*"The Third Schedule.*

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, in the said County and Diocese, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, and of the said Parish of Gillingham, which taken together are bounded upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the east, and upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham, from the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, at a point in the middle of Canterbury Street opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the Gillingham (Infectious Diseases) Hospital, and extending thence eastward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of Gillingham Park, and extending thence south-eastward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of Park Avenue, and extending thence first eastward to and then northward along the middle of Park Avenue for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Seaton Road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Seaton Road for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Second Avenue, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Second Avenue for a distance of 26½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sturdee Avenue, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Sturdee Avenue for a distance of 1¼ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Woodlands Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Woodlands Lane (thereby following the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gillingham, from the said Parish of Gillingham) for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Watling Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Watling Street (thereby continuing to follow the last mentioned boundary) for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Star Lane and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Star Lane for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Star Mill, and extending thence north-westward to and along the said footpath for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Gillingham from the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Gillingham."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have with the exception hereinafter mentioned respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the New Parish of St. Barnabas, Gillingham, has not signified his assent to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since drafts of the said Scheme or Representation were transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 11th day of July, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Hilda, Thurnscoe, situate in the Parish of Thurnscoe, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:
