Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Orders in Council set out in the Schedule hereto shall be and are hereby revoked to the extent specified in the third column of the said Schedule.

2.—(a) This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1935, and shall have effect from the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

(b) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS by Sub-section (1) of Section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, (57 and 58 Vict., c. 60) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act) it is provided that where it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are or will be given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in that country His Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that Section shall apply in the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions and qualifications contained in the Order:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are given by the Governments of foreign countries specified in the Schedule

hereto for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in those countries:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the principal Act and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and doth hereby order and declare, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as "The Deserters from Foreign Ships (Newfoundland) Order, 1935".

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, (52-3 Vict., c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. Section 238 of the principal Act shall apply in the case of each of the foreign countries specified in the Schedule hereto with regard to any seamen or apprentice who deserts from a merchant ship belonging to a subject of any such foreign country when within Newfoundland.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 11th day of July, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of West Wickham, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:
