#### REGULATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT AS NATURALIST (MALE) ON THE SCIENTIFIC STAFF OF THE FISHERY BOARD FOR SCOTLAND.

N.B.—*These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held from time to time on the occurrence of vacancies.*

1. Application for appointment must be made to the Secretary of the Fishery Board for Scotland at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Fishery Board. When vacancies occur, the Fishery Board will cause notice to be given by advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

2. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 26 on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications. Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

3. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

4. Candidates must have studied science at a University and have taken a degree. Account will be taken of the ability indicated by the degree and of the suitability to the vacancy or vacancies to be filled of the subjects studied for the degree and in any post-graduate study. The subjects in general most suitable are Zoology, Physiology and Botany; also Chemistry, and Mathematics in its bearing upon the statistical analysis of biological problems. Emphasis may be placed upon one or other of these branches of science according to the nature of the vacancy or vacancies to be filled.

5. The completed application forms will be scrutinised by the Fishery Board and those candidates who appear to satisfy the conditions of these regulations will be interviewed by a Selection Board consisting of representatives of the Fishery Board and a representative of the Civil Service Commission.

6. The Selection Board will prepare a list in order of merit of those candidates whom they consider suitable for appointment.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's previous work.

7. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Fishery Board for Scotland.

8. A fee of £3 will be payable by selected candidates on the issue of their certificates of qualification.

The Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray; and except the parish of North Uist and all the islands therein, together with the island of Berneray in the parish of Harris and all the grazing islands attached thereto*), in the county of Inverness.

*Kent and East Sussex.*—An Area comprising:—

The administrative counties of Kent and East Sussex (including all the Boroughs geographically situated therein) and also comprising the City of Rochester, the City and County Borough of Canterbury, and the County Boroughs of Brighton, Eastbourne and Hastings.

The following Areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II and "Double Dipping Areas" for the purposes of Part III of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

*North Wales.*—An area comprising:—

The counties of Caernarvon, Denbigh, Flint (*except the Petty Sessional Division of Overton*), Merioneth and Montgomery.

The parishes of Brompton and Rhiston, and Chirbury, in the County of Salop.

The movement of sheep out of the following areas is regulated by the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934, as amended by the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934 (No. 3), the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1935, the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1935 (No. 2), and the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1935 (No. 3). Areas 1, 3 and 4 are also Double Dipping Areas for the purposes of Part III of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928.

*Area No. 1.*

So much of the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway line from Kirkby Stephen to Hawes Junction passes over the main Garsdale Road north-east of Garsdale Head, thence in a generally southerly direction along the said railway via Hawes Junction, Dent Station, Ribbleshead Station, Horton Station, Stainforth and Settle to the point where it joins the Branch line from Clapham Station; thence in a north-westerly direction along the latter railway via Giggleswick Station to Clapham Station; thence in a westerly direction along the railway via High Bentham Station to the point near Lower Bentham where the Railway is carried over the road from Oxenforth Green to Lower Bentham; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Lower Bentham, Wards End, Four Lane Ends, Sunderland House, and Burton-in-Lonsdale, to the point where the road crosses the county boundary at Standerber; thence following the county boundary in a north-easterly direction via Ireby Beck, Ireby Fell and Gragareth to the Stone marking the boundary of the counties of Lancaster, Westmorland and the West Riding of Yorkshire at Blea Gills; thence following the county boundary wall via Crag Hill to the point where it joins the wall enclosing the High Short Gill Allotment; thence along the east side of this wall and the wall enclosing the Short Gill Allotment to the point where it joins the Barbon-Dent road; thence in a south-westerly direction along the latter road to the point where it meets the wall separating the counties of Westmorland and the West Riding of Yorkshire; thence in a generally northerly direction along the said wall via Calf Top and Long Bank to the point where it meets the southern and eastern wall of the Green Edges Allotment; thence along the latter wall and the eastern wall of Holme Fell Allotments to the point where it is crossed by the London Midland and Scottish Railway line from Sedbergh to Kirkby Lonsdale; thence north along the
