AIR NAVIGATION ACT, 1920.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 20th September, 1935, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 23rd September, 1935, to Saturday, the 28th September, 1935, inclusive,

and will be payable at three months after

- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

EAST ANGLIAN JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE,

Poor Law Act, 1930: section 3.

(29th August, 1935.)

Whereas by the Norfolk Joint Casual Poor Committee Orders 1930 to 1934 the Minister of Health made provision for the combination of the administrative county of Norfolk and the county boroughs of Great Yarmouth and Norwich for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casual poor persons by a joint committee named the Norfolk Joint Casual Poor Committee;

And whereas by the Suffolk Joint Vagrancy Committee Order 1930 the Minister of Health made provision for the combination of the administrative counties of East Suffolk and West Suffolk and the county borough of Ipswich for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casual poor persons by a joint committee named the Suffolk Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas the councils of the counties of Cambridge, Huntingdon, Isle of Ely, Norfolk, East Suffolk and West Suffolk and of the county boroughs of Great Yarmouth, Ipswich, and Norwich have made application to the Minister of Health for an order combining the areas of the councils for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casual

poor persons:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes the following order:-

Short Title.

1. This order may be cited as the East Anglian Joint Vagrancy Committee Order 1935 and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1935.

Interpretation.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies to the interpretation of this order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In this order, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them-

"the combined areas" means the counties and county boroughs for the combination of which for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals provision is made by this order;

"the Joint Committee" means the East Anglian Joint Vagrancy Committee con-

stituted by this order; "council" means the council of a county or county borough included within the combined areas, and "councils" means the councils of all the counties and county boroughs so included;

"casual" means any destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief, and includes any person admitted into any establishment by a council or otherwise under the care of a council by way of poor relief who was, immediately before the date when he was so admitted or came under such care, a destitute wayfarer or wanderer apply-

ing for or receiving poor relief; "casual ward" means any ward, building or premises set apart or provided for the reception, relief or employment of casuals;

and "the Minister" means the Minister of Health.

Revocation of Previous Orders.

3. Subject to the provisions of this order, the Norfolk Joint Casual Poor Committee Orders, 1930 to 1934, and the Suffolk Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1930, are hereby revoked, but without prejudice to any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred under those orders.

Combination of Counties and County Boroughs and Constitution of Joint Committee.

4.—(1) The counties of Cambridge, Huntingdon, Isle of Ely, Norfolk, East Suffolk, and West Suffolk, and the county boroughs of Great Yarmouth, Ipswich, and Norwich shall be combined, for the purpose of the petter administration of the relief of casuals within the combined areas.

(2) For the execution of the purposes aforesaid a Joint Committee of the councils shall be constituted to be termed the East Anglian Joint

Vagrancy Committee.

(3) The Joint Committee shall be a body corporate having for the purposes of their constitution perpetual succession and common seal and shall have power to hold land for the purposes of their functions without licence in mortmain.

Composition of Joint Committee.

5. The Joint Committee shall consist of 27 members, each of whom shall be a member of the council by whom he is elected, and three members of the Joint Committee shall be elected by each of the councils.

Election of Members.

- 6.—(1) As soon as practicable in the year 1935, and at the first meeting of the council held after the last day of February in the year 1937 and every subsequent third year, each of the councils shall elect from their own body three members to represent them on the Joint
- (2) Every member of the Joint Committee shall come into office upon his election.
- (3) The clerk of each council by whom a member is elected shall forthwith after the election notify the name, address and description of the member-
 - (a) in the case of the first election to the clerk of the Norfolk County Council who shall convene the first meeting of the Joint Committee; and
 - (b) in the case of each subsequent election, to the clerk of the Joint Committee.
- (4) A council may nominate from their own body a person to act on behalf of a member of the Joint Committee elected by the council at any meeting of the Joint Committee at which that member shall be unable to be present.

Period of Office.

7.—(1) Except as in this article otherwise provided, a member of the Joint Committee shall hold office until the date on which his successor is elected.

(2) A member of the Joint Committee who ceases to be a member of the council by whom he was elected shall thereupon cease to be a

member of the Joint Committee:

Provided that a member of the Joint Committee shall not be deemed to have ceased to be a member of the council by whom he was elected if on or before the day on which he goes out of office he has been re-elected a member of the council.

(3) A member of the Joint Committee may resign his membership by sending to the clerk of the Joint Committee notice in writing of his desire to do so, and the clerk of the Joint Committee shall notify the clerk of the council in whose representation the vacancy arises.

(4) Any casual vacancy in the membership of the Joint Committee shall be filled by the election by the council in whose representation the vacancy arises of a new member, and the person so elected shall hold office during the remainder of the term of office of the person in whose place he is elected.

(5) The proceedings of the Joint Committee shall not be invalidated by reason of any vacancy in their number or by any defect in the election or qualification of any member of the Joint Committee.

Meetings and Proceedings.

8. The meetings and proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be governed by the rules set forth in the schedule to this order.

Power and Duties of Joint Committee.

- 9.—(1) It shall be the duty of the Joint Committee from time to time to take into consideration and furnish the Minister with their recom-mendations in regard to the following matters:-
 - (a) the number and situation of the casual wards which should be provided by a council;
 - (b) the number of casuals for whom accommodation should be provided at an existing casual ward and at a casual ward proposed to be established in the combined areas;
 - (c) the closing of a casual ward in the combined areas.
- (2) It shall also be the duty of the Joint Committee to take such steps, whether by public notice or otherwise, as shall be necessary with a view to the repression of begging and sleeping-out in the combined areas.

(3) The Joint Committee shall repay either in one sum or by instalments to a council the whole or any such part of such expenditure as may be agreed between the Joint Committee and the council incurred by the council in-

- (a) the maintenance of casual wards;
- (b) the reception and relief of casuals; (c) the transfer to an appropriate institu-
- tion of a casual; (d) the maintenance and care in such an institution of a casual so transferred;

(e) the burial of a casual;

- (f) the maintenance, care and education of a casual, being a child in respect of whom the council have exercised the powers vested in them under section 52 of the Poor Law Act, 1930;
- (g) the removal of a casual to his place of settlement;
- (h) the provision and supply of mid-day meals for casuals.
- (4) Subject to the statutory provisions and orders and regulations for the time being in operation, the Joint Committee may make rules in regard to the administration of casual wards within the combined areas, and in particular to the following matters, namely-
 - (i) times and methods of admission;

(ii) searching;

(iii) bathing, night clothing and bedding;

(iv) smoking;

- (v) treatment of sick, aged and infirm casuals;
- (vi) treatment of female and child casuals;

(vii) dietary;

(viii) discharge and detention; and

(ix) tasks;

and any rules so made shall be binding on the councils:

Provided that before making any such rules the Joint Committee shall notify the councils of their proposals relating thereto and shall give a reasonable opportunity to every council to make representation to the Joint Committee

regarding the proposals.

(5) The Joint Committee shall also have power with the approval of the Minister to contribute by way of an annual subscription towards the support and maintenance of any institution which appears to the Joint Committee to be calculated to render useful aid in the administration of the relief of casuals.

(6) Nothing in this order shall affect the powers and duties conferred or imposed on any of the councils in their capacity as a poor law authority, or shall deprive or relieve any of the councils of their powers, duties and obligations with reference to the relief of casuals, except so far as any such powers, duties or obligations are being exercised, undertaken or discharged by the Joint Committee in the execution of this order.

Expenses of Members.

- 10.—(1) The Joint Committee may defray expenditure, including travelling expenses, necessarily incurred by members of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof for the purpose of attending meetings of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof, and by officers of any of the councils attending meetings at the request of the Joint Committee, and by other persons so attending for the purpose of assisting the Joint Committee or any sub-committee in their deliberations.
- (2) The Joint Committee may confer with other Joint Committees for all or any of the purposes of this order, and may pay their reasonable share of the expenses of such conferences and of the attendance of their representatives thereat.

Application of Statutes and Orders.

- 11.—(1) The statutory provisions and the orders and regulations of the Minister and his predecessors for the time being applicable to a council by reason of their being a poor law authority shall, so far as they are consistent with the provisions of this order, apply to the Joint Committee as if the Joint Committee were a council of a county or county borough exercising poor law functions, and as if the combined areas were the area of such a council.
- (2) The accounts of the income and expenditure of the Joint Committee and of their subcommittees and officers shall be made up and audited in like manner and subject to the same provisions as the accounts of a county council, and the enactments relating to the audit of those accounts and to all matters incidental thereto or consequential thereon (including the penal provisions of those enactments) shall apply and have effect as if they were herein re-enacted and in terms made applicable:

Provided that prior to audit a copy of the abstract of accounts shall be sent by the Joint Committee to the councils.

(3) The said accounts and all minute books of the Joint Committee and their sub-committees shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection and transcription without payment by any member of any of the councils or by

any officer of any of the councils authorised by that council for that purpose.

- (4) A copy of the auditor's report and of the abstract of the accounts of the Joint Committee, when duly audited, shall be sent by the Joint Committee to the councils within one month after the completion of the audit of the accounts of the Joint Committee.
- (5) Nothing contained in this article shall be deemed to confer on the Joint Committee any power of raising money by loan for the purposes of this order.

Contracts and Expenditure.

12. All contracts and agreements relating to the purposes of this order involving an expenditure exceeding £100 shall be made under the authority of a resolution of the Joint Committee, and shall be signed and sealed on their behalf by the chairman or other member of the Joint Committee, and countersigned by the clerk of the Joint Committee, and no other expenditure shall be incurred unless authorized by resolution of the Joint Committee.

Expenses of Joint Committee.

13. There shall be a fund called the joint fund to which all moneys received by the Joint Committee shall be carried and out of which all expenses lawfully incurred by the Joint Committee in the execution of this order shall be defrayed.

Apportionment of Expenses.

- 14. For the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred by the Joint Committee under this order each of the councils shall make contributions to the joint fund in the manner following:—
 - (a) as to one-fourth of such expenses in the proportion which the aggregate rateable value of all the herditaments in their area as shown in the valuation lists on the 1st day of April immediately preceding the date of the order made on the council by the Joint Committee for contributions in respect of those expenses bears to the aggregate rateable value of all the hereditaments in the combined areas as then shown in the valuation lists; and
 - (b) as to three-fourths of such expenses, in the proportion which the number of nights' occupation by casuals of wards in their area during the year ended the 31st day of March preceding bears to the number of nights' occupation in that period by casuals of wards in the combined areas.

Contribution Orders.

- 15.—(1) The Joint Committee shall, as soon as may be after the 30th day of September 1935 and thereafter as soon as may be after the 31st day of March in each year, make an order on each council for the payment to the Joint Committee by the council either in one sum or by instalments on the date or dates mentioned in the order of such sums as may be required for the contributions of the council to the expenses of the Joint Committee, and the council shall make payments to the Joint Committee in accordance with the requirements of the order.
- (2) Any sum mentioned in any order for contributions shall be a debt due from the council to whom the order is addressed, and may be recovered accordingly: Provided that the Joint

Committee shall not institute proceedings for the recovery of the debt until after the expiration of a period of three months from the date of the order.

(3) The Joint Committee shall, as soon as practicable in the year 1935, furnish the councils with an estimate of expenditure to be incurred in the half-year ending the 31st day of March, 1936, and shall similarly furnish not later than during the first week in February of each year such an estimate in respect of the financial year commencing on the 1st day of April next following the said first week in February.

Settlement of Disputes.

16. In the event of any dispute arising in connection with the provisions of this order between any of the councils and the Joint Committee, or between any two or more councils, the dispute may, on the application of any one or more of the parties affected, be referred to the Minister, who may, if he thinks fit, decide the dispute. If the Minister decides the dispute, his decision shall be binding and conclusive on all the parties concerned.

Financial Adjustments on Expiration of Order.

17. Upon the expiration of this order the Joint Committee and the councils may make agreements for the purpose of adjusting any property, income, debts, liabilities and expenses of, and any financial relation between, the parties to the agreement, and section 151 of the Local Government Act, 1933, shall apply as if this order were an order made under Part VI of that Act.

SCHEDULE.

RULES AS TO MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

- 1. The Joint Committee shall hold at least one meeting in each quarter of every year, and shall from time to time make regulations with respect to the summoning, notice, place, management and adjournment of such meetings, and generally with respect to the transaction and management of their business under this order.
- 2. No business shall be transacted at any meeting unless at least seven members are present.
- 3. The Joint Committee shall at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be chairman for one year at all meetings at which he is present, and, if thought fit, another of their number to be vice-chairman for the same period.
- 4. If the chairman so appointed dies, resigns or becomes incapable of acting, another member shall be appointed to be chairman for the remainder of the period of office of the person so dying, resigning or becoming incapable of acting.
- 5. If the chairman is absent from any meeting at the time appointed for holding the same, the vice-chairman, if present, shall preside, and if the vice-chairman is also absent, the members present shall appoint one of their number to act as chairman at that meeting.
- 6. Every question at a meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting on that question.
- 7. In case of an equal division of votes the chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

8. Any minute made of proceedings at a meeting and copies of any orders made or resolutions passed at a meeting, if purporting to be signed by the chairman of the meeting at which such proceedings took place or such orders were made or such resolutions were passed, or by the chairman of the next ensuing meeting, shall be received as evidence in all legal proceedings; and until the contrary is proved, every meeting of which minutes of the proceedings have been so made shall be deemed to have been duly convened and held, and all the proceedings thereat to have been valid.
