

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

“ SCHEME.

“ That that part of the Parish of Whitby which is comprised in the District known as Meadowfields and coloured pink on the plan attached hereto shall be separated from that Parish and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Lythe and that the Vicar of the said Parish of Lythe shall have exclusive charge of souls over the same.

“ That all fees and payment arising from baptisms, churchings, marriages and all other ecclesiastical offices in respect of that portion of the said Parish of Whitby known as Meadowfields and also such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a Parish or benefice in respect of that portion of the said Parish of Whitby shall henceforth belong to and be received by the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Lythe.

“ That the inhabitants of the said District of Meadowfields shall in future be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church and Churchyard of Lythe aforesaid and shall not henceforth be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church or Churchyard of Whitby.

“ That the inhabitants of the said District of Meadowfields shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Parish Church of Whitby, but shall subject to the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, be liable as other inhabitants of the Parish of Lythe to repair the Parish Church of Lythe.

“ That no alteration shall be made in respect of the endowment of either of the said benefices of Whitby and Lythe.

“ CONSENTS.

“ We, William, Lord Archbishop of York, the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory and Parish Church of Whitby and the Vicarage and Parish Church of Lythe in the Diocese of York, and I the Reverend Canon Frank Morris Sykes, M.A., the present Rector of the said Rectory and Parish Church of Whitby and I the Reverend Philip John Seymour Russell, the present Vicar of the said Vicarage and Parish Church of Lythe do hereby respectively signify our consent to the foregoing report and scheme.

“ Given under our hands this twenty-eighth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.
