PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

DUNSTABLE GAS.

Application for a Special Order under the
Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Dunstable Gas and Water Company (hereinafter called "the Company") whose chief office is situate at Woodall House Lordship Lane Wood Green in the County of Middlesex intend to apply to the Board of Trade for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934 for all or some of the following purposes that is to say:—

To authorise the Company on the lands hereinafter described to erect maintain alter improve extend renew and use or discontinue gasworks machinery and apparatus and to make and store gas and to work up and convert the residual products of gas that is to say:—

First.—A piece of land in the Borough of Dunstable in the County of Bedford containing 1.174 acres or thereabouts being the close or piece of land numbered 86 on the ²⁵⁰⁰ Ordnance survey of the said County Sheet XXXII 2 (Edition of 1924).

To incorporate with the intended Order all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts and the Gasworks Clauses Acts 1847 and 1871 with modifications and exceptions and to exempt the Company from some of the provisions of those Acts and to amend or repeal
