TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th September, 1935, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th September, 1935, to Saturday, the 21st September, 1935, inclusive,

and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

And whereas by Sub-section (2) of the said Section the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, are required to certify as soon as may be after the beginning of September, 1934, and of each subsequent month falling before April, 1938, the cheese-milk price for that month;

Now therefore the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, hereby certify that the cheese-milk price for the month of September, 1935, is 3.93 pence per pound.

The method by which the cheese-milk price for the month as certified above has been computed is as follows:—

(1) The range of price quotations in respect of sales by wholesale of "New Zealand Finest White" cheese and of "Canadian Finest White" cheese, as published by the London Provision Exchange, Ltd., for each of the periods ended at 11.30 a.m. on each of the Fridays in the preceding month, has been examined.

(ii) The average of the mean prices for the two kinds of cheese has been ascertained for each of the said periods, exceptional quotations being disregarded. The average of the periodic averages so ascertained has then been calculated to two places of decimals and expressed in pence per pound.

(iii) From the figure thus obtained one penny three farthings has been subtracted and the balance gives the figure certified above.

4. To define the price which may be charged by the Council for gas within the added limits.

5. To empower the Council upon the lands hereinafter described to erect and maintain gas works with all necessary machinery and apparatus and thereon to make and store gas and work up and convert residual products (that is to say):—

A piece of land in the township of Over in the urban district of Winsford in the County of Chester containing 1 rood and 38 perches or thereabouts bounded on the north-east by the lands described in the Act of 1901 on the north-west as to part by Grayson Street and as to part by properties belonging to various owners on the south-west by land belonging to the executors of the Will of the late Mrs. F. M. Barton and on the south-east as to part by land belonging to the said executors of the Will of the late Mrs. F. M. Barton and as to part by lands belonging to the Salt Union Limited.

6. To empower the Council to purchase take and hold retain sell lease exchange or otherwise dispose of lands for the purpose of the gas undertaking of the Council.

8. To empower the Council to borrow money for the purposes of and in connection with the proposed Special Order and the gas undertaking of the Council and to make other financial provisions including provision for all receipts of the undertaking both on capital and revenue account to be carried to and form part of the general rate fund of the urban district of Winsford and for all payments and expenses

of the undertaking to be paid or provided out of the general rate fund.

9. To make provision as to the form and nature of the accounts of the undertaking to be kept by the Council, and as to the method by which and the purposes for which the surplus revenue of the undertaking shall be expended and applied by the Council, and amongst other things to permit of the formation of a reserve fund in connection with the undertaking for making good any deficiency charged to the general rate fund, in meeting any extraordinary claims or demand in respect of the undertaking or in paying the cost of renewing improving or extending any works forming part of the undertaking or otherwise for the benefit thereof.

10. To authorise the use by the Council for the purposes of any borrowing power exercisable by them of any moneys forming part of any fund accumulated for the redemption of debt or as a reserve or other similar fund.

11.
