Whereas parts of certain superintendent registrars' districts and of certain sub-districts which are situate partly within and partly without the Administrative Counties of Denbigh, Merioneth and Salop or one of them will on the 1st day of October, 1935, in consequence of and by virtue of the Denbighshire Registration Scheme, 1935, the Merioneth Registration Scheme, 1935, and the Shropshire Registration Scheme, 1935, made by the Councils of the Administrative Counties of Denbigh, Merioneth and Salop respectively and approved by the Minister of Health under Section 24 of the Local Government Act, 1929, become separate superintendent registrars' districts and sub-districts respectively situate wholly without the said Counties;

And whereas it is expedient that on their becoming separate superintendent registrars' districts and sub-districts as aforesaid provision should be made for the alteration of certain of the said separate superintendent registrars' districts and of certain other contiguous superintendent registrars' districts, by the union or re-arrangement of certain of them and of the sub-districts comprised therein, and by the formation of new sub-districts;

And whereas it is necessary to transfer the functions under the Registration Acts in relation to the parishes specified in the Schedule hereto;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 10 and 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 21 of the Births and

Deaths Registration Act, 1874, Section 21 (2) of the Local Government Act, 1929, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and sanction of the Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Denbigh, Merioneth, Salop, Caernarvon, Chester and Montgomery Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1935, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1935.

(2) In this Order the term "district" means a superintendent registrar's district, and the terms "existing district" and "existing sub-district" mean a district or sub-district which existed immediately before the 1st day of October, 1935.

2. The parishes specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto (being situate in the administrative counties specified in the second column thereof) shall be united with the districts specified in the third column thereof and shall be added to and form part of or be constituted the sub-districts specified in the fourth column thereof.

3. The districts and the sub-districts extended or constituted under Article 2 of this Order shall be designated by the names respectively appearing in the third and fourth columns of the Schedule hereto.

4. The superintendent registrar of any existing district with which another district is united by virtue of Article 2 of this Order shall be the superintendent registrar of the united district.

5. The registrar of any existing sub-district which is extended by this Order shall be the registrar of that sub-district as so extended.

6. The registrars of the existing Bettws y Coed, Malpas, Tremadoc and Ysphyty sub-districts shall respectively be the registrars of the Bettws y Coed, Malpas, Tremadoc and Ysphyty sub-districts constituted by this Order.

7. The functions under the Registration Acts in relation to any parish specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto are hereby transferred to the Council of the Administrative County specified in the second column of the said Schedule.

And whereas by a Warrant dated the 4th July, 1935, and signed by an Assistant Secretary of the Ministry of Transport the Minister of Transport under the powers conferred on him by the said Section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, authorised the abandonment of the aforesaid portion of the said Derby Canal by the Derby Canal Company.

And whereas notice of the granting of the said Warrant has been duly published as required by the Minister of Transport:

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, the Minister of Transport does hereby order that the Derby Canal Company shall from the date hereof be released from all liability to maintain the aforesaid portion of the said canal and from all obligations arising under the said Act of 31 George III cap. 102 or otherwise in respect thereof or of or consequent on the abandonment thereof.



Commencing at the point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway line from Kirkby Stephen to Hawes Junction passes over the main Garsdale Road north-east of Garsdale Head, thence in a generally southerly direction along the said railway via Hawes Junction, Dent Station, Ribbleshead Station, Horton Station, Stainforth and Settle to the point where it joins the Branch line from Clapham Station; thence in a north-westerly direction along the latter railway via Giggleswick Station to Clapham Station; thence in a westerly direction along the railway via High Bentham Station to the point near Lower Bentham where the Railway is carried over the road from Oxenforth Green to Lower Bentham; thence in a northerly direction along the road via Lower Bentham, Wards End, Four Lane Ends, Sunderland House, and Burton-in-Lonsdale, to the point where the road crosses the county boundary at Stainderber; thence following the county boundary in a north-easterly direction via Ireby Beck, Ireby Fell and Gragareth to the Stone marking the boundary of the counties of Lancaster, Westmorland and the West Riding of Yorkshire at Blea Gills; thence following the county boundary wall via Crag Hill to the point where it joins the wall enclosing the High Short Gill Allotment; thence along the east side of this wall and the wall enclosing the Short Gill Allotment to the point where it joins the Barbon-Dent road; thence in a south-westerly direction along the latter road to the point where it meets the wall separating the counties of Westmorland and the West Riding of Yorkshire; thence in a generally northerly direction along the said wall via Calf Top and Long Bank to the point where it meets the southern and eastern wall of the Green Edges Allotment; thence along the latter wall and the eastern wall of Holme Fell Allotments to the point where it is crossed by the London Midland and Scottish Railway line from Sedbergh to Kirkby Lonsdale; thence north along the said railway to Sedbergh Station; thence in a generally easterly direction along the road
