PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 24th day of July, 1935 (C.W. 144/35), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Order in Council dated the 26th day of February, 1934, Your Majesty was pleased to sanction special rates of gratuity on retirement, in lieu of retired pay, for Lieutenant Commanders and Lieutenants, R.N., subject to certain restrictions:

"And whereas we desire to extend to a limited number of Officers the option of retiring with gratuity as authorised by Your above mentioned Order in Council of the 26th day of February, 1934:

"And whereas we are of opinion that for such Officers the conditions governing the grant of these gratuities should be modified:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals:—

That the option of retiring with gratuity, in lieu of retired pay, may, at our discretion, be extended after the 1st day of January, 1935, to such Officers, provided they come within the other restrictions imposed by Your above mentioned Order in Council, except that the date to which seniority shall be calculated for the purpose of the amount of the gratuity payable shall be determined in accordance with rules agreed to by the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury and of the Admiralty:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Admiralty, dated the 24th day of July, 1935 (L. 3867/35), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of October, 1922, and by subsequent Orders in Council, to sanction the establishment of a Royal Marine Police Force, and rates of pay and conditions of service therein:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that extra remuneration should be paid to Royal Marine Police when employed as clerks at Headquarters in consideration of the additional responsibilities entailed in their appointments:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the grant of extra duty pay of 1s. a day to the two Sergeants of the Royal Marine Police employed as clerks on the Headquarters staff of the Chief Constable, Royal Marine Police, as from the 1st July, 1935.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas in view of the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1935, it is expedient that the said Clause should be modified in its application to officers employed in institutions maintained by the Board of Control under Sections 25 and 35 of the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913,

being officers of any class to which Section 10 of the Superannuation Act, 1935, applies:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Clause 15 of the said Order in Council of the 10th January, 1910, shall, in its application to officers employed in institutions maintained by the Board of Control under Sections 25 and 35 of the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913, being officers of any class to which Section 10 of the Superannuation Act, 1935, applies, have effect as though "fifty-five" and "sixty" were substituted for "sixty" and "sixty-five" respectively.

HEREAS by Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (61 & 62 Vict. c. 44) (hereinafter referred to as "the said Section"), it is, amongst other things, enacted, as follows:—

"3.—(1) On and after the commencement of this Act the general lighthouse authorities shall levy light dues with respect to the voyages made by ships or by way of periodical payment, and not with respect to the lights which a ship passes or from which it derives benefit, and the dues so levied shall take the place of the dues now levied by those authorities

"(2) The scale and rules set out in the Second Schedule to this Act shall have effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of this Act, but His Majesty may by Order in Council, alter, either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases, the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom ":

And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Orders set out in the Schedule hereto altering the said Scale and Rules:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Orders should be revoked to the extent herein-

after appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

1. The Orders in Council set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and are hereby revoked to the extent specified in the third column of the said Schedule.

2.—(a) This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1935, and shall have effect from the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

(b) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS by Sub-section (1) of Section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, (57 and 58 Vict., c. 60) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act) it is provided that where it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are or will be given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in that country His Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that Section shall apply in the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions and qualifications contained in the Order:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are given by the Governments of foreign countries specified in the Schedule

hereto for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in those countries:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the principal Act and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and doth hereby order and declare, as follows:-

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as "The Deserters from Foreign Ships (Newfoundland) Order, 1935 ".

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, (52-3 Vict., c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. Section 238 of the principal Act shall apply in the case of each of the foreign countries specified in the Schedule hereto with regard to any seamen or apprentice who deserts from a merchant ship belonging to a subject of any such foreign country \mathbf{when} Newfoundland.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 11th day of July, 1935, in the

words and figures following, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of West Wickham, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of West Wickham is a Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of West Wickham which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Archbishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Canterbury as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of West Wickham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Francis of Assisi, West Wickham'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a

New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors, Archbishops of Canterbury, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Francis of Assisi, West Wickham, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of West Wickham, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury, which is bounded upon the west by the Parish of Addington, in the County of Surrey and in the said Diocese of Canterbury, upon the north-west partly by the New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Beckenham, both in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which the said New Parish of divides Barnabas, Beckenham, from the said Parish of West Wickham crosses the middle of the Haves Branch Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 57½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the Hawes Down Council School, and extending thence first south-westward to and then first south-westward, then southeastward and then again south-westward along the said wall or fence for a distance in all of 14 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Hawes Lane, and extending thence first south-westward to and then south-eastward along the middle of Hawes Lane for a distance of 31/2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the southeastern side of Silver Lane, and extending thence south-westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 181 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the West Wickham Bowling Club Ground, and extending thence northwestward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Silver Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the southern side of Silver Lane for a distance of 5 yards

or thereabouts to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 87, Silver Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the houses and premises situate on the south-western side of Silver Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 2, Rose Walk, for a distance in all of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the southern side of Rose Walk, and extending thence first north-westward to and then south-westward along the middle of Rose Walk for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wickham Court Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Wickham Court Road for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Woodland Way, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Woodland Way for a distance of 58 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of West Wickham from the said Parish of Addington."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of West Wickham out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a

Scheme bearing date the 25th day of July, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 3rth and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Archdeaconries of Bradford and Craven, both in the Diocese of Bradford, and to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconries:

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Alfred, Bishop of Bradford, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said Archdeaconries of Bradford and Craven, and with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconries are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Alfred, Bishop of Bradford (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesias-tical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, (first) the Parishes of Bingley and the Holy Trinity, Bingley, both at present in the Rural Deanery of South Craven, in the said Archdeaconry of Craven, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Calverley, in the said Arch-deaconry of Bradford, and (secondly) the Parish of Addingham, at present in the Rural Deanery of Skipton, in the said Archdeaconry of Craven, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Otley, in the said Archdeaconry of Bradford, and each of the Parishes hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry to which it is hereby transferred and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or Archdeacon:

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas notices of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act been transmitted to the Archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Bradford and to the Archdeacon of Craven and they have severally expressed their approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Bradford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of July, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the (wnership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Cadbury, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Cadbury is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Reverend George Frederick Coleridge, of the Vicarage, Crowthorne, in the County of Berks, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Oxford:

"And whereas the said George Frederick Coleridge is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Cadbury now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Exeter for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, now Bishop of Exeter, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said William

Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Cadbury which is herebefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Cadbury:

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the 1st day of August, 1908, and published in the London Gazette on the 11th day of the same month it was directed, inter alia, that the Parsonage House of the Rectory of Saint Luke, Charlton, should be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and that the net proceeds arising from such sale should form one aggregate fund and should be applied (1) to the provision of a capital sum not exceeding £2,000 for or towards the acquisition of a suitable site for and the erection of or otherwise for the provision of a Parsonage House for a new district to be constituted wholly or in part out of the United Parish of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton, and (2) to the endowment or augmentation of the income of the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed new district:

wark:
"And whereas by another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 22nd day of March, 1928, and published in the London Gazette on the following day it was directed that out of the interest arising from the aggregate fund held by us and representing the proceeds of the sale of the said Parsonage House of the Benefice of Saint Luke, Charlton, a capital sum of £800 should be appropriated and should be applied by us towards the provision of a House of Residence for an Assistant Curate serving within the said United Parish:

"And whereas by another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 27th day of October, 1930, and published in the London Gazette on the 4th day of the following month, it was directed (first) that the capital sum of £800 hereinbefore mentioned should no longer be held by us towards the provision of a House of Residence for an Assistant Curate serving within the said United Parish but should fall back into and again form part of the said aggregate fund, (secondly) that out of the interest arising from such aggregate fund a second yearly sum of £100 should be appropriated and should be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton, to be applied by him towards the stipend of an Assistant Curate serving such United Parish upon condition that such Assistant Curate is in receipt of a stipend at a rate of not less than £250 per annum, and (thirdly) that the stipend of the Assistant Curate in respect of whose services the payment of £100 per annum mentioned in the said Order in Council of the 22nd day of December, 1921, is made, shall be at the rate of not less than £200 per annum instead of £250 per annum as therein mentioned :

sum of not less than £50 per annum:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, now Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), with the consent of Sir Spencer Pocklington Maryon Maryon-Wilson, Baronet, of Eastborne (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Parochial Church Council of the said United Parish of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton (in testimony of which consent this Scheme is signed by the Chairman presiding at a Meeting of the Parochial Church Council held for the purpose of giving such consent and by two other Members of the Council present at such Meeting), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the 1st day of May, 1935, first, the said Order in Council of the 22nd day of December, 1921, and those portions of the said Order in Council of the 1st day of August, 1908, relating to the said aggregate fund representing the proceeds of the sale of the Parsonage House of Saint Luke, Charlton, and also those portions of the said Order in Council of the 27th day of October, 1930, relating to the interest arising from and in respect of the said aggregate fund shall be rescinded; secondly, the said aggregate fund shall be held by us in equal moieties in respect of each of which moieties and of any further sums which may be added to such moieties as hereinafter mentioned there shall be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton, a yearly sum to be calculated at the rate of £3 per centum per annum and to be receivable in equal quarterly portions on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the

1st day of August, and the 1st day of November in each and every year: Provided always that the said yearly sum payable in respect of the first of such moieties shall be paid only upon the production to us on or after each of the said lastly mentioned days in each and every year of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwark that an Assistant Curate duly licensed by such Bishop has been employed within the said United Parish of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton, during the quarter of the year then ended and that such Assistant Curate is in receipt of a stipend at a rate of not less than £200 per annum: And provided further that the said yearly sum payable in respect of the second of such moieties shall be paid only upon the production of a like certificate that two Assistant Curates have been so employed and that each of such Assistant Curates is in receipt of a stipend at a rate of not less than £200 per annum: And provided further that any portion of either of the said yearly sums not so paid to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton, shall be added in equal shares to the capital of the said moieties, and thirdly, the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton, shall out of the income of the said United Benefice pay a stipend of not less than £50 per annum to an Assistant Curate to serve the said United Parish, such payment to be in lieu of and in substitution for the stipend of not less than £150 per annum hitherto payable for the same purpose by the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice under the provisions of the said Order in Council dated the 1st day of August, 1908.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

- "7. That the said William, Lord Archbishop of York, is Patron of both the said Benefices of Whitby and Lythe.
- "8. That the said incumbents and Patron of the said Benefices of Whitby and Lythe are consenting parties to the separation and annexation hereinafter proposed.
- "9. That the said District of Meadowfields is situate a distance of two miles from the Chapel of Ease of St. Hilda, Whitby, which is the nearest place of worship to it in that Parish, whereas the said District is only situate at a distance of one mile from the Church of Lythe, and there is also within the said Parish of Lythe a Chapel of Ease at Sandsend which is situate at a distance of only one-third of a mile from the said District of Meadowfields.
- "10. That it appears to us that the District known as Meadowfields above referred to might advantageously be separated from the said Parish of Whitby and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Lythe.
- "That in pursuance of the directions contained in the aforementioned Act the said Archbishop has prepared a scheme in writing attached to this report describing the mode in which it appears to him that the said separation and annexation might be best effected and that the alterations and changes consequent on such separation and annexation may be best effected with justice to all parties interested, and the said Archbishop being satisfied on full consideration and enquiry of such scheme he doth by this report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty together with the consents in writing to the same scheme of the Patron and Incumbents of the benefices to be affected to the intent that Your Majesty in Council, if in case it should be thought expedient and proper so to do, may make an Order for carrying the same into effect."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:-

" SCHEME.

"That that part of the Parish of Whitby which is comprised in the District known as Meadowfields and coloured pink on the plan attached hereto shall be separated from that Parish and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Lythe and that the Vicar of the said Parish of Lythe shall have exclusive charge of souls over the same.

"That all fees and payment arising from baptisms, churchings, marriages and all other ecclesiastical offices in respect of that portion of the said Parish of Whitby known as Meadowfields and also such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a Parish or benefice in respect of that portion of the said Parish of Whitby shall henceforth belong to and be received by the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Lythe.

"That the inhabitants of the said District of Meadowfields shall in future be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church and Churchyard of Lythe aforesaid and shall not henceforth be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church or Churchyard of Whitby.

"That the inhabitants of the said District of Meadowfields shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Parish Church of Whitby, but shall subject to the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, be liable as other inhabitants of the Parish of Lythe

to repair the Parish Church of Lythe. "That no alteration shall be made in respect of the endowment of either of the said

benefices of Whitby and Lythe.

"We, William, Lord Archbishop of York, the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory and Parish Church of Whitby and the Vicarage and Parish Church of Lythe in the Diocese of York, and I the Reverend Canon Frank Morris Sykes, M.A., the present Rector of the said Rectory and Parish Church of Whitby and I the Reverend Philip John Seymour Russell, the present Vicar of the said Vicarage and Parish Church of Lythe do hereby respectively signify our consent to the foregoing report and scheme.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:-

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF GEOLOGISTS IN THE GEOLOGICAL SURVEY OF GREAT BRITAIN AND THE MUSEUM OF PRACTICAL GEOLOGY.

(Under the Committee of the Privy Council for Scientific and Industrial Research.)

- N.B.—Competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held from time to time when occasion arises. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.
- 1. Candidates must have attained the age of 21 and must not have attained the age of 30 on the 1st April of the year in which the competition is held.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :-

- (a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.
- (b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.
- 2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Řegular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and up-bringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal Act.

- 3. The Committee of the Privy Council will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.
- No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before

his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for

appointment.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 5. Application shall be made in the first instance to the Director of the Survey and Museum who, after examining the candidates' credentials and a personal interview or such other means as the Director considers suitable, will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for any of the existing or prospective vacancies to the Lord President of the Council for nomination. Candidates thus nominated shall be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.
- 6. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general and technical, or general and technical together, as in their opinion fits them for the post. Candidates thus recommended and approved may at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners be submitted to a qualifying examination in English, Arithmetic and General Knowledge.
- 7. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage; but exception to the rule requiring resignation on marriage may, in exceptional circumstances, be made where the employment of a married woman is considered advisable in the light of her special qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department.

- 8. Candidates who have been approved by the Civil Service Commissioners and who, if required to take the qualifying examination, have passed that examination, will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their The Selection Board decision will be final. shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department, who shall be represented on the Selection Board, and one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, and recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.
- 9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment.

The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidates' work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces or otherwise.

10. If a qualifying examination is held, each candidate admitted thereto will be required to pay a fee of £3. A Selected Candidate will be required to pay a fee of £8, towards which the fee paid at the qualifying examination (if any) will count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.
