"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, the New Parish of St. Barnabas, Gillingham, and the New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, all in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 12th day of September, 1863, and published in the London Gazette on the 15th day of the same month, part of the Parish of Gillingham in the said County and Diocese, was constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and the said District was named 'The District of Saint Mark, New Brompton':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 9th day of May, 1892, and published in the London Gazette on the 13th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham':

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 16th day of February, 1917, and published in the London Gazette on the 20th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Gillingham':

"And whereas the said District of Saint Mark, New Brompton, the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, have become New

Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Martin, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said Parish of Gillingham, and of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parish respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton; (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured blue shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Gillingham; and (thirdly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and of the said Parish of Gillingham, which are described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and Parish respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The First Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, in the

County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, comprising:—

"All that isolated portion of the Parish of Gillingham, and also all that contiguous portion of the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, both in the said County and Diocese, which taken together, are bounded upon the north-west partly by the main portion of the said Parish of Gillingham and partly by the said New Parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, upon the west and upon the south-west by the last mentioned New Parish, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east, upon the east, and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, of the said isolated portion of the Parish of Gillingham, and of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, all meet at the junction of Copenhagen Road and Gillingham Road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Gillingham Road (thereby following the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, from the said isolated portion of the Parish of Gillingham) for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Duncan Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Duncan Road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Balmoral Road, and extending thence first north-westward and then south-westward along the middle of Balmoral Road for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the bridge leading across the main line of the Eastern Section of the Southern Railway into High Street, and extending thence north-westward for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to the centre of such bridge upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, from the main portion of the said Parish of Gillingham.

"The Second Schedule.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and to be restored to the said Parish of Gillingham, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, which is bounded upon the east, upon the north-east, and upon the north-west by the said Parish of Gillingham, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Gillingham from the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, at the centre of the bridge which connects High Street with Balmoral Road, across the main line of the Eastern Section of the Southern Railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said bridge for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Balmoral Road, and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of Balmoral Road for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Gillingham Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Gillingham Road for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Livingstone Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Living-

stone Road for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Canadian Avenue, and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Canadian Avenue for a distance of 17½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Woodlands Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, from the said Parish of Gillingham.

"The Third Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, in the said County and Diocese, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and of the said Parish of Gillingham, which taken together are bounded upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the east, and upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, from the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, at a point in the middle of Canterbury Street opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the Gillingham (Infectious Diseases) Hospital, and extending thence eastward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of Gillingham Park, and extending thence south-eastward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of Park Avenue, and extending thence first eastward to and then northward along the middle of Park Avenue for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Seaton Road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Seaton Road for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Second Avenue, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Second Avenue for a distance of 26½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sturdee Avenue, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Sturdee Avenue for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Woodlands Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Woodlands Lane (thereby following the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, from the said Parish of Gillingham) for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Watling Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Watling Street (thereby continuing to follow the last mentioned boundary) for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Star Lane and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Star Lane for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Star Mill, and extending thence north-westward to and along the said footpath for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Gillingham from the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have with the exception hereinafter mentioned respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the New Parish of St. Barnabas, Gillingham, has not signified his assent to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since drafts of the said Scheme or Representation were transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Thurnscoe which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Hilda, Thurnscoe, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Thurnscoe'.

"And with the like consent of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Hilda, Thurnscoe, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same Church for the time being.

"And whereas the said George Brocklehurst, Alexander Hyslop Maxwell, Harold Chaloner Dowdall, Cyril Frederick Twitchett and Thomas Hollins Arden are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Princes Park, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Liverpool for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, now Bishop of Liverpool, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Princes Park, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Paul, Princes Park:

"Now therefore with the consent of the said George Brocklehurst, Alexander Hyslop Maxwell, Harold Chaloner Dowdall, Cyril Frederick Twitchett and Thomas Hollins Arden, being the persons whose consents as Patrons are required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consents they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Princes Park, shall be transferred to the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, and his

SCHEDULE.

The Durham District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended in the following manner:—

1. Clause 41A shall have effect as if for paragraph (i) there were substituted the following paragraph, that is to say:—

“(i) The Board shall on or before the 28th February in each year determine the export supply standard tonnage and inland supply standard tonnage of every coal mine for the period of six months commencing on the next following 1st April and shall on or before the 31st August in each year determine the export supply standard tonnage and inland supply standard tonnage of every coal mine for the period of six months commencing on the next following 1st October.”

2. Clause 41B shall have effect as if—

(a) for the words from the beginning of the Clause to the end of paragraph (i) thereof there were substituted the following words, that is to say:—

“41B. The export supply and inland supply standard tonnage of each coal mine for each period of six months as aforesaid shall be

determined by the Board in accordance with the following provisions, that is to say:—

(i) The Board shall ascertain the amounts of coal supplied for export supply and inland supply respectively from each coal mine during such previous period as is hereinafter mentioned (hereinafter called "the relevant period"), that is to say:—

(a) when the determination of export supply standard tonnage and inland supply standard tonnage is to be made for the period of six months commencing on any 1st April, the period of six months ended on the last preceding 30th September; and

(b) when such determination is to be made for the period of six months commencing on any 1st October the period of six months ended on the last preceding 31st March."

(b) there were substituted for the words from the beginning of paragraph (iii) down to the end of sub-paragraph (a) thereof the following words, that is to say:—

"(iii) Having ascertained the amounts specified in paragraph (i) and made the deduction provided for in paragraph (ii) of this Clause in the case of each coal mine, the Board shall determine the export supply and inland supply standard tonnages thereof at such amounts together not exceeding one half of the balance remaining after such deduction as aforesaid from the output standard tonnage of such coal mine as the Board shall think fit having regard to the following matters, that is to say:—

(a) the proportions in which coal supplied by the coal mine during the relevant period was disposed of for export supply and for inland supply respectively,

(aa) the proportion which the tonnage of coal supplied from the coal mine for export supply or for inland supply during the relevant period bore to the tonnage of coal supplied from all the coal mines in the District for export supply or for inland supply respectively during that period;" and

(c) In paragraph (v) thereof for the word "such" where that word first occurs there were substituted the word "any" and for the word "as" there were substituted the word "that".
