**SUPREME COURT, ENGLAND, FUNDS
RULES.**

Notice is hereby given in accordance with section 1 (1) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that after the expiration of at least 40 days from the date hereof, the Lord Chancellor, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, proposes to make rules amending the procedure relating to the payment of funds out of Court.

Notice is further given that under section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, the Lord Chancellor, with the same concurrence as aforesaid, has, on account of urgency, made the above Rules to come into operation forthwith, as Provisional Rules.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 2nd August, 1935, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 6th August, 1935, to Saturday, the 10th August, 1935, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

**FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS,
1901 TO 1929.**

In pursuance of Section 118 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, the Right Honourable Sir John Simon, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been pleased to appoint Miss Isobel Mary Lunn to be an Inspector of Factories and Workshops.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made Orders authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women and young persons over 16 years of age:—

(a) In cooking and packing potato crisps at the works of Messrs. Smith's Potato Crisps, Mill Lane, Portsmouth, subject to conditions as to weekly alternation of shifts and the provision of a cloakroom and messroom and washing facilities.

(b) In the tin plate lacquering and varnishing department at the works of The Pontnewydd Tin Stamping Co. Ltd., Pontnewydd, Newport, Mon., subject to similar conditions and to a condition that transport facilities may be required.

COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary for Mines gives notice that on the 8th day of July, 1935, he made General Regulations under Sections 85 and 86 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, amending the Coal Mines General Regulations (Rescue), 1928, to require that reviving apparatus provided and maintained at Central Rescue Stations and mines in pursuance of the Regulations shall be capable of supplying a mixture of carbon dioxide and oxygen instead of oxygen alone as hitherto.
