respective Churches of the Parishes from which they are separated (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within any of the said Churches) but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Churches of the respective Parishes to which such Districts are respectively united and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates (Abolition) Act, 1868, to the repair of such last mentioned Churches.

"The Incumbent of the respective Parish to which each such District is united shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within



such District or Districts as are so united to his Parish.

"The Inhabitants of the said Districts shall have each and the same right to have marriages baptisms and christenings solemnised and performed in the Churches of the respective Parishes to which such Districts are respectively united.

"All fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said Districts shall henceforth belong to the Incumbents of the Parishes to which such Districts are respectively united.

"No alteration shall be made in the Patronage or in the Tithe Rentcharge or other endowments of the said Benefices or any of them.
