PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of August, 1935 (L. 3199/35), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 13th October, 1922, 29th March, 1926, and 19th April, 1933, to authorise us, inter alia, to award gratuities under the conditions set forth therein, to Commissioned and Warrant Officers, Inspectors, Sergeants and Constables of Your Majesty's Royal Marine Police Force on discharge from that Force:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that the rates of such gratuities should be revised in the case of future entries into the Force in the ratings of Inspector, Sergeant and Constable, and further that the rules for the computation of gratuities to new entrants

into these ratings should be amended to conform with those already in force for Commissioned and Warrant ranks of the Force:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be pleased to direct by Your Order in Council that discharge gratuities to Inspectors, Sergeants and Constables who enter the Force for the first time, or who re-enlist after a break in their previous service in the Force, on or after the 1st day of September, 1935, shall be payable at our discretion, subject to the general rules and conditions set forth in respect of gratuities payable to the Royal Marine Police Force, at the rates of 50s., 21s. and 17s. respectively, for each completed calendar month of service in the ratings of Inspector, Sergeant and Constable, subject to a maximum of £450 in the case of Inspectors; and further, that service rendered by these Non-commissioned Officers and men in a lower rating shall earn only the rate of gratuity appropriate to that rating, and residuary periods of less than one calendar month shall be treated as though served in the next lower rating:

"We beg leave further to recommend that Your Majesty may be pleased to direct that the rates of gratuity proposed above shall be liable to revision periodically as Your Majesty in Council may be graciously pleased from time to time to direct.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the foregoing proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 7th day of August, 1935 (N.2963/35), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Orders in Council bearing the dates 11th day of October, 1921, 4th day of November, 1925 and 1st day of June, 1926, to sanction the payment of allowances to ratings employed as or under training for Telegraphist Air Gunners :

"And whereas we have had under consideration the provision of additional personnel required to be trained in air duties in consequence of the expansion of the Fleet Air Arm :

"And whereas we consider that the requirements will best be met by the gradual replacement of the existing rating of Telegraphist Air Gunner by a new non-substantive rating for Seaman, Signal and Telegraphist ratings, to be called Air Gunner, and the introduction of new higher non-substantive ratings to be called Acting Observer's Mate and Observer's Mate :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals :—

(1) The non-substantive ratings of Observer's Mate, Acting Observer's Mate and Air Gunner to be established, with the following rates of pay :—

(3) Ratings in receipt of non-substantive pay and allowances as in (1) and (2) above not to be paid for any other non-substantive ratings that they may hold.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 10th August, 1921, sanctioned an allowance of 3d. a day, as Royal Marine Signaller, to Royal Marines qualified in Naval Examination Service Signalling and Army Signalling :

"And whereas extra duty pay of 6d. a day was prescribed by Your Order in Council of 19th December, 1923, for Signal Training Instructors employed at Royal Marine Establishments on shore, and a similar allowance for actual days of employment on instructional duties was sanctioned by Your Order in Council of 15th May, 1930, for Royal Marine Signalling Instructors borne afloat :

"And whereas we consider that the position of these non-commissioned Officers and men should be improved by a revision of the rates of their extra remuneration :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the grant of non-substantive pay with effect as from 24th July, 1935, as follows :—

6d. a day, as Royal Marine Signaller 1st class, to one-third of the number of Royal Marine Signallers borne;

3d. a day, as Royal Marine Signaller 2nd class, to the remainder;

1s. a day (inclusive) to Royal Marine Signalling Instructors ashore and afloat.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, 28 & 29 Vict. c. 125, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary, with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards, or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the lights or signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collisions to be taken by His Majesty's vessels and other vessels navigating the waters of the Port and of the approaches thereto:

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act, certain regulations and rules were made by Order in Council, dated the 19th day of May, 1931, S.R. & O. 1931, No. 424, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth:

And whereas it appears expedient to amend such regulations as hereinafter provided:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, 56 & 57 Vict. c. 66, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, and on the recommendation of the Admiralty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.

2. Clause 31 of the First Schedule of said Order in Council dated the 19th day of May, 1931, is hereby repealed.

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870, 33 & 34 Vict. c. 52, to 1932, 22 & 23 Geo. 5 c. 39, it was amongst other things

enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State: and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 21st March, 1890, the 26th June, 1901, and the 11th February, 1907, the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, were respectively made applicable in the case of the United States of America under and in accordance with the several Conventions concluded between His Majesty and the President of the United States on the 12th July, 1889, the 13th December, 1900, and the 12th April, 1905:

And whereas, under the provisions of Article 14 of the Treaty signed on the 22nd day of December, 1931, between His Majesty and the President of the United States of America for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the United States of America (Extradition) Order in Council, 1935, and are as follows:—

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India,

And the President of the United States of America;

Desiring to make more adequate provision for the reciprocal extradition of criminals,

Have resolved to conclude a Treaty for that purpose, and to that end have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:—

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

for Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

The Right Honourable Sir John Simon, G.C.S.I., M.P., His Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

And the President of the United States of America;

General Charles G. Dawes, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America at the Court of St. James;

who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article 3, committed within the jurisdiction of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

ARTICLE 2.

For the purposes of the present Treaty the territory of His Britannic Majesty shall be deemed to be Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, and all parts of His Britannic Majesty's

dominions overseas other than those enumerated in Article 14, together with the territories enumerated in Article 16 and any territories to which it may be extended under Article 17. It is understood that in respect of all territory of His Britannic Majesty as above defined other than Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, and the Isle of Man, the present Treaty shall be applied so far as the laws permit.

For the purposes of the present Treaty the territory of the United States shall be deemed to be all territory wherever situated belonging to the United States, including its dependencies and all other territories under its exclusive administration or control.

ARTICLE 3.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

1. Murder (including assassination, paricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
4. Rape.
5. Unlawful carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have unlawful carnal knowledge, of a girl under 16 years of age.
6. Indecent assault if such crime or offence be indictable in the place where the accused or convicted person is apprehended.
7. Kidnapping or false imprisonment.
8. Child stealing, including abandoning, exposing or unlawfully detaining.
9. Abduction.
10. Procurer: that is to say the procuring or transporting of a woman or girl under age, even with her consent, for immoral purposes, or of a woman or girl over age, by fraud, threats, or compulsion, for such purposes with a view in either case to gratifying the passions of another person provided that such crime or offence is punishable by imprisonment for at least one year or by more severe punishment.
11. Bigamy.
12. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
13. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
14. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
15. Arson.
16. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny or embezzlement.
17. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, or fraudulent conversion.
18. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods, by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.
- 19.—(a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.
(b) Knowingly and without lawful authority making or having in possession any instrument, tool, or

engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of coin.

20. Forgery, or uttering what is forged.
21. Crimes or offences against bankruptcy law.
22. Bribery, defined to be the offering, giving or receiving of bribes.
23. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.
24. Crimes or offences or attempted crimes or offences in connection with the traffic in dangerous drugs.
25. Malicious injury to property, if such crime or offence be indictable.
- 26.—(a) Piracy by the law of nations.
(b) Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master; wrongfully sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting to do so; assaults on board a ship on the high seas, with intent to do grievous bodily harm.
27. Dealing in slaves.

Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes or offences, provided that such participation be punishable by the laws of both High Contracting Parties.

ARTICLE 4.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to, for the crime or offence for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be under examination or under punishment in the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to for any other crime or offence, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE 5.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime or offence or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the High Contracting Party applying or applied to.

ARTICLE 6.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the crime or offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for a crime or offence of a political character.

ARTICLE 7.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in custody or be brought to trial in the territories of the High Contracting Party to whom the surrender has been made for any other crime or offence or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning, to the territories of the High Contracting Party by whom he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes or offences committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE 8.

The extradition of fugitive criminals under the provisions of this Treaty shall be carried out in the United States and in the territory of His Britannic Majesty respectively, in conformity with the laws regulating extradition for the time being in force in the territory from which the surrender of the fugitive criminal is claimed.

ARTICLE 9.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the High Contracting Party applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime or offence had been committed in the territory of such High Contracting Party, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the courts of the High Contracting Party who makes the requisition, and that the crime or offence of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the High Contracting Party applied to.

ARTICLE 10.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed within their respective jurisdictions, his extradition shall be granted to the Power whose claim is earliest in date, unless such claim is waived.

ARTICLE 11.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the High Contracting Party applied to, or the proper tribunal of such High Contracting Party, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE 12.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, and any articles that may serve as a proof of the crime or offence shall be given up when the extradition takes place, in so far as this may be permitted by the law of the High Contracting Party granting the extradition.

ARTICLE 13.

All expenses connected with the extradition shall be borne by the High Contracting Party making the application.

ARTICLE 14.

His Britannic Majesty may accede to the present Treaty on behalf of any of His Dominions hereafter named—that is to say, the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State, and Newfoundland—and India. Such accession shall be effected by a notice to that effect given by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty at Washington which shall specify the authority

to which the requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in the Dominion concerned, or India, as the case may be, shall be addressed. From the date when such notice comes into effect the territory of the Dominion concerned or of India shall be deemed to be territory of His Britannic Majesty for the purposes of the present Treaty.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of the above-mentioned Dominions or India, on behalf of which His Britannic Majesty has acceded, shall be made by the appropriate diplomatic or consular officer of the United States of America.

Either High Contracting Party may terminate this Treaty separately in respect of any of the above-mentioned Dominions or India. Such termination shall be effected by a notice given in accordance with the provisions of Article 18.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of one of His Britannic Majesty's Dominions may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, and which is being administered by the Government of the Dominion concerned; such territory shall, if so included, be deemed to be territory of His Britannic Majesty for the purposes of the present Treaty. Any notice given under the third paragraph of this Article shall be applicable to such mandated territory.

ARTICLE 15.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any territory of His Britannic Majesty other than Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man, or the Dominions or India mentioned in Article 14, shall be made to the Governor, or chief authority, of such territory by the appropriate consular officer of the United States of America.

Such requisition shall be dealt with by the competent authorities of such territory: provided, nevertheless, that if an order for the committal of the fugitive criminal to prison to await surrender shall be made, the said Governor or chief authority may, instead of issuing a warrant for the surrender of such fugitive, refer the matter to His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

ARTICLE 16.

This Treaty shall apply in the same manner as if they were Possessions of His Britannic Majesty to the following British Protectorates, that is to say, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Gambia Protectorate, Kenya Protectorate, Nigeria Protectorate, Northern Rhodesia, Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, Nyasaland, Sierra Leone Protectorate, Solomon Islands Protectorate, Somaliland Protectorate, Swaziland, Uganda Protectorate and Zanzibar, and to the following territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, that is to say, Camerouns under British mandate, Togoland under British mandate, and the Tanganyika Territory.

ARTICLE 17.

If after the signature of the present Treaty it is considered advisable to extend its provisions to any British Protectorates other than those mentioned in the preceding Article or to any British-protected State, or to any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, other than those mandated territories mentioned in Articles 14 and 16, the stipulations of Articles 14 and 15 shall be deemed to apply to such Protectorates or States or mandated territories from the date and in the manner prescribed in the notes to be exchanged for the purpose of effecting such extension.

ARTICLE 18.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

In the absence of an express provision to that effect, a notice given under the first paragraph of this Article shall not affect the operation of the Treaty as between the United States of America and any territory in respect of which notice of accession has been given under Article 14.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

On the coming into force of the present Treaty the provisions of Article 10 of the treaty of the 9th August, 1842, of the Convention of the 12th July, 1889, of the supplementary Convention of the 13th December, 1900, and of the supplementary Convention of the 12th April, 1905, relative to extradition, shall cease to have effect, save that in the case of each of the Dominions and India, mentioned in Article 14, those provisions shall remain in force until such Dominion or India shall have acceded to the present Treaty in accordance with Article 14 or until replaced by other treaty arrangements.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate at London this twenty-second day of December, 1931.

His Majesty has acceded to the said Treaty in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia (including Papua and Norfolk Island):

And whereas His Majesty has been advised by His Ministers in the Commonwealth of Australia to take the necessary steps to cause the said recited Acts to be applied in the case of the United States of America in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia (including Papua and Norfolk Island), in accordance with the said Treaty:

And whereas in accordance with the provisions of Article 18 of the said Treaty on the coming into force thereof, the above-mentioned Conventions and the provisions of Article 10 of the Treaty signed on the 9th August, 1842, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the President of the United States of America

will cease to have effect in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia (including Papua and Norfolk Island) on the accession of that Dominion to the said Treaty:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) From and after the 30th day of August, 1935, the Extradition Acts, 1870-1932, shall apply in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia (including Papua and Norfolk Island) in the case of the United States of America under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 22nd December, 1931:

(2) From and after the 30th day of August, 1935, the said Orders in Council shall be revoked in so far as they relate to the Commonwealth of Australia (including Papua and Norfolk Island).

This Order may be cited as the "United States of America (Extradition: Commonwealth of Australia) Order in Council, 1935."

And whereas, under the provisions of Article 14 of the Treaty signed on the 22nd day of December, 1931, between His Majesty and the President of the United States of America for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the United States of America (Extradition) Order in Council, 1935, and are as follows:—

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India,

And the President of the United States of America;

Desiring to make more adequate provision for the reciprocal extradition of criminals,

Have resolved to conclude a Treaty for that purpose, and to that end have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:—

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

for Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

The Right Honourable Sir John Simon, G.C.S.I., M.P., His Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

And the President of the United States of America;

General Charles G. Dawes, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America at the Court of St. James;

who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article 3, committed within the jurisdiction of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

ARTICLE 2.

For the purposes of the present Treaty the territory of His Britannic Majesty shall be deemed to be Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, and all parts of His Britannic Majesty's dominions overseas other than those enumerated in Article 14, together with the territories enumerated in Article 16 and any territories to which it may be extended under Article 17. It is understood that in respect of all territory of His Britannic Majesty as above defined other than Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, and the Isle of Man, the present Treaty shall be applied so far as the laws permit.

For the purposes of the present Treaty the territory of the United States shall be deemed to be all territory wherever situated belonging to the United States, including its dependencies and all other territories under its exclusive administration or control.

ARTICLE 3.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
4. Rape.
5. Unlawful carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have unlawful carnal knowledge, of a girl under 16 years of age.
6. Indecent assault if such crime or offence be indictable in the place where the accused or convicted person is apprehended.

7. Kidnapping or false imprisonment.
8. Child stealing, including abandoning, exposing or unlawfully detaining.
9. Abduction.
10. Procuration: that is to say the procuring or transporting of a woman or girl under age, even with her consent, for immoral purposes, or of a woman or girl over age, by fraud, threats, or compulsion, for such purposes with a view in either case to gratifying the passions of another person provided that such crime or offence is punishable by imprisonment for at least one year or by more severe punishment.
11. Bigamy.
12. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
13. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
14. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
15. Arson.
16. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny or embezzlement.
17. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, or fraudulent conversion.
18. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods, by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.
- 19.—(a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.
(b) Knowingly and without lawful authority making or having in possession any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of coin.
20. Forgery, or uttering what is forged.
21. Crimes or offences against bankruptcy law.
22. Bribery, defined to be the offering, giving or receiving of bribes.
23. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.
24. Crimes or offences or attempted crimes or offences in connection with the traffic in dangerous drugs.
25. Malicious injury to property, if such crime or offence be indictable.
- 26.—(a) Piracy by the law of nations.
(b) Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master; wrongfully sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting to do so; assaults on board a ship on the high seas, with intent to do grievous bodily harm.
27. Dealing in slaves.

Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes or offences, provided that such participation be punishable by the laws of both High Contracting Parties.

ARTICLE 4.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in

the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to, for the crime or offence for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be under examination or under punishment in the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to for any other crime or offence, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE 5.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime or offence or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the High Contracting Party applying or applied to.

ARTICLE 6.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the crime or offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for a crime or offence of a political character.

ARTICLE 7.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in custody or be brought to trial in the territories of the High Contracting Party to whom the surrender has been made for any other crime or offence or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning, to the territories of the High Contracting Party by whom he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes or offences committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE 8.

The extradition of fugitive criminals under the provisions of this Treaty shall be carried out in the United States and in the territory of His Britannic Majesty respectively, in conformity with the laws regulating extradition for the time being in force in the territory from which the surrender of the fugitive criminal is claimed.

ARTICLE 9.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the High Contracting Party applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime or offence had been committed in the territory of such High Contracting Party, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the courts of the High Contracting Party who makes the requisition, and that the crime or offence of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the High Contracting Party applied to.

ARTICLE 10.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed within their

respective jurisdictions, his extradition shall be granted to the Power whose claim is earliest in date, unless such claim is waived.

ARTICLE 11.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the High Contracting Party applied to, or the proper tribunal of such High Contracting Party, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE 12.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, and any articles that may serve as a proof of the crime or offence shall be given up when the extradition takes place, in so far as this may be permitted by the law of the High Contracting Party granting the extradition.

ARTICLE 13.

All expenses connected with the extradition shall be borne by the High Contracting Party making the application.

ARTICLE 14.

His Britannic Majesty may accede to the present Treaty on behalf of any of His Dominions hereafter named—that is to say, the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State, and Newfoundland—and India. Such accession shall be effected by a notice to that effect given by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty at Washington which shall specify the authority to which the requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in the Dominion concerned, or India, as the case may be, shall be addressed. From the date when such notice comes into effect the territory of the Dominion concerned or of India shall be deemed to be territory of His Britannic Majesty for the purposes of the present Treaty.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of the above-mentioned Dominions or India, on behalf of which His Britannic Majesty has acceded, shall be made by the appropriate diplomatic or consular officer of the United States of America.

Either High Contracting Party may terminate this Treaty separately in respect of any of the above-mentioned Dominions or India. Such termination shall be effected by a notice given in accordance with the provisions of Article 18.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of one of His Britannic Majesty's Dominions may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, and which is being administered by the Government of the Dominion concerned; such territory shall, if so included, be deemed to be territory of His Britannic Majesty for the purposes of the present Treaty. Any notice given under the third paragraph of this Article shall be applicable to such mandated territory.

ARTICLE 15.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any territory of His Britannic Majesty other than Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man, or the Dominions or India mentioned in Article 14, shall be made to the Governor, or chief authority, of such territory by the appropriate consular officer of the United States of America.

Such requisition shall be dealt with by the competent authorities of such territory: provided, nevertheless, that if an order for the committal of the fugitive criminal to prison to await surrender shall be made, the said Governor or chief authority may, instead of issuing a warrant for the surrender of such fugitive, refer the matter to His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

ARTICLE 16.

This Treaty shall apply in the same manner as if they were Possessions of His Britannic Majesty to the following British Protectorates, that is to say, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Gambia Protectorate, Kenya Protectorate, Nigeria Protectorate, Northern Rhodesia, Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, Nyasaland, Sierra Leone Protectorate, Solomon Islands Protectorate, Somaliland Protectorate, Swaziland, Uganda Protectorate and Zanzibar, and to the following territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, that is to say, Cameroons under British mandate, Togoland under British mandate, and the Tanganyika Territory.

ARTICLE 17.

If after the signature of the present Treaty it is considered advisable to extend its provisions to any British Protectorates other than those mentioned in the preceding Article or to any British-protected State, or to any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, other than those mandated territories mentioned in Articles 14 and 16, the stipulations of Articles 14 and 15 shall be deemed to apply to such Protectorates or States or mandated territories from the date and in the manner prescribed in the notes to be exchanged for the purpose of effecting such extension.

ARTICLE 18.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

In the absence of an express provision to that effect, a notice given under the first paragraph of this Article shall not affect the operation of the Treaty as between the United States of America and any territory in respect of which notice of accession has been given under Article 14.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

On the coming into force of the present Treaty the provisions of Article 10 of the treaty of the 9th August, 1842, of the Convention of the 12th July, 1889, of the supplementary Convention of the 13th December, 1900, and of the supplementary Convention of the 12th April, 1905, relative to extradition, shall cease to have effect, save that in the case of each of the Dominions and India, mentioned in Article 14, those provisions shall remain in force until such Dominion or India shall have acceded to the present Treaty in accordance with Article 14 or until replaced by other treaty arrangements.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate at London this twenty-second day of December, 1931.

His Majesty has acceded to the said Treaty in respect of Newfoundland:

And whereas in accordance with the provisions of Article 18 of the said Treaty, the above-mentioned Conventions and the provisions of Article 10 of the Treaty signed on the 9th August, 1842, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the President of the United States of America will cease to have effect in respect of Newfoundland on the accession of that territory to the said Treaty:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

(1) From and after the 30th day of August, 1935, the Extradition Acts, 1870-1932, shall apply in respect of Newfoundland in the case of the United States of America under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 22nd December, 1931:

(2) From and after the 30th day of August, 1935, the said Orders in Council shall be revoked in so far as they relate to Newfoundland.

This Order may be cited as the "United States of America (Extradition: Newfoundland) Order in Council, 1935".

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870, 33 & 34 Vict. c. 52, to 1932, 22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 39, it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive

criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 3rd day of December, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals which Treaty was amended by a Declaration signed on the 26th day of June, 1901:

And whereas the said Treaty and Declaration were duly ratified:

And whereas under the provisions of Article 3 of the Supplementary Convention signed on the 29th day of October, 1934, between His Majesty and the Federal President of Austria for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the Austrian (Extradition) Order in Council, 1935, and are as follows:—

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India and the Federal President of Austria,

Desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention to this end and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Sir Walford Selby, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Vienna:

The Federal President of Austria:

M. Egon Berger-Waldenegg, Minister for Foreign Affairs;

who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention Article 2 of the Extradition Treaty, signed at Vienna on the 3rd December, 1873, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:—

"Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made."

ARTICLE 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Austria on the one hand and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is

exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

ARTICLE 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty The King may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty at Vienna. From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between Austria on the one hand and, on the other, the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

ARTICLE 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their seals.

And whereas by an Order in Council made the 10th January, 1910, known generally as "The Civil Service (Consolidated) Order in Council, 1910" certain regulations were made with respect to persons employed in His Majesty's civil establishments:

And whereas by "The Consular Service Order in Council, 1921" certain regulations made in "The Civil Service (Consolidated) Order in Council, 1910" were applied to pensionable officers in the Consular Service of His Majesty:

And whereas it is expedient to vary the terms of the said "Consular Service Order in Council, 1921", in respect of certain of the said officers:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall apply to all members of His Majesty's Consular Service to whom a superannuation allowance on retirement without a medical certificate at the age of 55 years may be granted under the Superannuation Acts, 1834 to 1935, and any Acts amending those Acts.

2. In respect of all members of His Majesty's Consular Service to whom this Order applies, the following provisions shall be substituted for the second and third paragraphs of Article 2 of "The Consular Service Order in Council, 1921":—

It shall be competent for the Secretary of State to call upon any consular officer to retire at any time after reaching the age of 55 on such pension as by the length of his service he is qualified to receive.

Retirement shall be compulsory for every officer on attaining 60 years of age, but in special cases the Treasury may, at the instance of the Secretary of State, extend an officer's employment for a further period not exceeding five years on being satisfied that such officer's retirement at 60 would be detrimental to the interests of the public service.

3. Nothing in the preceding article shall affect the power of the Secretary of State to require any officer to retire from the Consular Service if he has ceased, from whatever cause, to be fully competent for the purpose of his duties.

4. This Order may be cited as "The Consular Service Order in Council, 1935" and shall be read as one with "The Consular Service Order in Council, 1921", and "The Consular Service Order in Council, 1896".

5. This Order shall come into force forthwith.

And whereas by Section 5 of the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890 (53 and 54 Vict., c. 37), it is enacted amongst other things that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that all or any of the enactments described in the First Schedule to that Act shall extend to any foreign country in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of Section 36 of the Act it is enacted that the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, shall have effect as if the provisions of Part I of the Act were included amongst such last mentioned enactments:

And whereas by paragraph (a) of sub-section (3) of Section 36 of the Act it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that any provision of Part I of the Act which is expressed to apply only to British ships registered in the United Kingdom shall apply to British ships registered in any country or part of His Majesty's dominions to which the provisions of Part I of the Act can be extended by virtue of the foregoing provisions of the said Section:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the hereinbefore recited Acts and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and doth hereby direct, as follows:—

1. The provisions of Section 29 of the Act shall extend to the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands, to the colonies, and to foreign countries in which for the time being His Majesty exercises jurisdiction, and shall apply to British ships registered in any of such territories.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Helm Orders) Order, 1935.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in the exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Indian and Colonial Divorce Jurisdiction Act, 1926, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order in Council may be cited as the Hong Kong Divorce Jurisdiction Order in Council, 1935.

2. On and after the first day of January, 1936, the provisions of the first Section of the Indian and Colonial Divorce Jurisdiction Act, 1926, shall apply to the Colony of Hong Kong in like manner as they apply to India.

3. In the application of the said provisions to the said Colony:—

(a) The Court which is to exercise the jurisdiction thereby conferred shall be the Supreme Court of Hong Kong, and references in the said first Section to a High Court in India shall be read as references to such Supreme Court;

(b) references in the said first Section to India shall be read as references to the Colony of Hong Kong; and

(c) the reference to the Secretary of State in Council of India in the said Section shall be read as referring to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANT KEEPERS (SECOND CLASS) IN THE BRITISH MUSEUM (NATURAL HISTORY).

N.B.—Competitions under these Regulations are open both to men and women. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 22, and shall as a rule not exceed the age of 26 on the 1st April of the year in which the competition is held, but in special circumstances candidates above 26 may be admitted with the approval of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners. Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject. Provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible, provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject; and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The Trustees of the British Museum will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. Application shall be made in the first instance to the Director of the British Museum (Natural History), who, after examining the candidate's credentials and a personal interview, will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for any of the existing or prospective vacancies to the Principal Trustees for approval of their candidature. Candidates thus approved shall be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

6. **REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION
OF ASSISTANTS IN THE NATIONAL LIBRARY OF
SCOTLAND.**

N.B.—Competitions under these Regulations are open both to men and women. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held only on the occurrence of vacancies. The regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and shall as a rule not have attained the age of 26 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part, but in special circumstances candidates above the age of 26 or below the age of 22 may be admitted with the approval of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may

deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3.
