WHEREAS the Kenya and Uganda (Transport) Orders in Council, 1925 and 1927, made provision for the establishment of a High Commissioner for Transport for the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya and the Protectorate of Uganda and for matters relating thereto:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Orders, as hereinafter appears:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the British Settlements Act, 1887, the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Kenya and Uganda (Transport) Orders in Council, 1925 and 1927, are hereby amended in the following respects:—

(1) By the deletion of Article 1 (2) and the substitution of the following in the place thereof:—

“ 1.—(2) The High Commissioner for Transport (hereinafter referred to as “the High Commissioner”) shall be a Corporation Sole under that name with perpetual succession

and an official seal and may sue and be sued in the name of the Services whether in contract or in tort by the ordinary procedure of law.”

(2) By the deletion of Article 2 and the substitution of the following in the place thereof:—

“ 2.—(1) The High Commissioner shall consist of:

(a) the officer administering the Government of Kenya; and

(b) the officer administering the Government of Uganda, acting, save where specifically otherwise provided herein, jointly or in conference.

(2) At such times as the said Officers are not in conference and subject as hereinafter provided the officer administering the Government of Kenya shall have full executive power and authority over the Services but shall report to the Officer administering the Government of Uganda not later than the next Conference all acts done and decisions made by him when so acting.

Provided that the said Officers may by agreement decide:—

(a) What acts and decisions shall be deemed to be acts and decisions of a minor administrative nature involving no important principle and which need not be so reported, and

(b) the matters which shall not be dealt with by the Officer administering the Government of Kenya without prior reference to the Officer administering the Government of Uganda.
